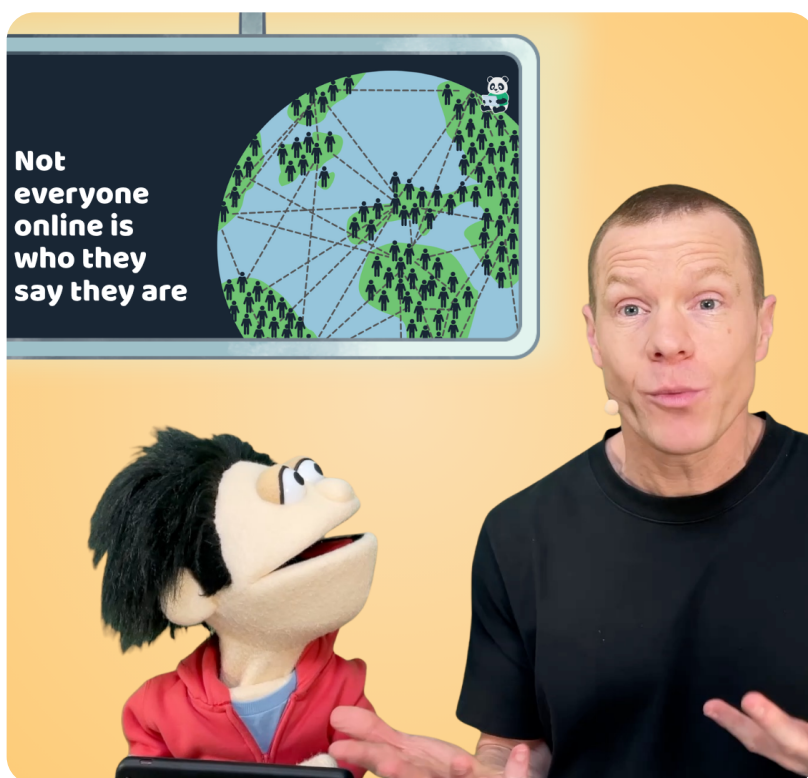


Here's what we covered:

- There are some types of information we need to keep private online, such as our name, address, school, passwords, and photos.



- If someone online asks us for personal information, we need to tell a trusted adult, who can help us block and report them.
- We need to keep our personal information private because the internet can be accessed by everyone, and not everyone is a trusted person.



Some conversation starters:

- What should you do if someone in a game or app asks us for personal information, such as your name, address, or photos?
- If you were playing an online game with a player called "pinktiger12", how old do you think this person could be? Are they a boy? Girl? Man? Woman? Safe? Unsafe?
