Message From Chief Goodrich

With the warmer weather, people are enjoying the outdoors in our wonderful community. North Park Police officers are seeing an increase in traffic and speed. Our officers are proactively looking for dangerous violations such as high speeds, driving under the influence, distracted driving, and motorists not properly restrained or buckled. At the end of February 2025, our officers had made 562 traffic stops. At the end of February 2026, North Park officers had conducted 761 traffic stops, or 199 more stops than last year this time. This equates to a **35.4 % increase** in traffic stops in the same two-month time frame. Help us keep motorists safe by slowing down, buckling up, and driving responsibly.
