Message from the Mayor:

This past month, as I walked the historic streets of Boston with my wife, Jana, exploring the Freedom Trail, I found myself humbled by the legacy of those who dared to challenge the most powerful empire in the world. Standing where revolutionaries once stood, I couldn't help but reflect on the price they paid for the freedoms we enjoy today.

I thought I would start with Benjamin Franklin. As the oldest signer, he played a crucial role in the creation and success of the Declaration of Independence, making him one of the most influential Founding Fathers in American history. Franklin brought wisdom, diplomacy, and credibility to the Continental Congress during a time of great uncertainty and tension between the American colonies and Great Britain.

Franklin was one of the five members appointed to the Committee of Five, the group responsible for drafting the Declaration of Independence in June 1776. However, Thomas Jefferson was the primary author. Franklin's input helped shape the Declaration into a clear and powerful statement of American values and rights.

In addition to helping craft the Declaration, Franklin played a crucial role in garnering support for independence both domestically and internationally. Being the first Ambassador to France, he gained vital support for the colonies. After the Declaration was signed, Franklin traveled to France as a diplomat, where his appeal and reputation helped secure a vital alliance.

Franklin's contributions to the Declaration of Independence and to the broader cause of American freedom were essential. His leadership, diplomatic skill, and commitment to liberty helped lay the foundation for the United States as an independent nation.

Just some thoughts as we have Veteran's Day and Thanksgiving both coming in November. We're extremely blessed and have much to be thankful for.

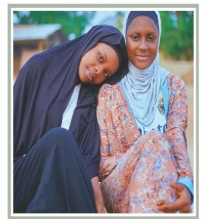
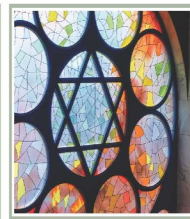

November 2025 newsletter

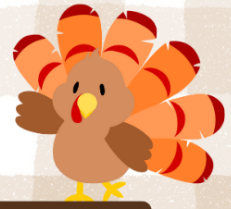
This is an exciting time of the year as we turn our attention to family get-togethers and to celebrate the season. North Park Police Department is pleased to host the "Shop with a Cop" event again this year. This year's event is scheduled for December 6, 2025. We want to help as many kids as possible and appreciate those who have donated so far to the cause. If you would like to donate, please scan the QR code, or call the police department at 435-753-7600.

Many of us will shop for gifts online as the holidays get closer. To that end, I would like to offer some suggestions to help you keep your packages and orders safe. A lockbox on your porch, or a lockbox at the post office is a terrific way to keep your packages secure and out of sight. Track your packages. Delays happen and if you have a tracking number, you can see if the package is still in transit. If your package shows delivered but you do not have it, check with your neighbors. Oftentimes packages are delivered to the wrong address, or a neighbor innocently takes it home with their mail. If you still cannot find the package, contact the seller, and file a claim. If the retailer will not assist you then consider filing a claim with the shipping company. These simple steps will help reduce your stress level.
