

# What is the Internet?

## Lesson Overview

Students will investigate how the internet works by discovering which devices in their lives are connected. They will create a visual representation of a network to understand the benefits and challenges of being part of a large, global network.

## Learning Outcomes

By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

- Identify digital devices at home and school.
- Describe the internet as a global network that connects billions of people.

## Lesson Slides

### Introduce:

- Ask: What is the internet?
- Show: What does the Internet Do?
- Ask: What do you like to do online?
- Ask: What devices do you have that connect to the internet?
- Progress through slides 7-11, showing networks growing from a small number of devices to thousands. Pause regularly to prompt discussion (discussion questions on slides).

### Explore:

#### Children...

- Draw pictures of devices they have at home or school that connect to the internet.
- Cut them out and place them on a large piece of paper.
- Draw lines to show how they are all connected.



#### Educator (optional)...

- Take photos of the illustrations, upload them to Canva, use background remover, scatter them on a slide, save as a png.
- Upload the image and duplicate it so there are now 4x as many devices.
- Repeat the process like you see in the slide deck.

### Reflect:

- Ask: How many devices are connected to your network?
- Remind them: The internet is a global network. It connects billions of devices!
- Ask: What's good about being connected to billions of people? What's not so good about being connected to billions of people?
- How can we make the internet a better place for everyone?
