



WHERE WE WORK

Indonesia is the fourth most populous country in the world and includes more than 17,000 islands. It is also one of the largest child sex tourism destinations in the world. We are one of only a few anti-trafficking organizations operating within the country.



East Java —

Our child and family sponsorship programs support vulnerable children and families in the Marigold and Rose communities in East Java, where the risk of trafficking is high.

North Sulawesi

Our work began in North Sulawesi in 2010 with 24/7 residential survivor care. Today, the region is home to Sarah's House, our flagship survivor care home, and Sarah's House 2, a transitional home supporting girls as they prepare to reintegrate into society independently. Our work has since expanded to include transit monitoring at three key ferry ports and trafficking prevention through community development work in Palm Village.



Bali

Bali is an international child sex tourism destination. We partner with other organizations in Bali to support law enforcement, caregivers, and partnered rescues.

TOGETHER, OUR COMPASSION IS CREATING SOLUTIONS

Prevention

Through community development and transit monitoring, we stop trafficking before it can start.

IN 2024, WE SERVED...

over 100 children in three communities—Marigold, Rose, and the newly established Palm Village. Our community centers remain vibrant with tutoring, educational classes for kids, teen and parent programs, and specialized skill development in music, English, Taekwondo, and more. This year, we introduced "Play with a Purpose," a therapeutic play program helping up to 30 children process emotions safely through play. Palm Village now has a weekly class with 20 active children participating.

Our entrepreneurship program is expanding, with teens and young adults advancing in their careers—one securing a full-time job, another enrolling in college for computer engineering, and two scholarship recipients graduating high school. One teen has even joined as part-time staff, helping train new members. We've also expanded production into the Rose community. Meanwhile, our Transit Monitoring team continues its work in the ports, and we've secured full authority to begin airport operations in 2025!





RAFAEL'S STORY

Rafael has been part of our community center since childhood, joining teen classes and activities alongside his two younger sisters. Through our Entrepreneurship Program, he learned valuable skills like budgeting, time management, and communication. His dream of studying computer programming came true when he was accepted into college! Now, he gives back by teaching younger kids computer skills. In 2024, when his sibling faced a health crisis, he supported his family with his time and his earnings from journal–making. Rafael has become a mentor and role model, demonstrating resilience in pursuing his dreams and helping others. We are incredibly proud of him and cheering him on!

new experiences, and incredible progress for Compassion First's Survivor Care program. With two fully operating shelters in North Sulawesi and West Java, we successfully served 20 girls through residential care and five girls through community-based care, implementing Individual Care Plans (ICP) for each girl. Residents have improved in setting goals, embracing trauma counseling, communicating with their families, resolving conflicts with their peers, and growing their self-confidence. Education remains a priority, with three girls graduating high school—two moving on to college—and others advancing in their studies. Vocational training has also expanded, offering courses in barista skills, early education, cosmetology, cooking, horticulture, maritime education, and more. We also supported four CF alumni to pursue university studies in Post-Graduate Theological Studies, Bible College, Medical School, and Accounting. We are so proud of the residents in CF Survivor Care and all their progress this year, along with our amazing staff that continues this work day after day with love, compassion, and dedication, helping each young woman recognize her worth and potential.



EVELYN'S STORY

Evelyn, a bright and ambitious senior in high school, was on track to graduate with top honors despite challenges at home. However, after meeting a "nice man" online, her world suddenly turned upside down after she was trafficked. In the midst of a very traumatic situation, she managed to coordinate and secure her own rescue. With the support of a friend at school, she contacted the local Women's Empowerment office, reported her case, and was referred to CF. Though staying in a residential home for a year or two wasn't part of her original plan, she knew it was the safest option and allowed her to continue her education while preparing for college. For nine months, she pushed through emotional rollercoasters, challenging counseling sessions, testimonies with police, and fear of rejection. Through it all, she displayed incredible resilience, learned new skills, and excelled in her studies. Then, to her delight, she earned a scholarship to a top ten prestigious university. Today, she continues to heal, pursue her dreams, and inspire others with the determination and character she courageously exhibits.

THE INDONESIAN CENTRAL GOVERNMENT HAS CONTINUED TO REACH OUT...

to Compassion First for official training of local, provincial, and national staff on existing child protection laws, trafficking laws, victim identification, victim sensitivity, and best practices on shelter operations and care for survivors. These training events are provided for and attended by all departments involved with government organized regional anti-trafficking task forces and are fully operated by CF leadership and professionals.

SWAKELOLAS

The government of Indonesia has a program called "Swakelola" - a collaboration between the Indonesia government and NGOs to improve the quality of public services. The Ministry of Women's Empowerment and Child Protection chose CF from among many NGOs to collaborate with them on Swakelola work in 2024, including two anti-trafficking training events - one in East Java and another in Bali.

While most Swakelola events result in an invitation for CF to set up specific operations in a region, the East Java Swakelola event was met by overwhelming support with multi-lateral requests for CF to expand our work in that region. There were 38 in attendance including officers, professionals, and government employees from the following departments: regional and city police, Women's Empowerment and Child Protection, Dept. of Social Affairs, Dept. of Labor, Regional Development Planning Agency, Public Health Office, Indonesian Migrant Workers Protection Agency, and other NGOs. We additionally hosted pastor gatherings in conjunction with the Swakelola, building out further partnered support for our work.

FILMED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH LAMPSTAND PRODUCTIONS, FALL 2024

In October 2024, Compassion First Director Traci Espeseth partnered with our friends at Lampstand Productions to visit several of our locations across Indonesia. Together, they filmed six short videos to help tell the story of our work through the voices of those closest to it.




