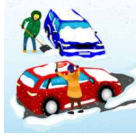
## Winter Parking

Plan ahead! November 1–March 31, vehicles must be off public streets between 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. to avoid a parking ticket.

This ordinance is in place to help Public Works clear roads during winter storms, whether or not snow is on the ground.

Please also pull garbage cans in promptly after collection so they don't get buried or become an obstacle during snow removal.

## Storm Water & Your Yard

*Leave the Gutters Clear: Keep Leaves Out of the Drain This Autumn!*

- \* **Never rake or blow waste into the street or storm drains.** They clog the system and cause severe nutrient pollution.
- \* **Use your curbside green bin.** If you have one, use it for weekly collection from April 1st through October 31st. A green bin is \$11.60 a month. (In the winter months use as a secondary garbage bin)
- \* **Inspecting private drainage systems.** We encourage homeowners to clear out their gutters, downspouts, and private drainage ditches before winter storms arrive. If you notice clogged drains, please report them on our city website.
- \* **Household hazardous waste disposal.** Old paints, automotive fluids, and chemicals should **NOT** be poured down outdoor drains. Dispose of old products at the Logan City Landfill. They are open 8am–5pm, Mon–Sat.



## Flip the Strip: Growing a more water-wise city

Hyde Park City is making a few changes around the City Office and we think the results are worth celebrating!

On Saturday, September 19, volunteers gathered at the City Office to help us “**Flip the Strip**” transforming the parking strip into a beautiful, water-wise landscape. The existing grass was removed ahead of the project, and our wonderful volunteers spent Saturday morning planting a variety of water-wise plants and flowers that will help conserve water (over 100,000 gal water per year!) while adding beauty to our community.



A drip irrigation system is now being added around the new plants to help use water more efficiently. While the project is still getting its finishing touches, we're already excited to see how it will grow and change throughout the seasons.

This project is a great example of what can happen when our community works together. Water conservation is something we can all contribute to, and small changes in our own yards and landscapes can make a meaningful difference across the Valley.

### TOPIC: Outdoor Storage

Outdoor storage is not allowed of materials that are not customarily stored outdoors in residential neighborhoods, such as, but not limited to, construction materials, tires, and household appliances. The materials storage includes, whether or not sheltered or covered with tarps, or within a carport or other partially enclosed structure, are visible from any public street, sidewalk, alley or from the ground level of abutting properties. The storage of materials within a garage or other fully enclosed structure are not considered outdoor storage.
