City Code: 10.10.070
Fire Restriction Order

A. Effective annually on
June 15, at 12:01 a.m. to

10:00 a.m. December 31st, a fire restriction order is enforced to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Hyde Park City and their property, as well as protect forest, rangelands and watersheds from the destruction caused by fire, and when hazardous environmental conditions necessitate controlled use of any ignition source to prohibit the following acts.

B. Prohibited Acts. The following acts are prohibited on all private and City-owned lands in the "Area Description" set forth herein:

c. Discharging, or using any kind of fireworks or tracer ammunition or other pyrotechnic devices.

C. The location of the annual fire restriction is as follows:
a. All areas East of 400

Utility Billing Update



Hyde Park City shall issue **one (1) utility billing invoice per meter.**

The **property owner or landlord** of a multifamily unit with one meter shall be billed for ALL utilities associated with the meter.

The property owner or landlord of a multifamily unit with one meter shall be solely responsible for:

- * Payment of the full utility bill to the city; and collecting any utility charges from tenants.

Hyde Park City shall **no longer bill tenants directly** for utility bills.

This policy change eliminates the need for:

- * Splitting utility charges on rental accounts

- * Sending multiple bills for a single meter; and requiring, tracking, or refunding tenant utility deposits.

Effective August 1st.
