

Here's what we covered:

- Settings help keep us safe. Instead of just accepting the default settings, you can go in and change them yourself so you are in control.
- 'Red flags' are clues that an online interaction may be unsafe. Red flags include asking to keep secrets, asking to send photos or private information, offering to buy gifts, messaging excessively, sending links, giving excessive compliments, or asking to meet offline.
- If we experience an unsafe interaction we can block and report the account and tell a trusted adult.



Some conversation starters:

- Why is it important to check your settings when you create an account?
- Check the settings together on your child's favourite game/app.
- What are some red flags you or a friend might notice when you're interacting online?
- What could you do if you notice any red flags?
