# Letter FROM THE PRESIDENT

## LEGAL ADVOCACY UPDATE

Legal advocacy is a core part of how we care for survivors. When girls in our care are called to testify against their traffickers, we not only fund their legal team but also walk closely with them in preparation. Throughout the entire process, we provide security and protection to ensure their safety.

We have successfully advocated for closed courts, which means a girl does not have to face her trafficker in the same room. Our team helps her anticipate what she may experience, gently working through the triggers that can surface in both mind and body. Even with minimal documentation, our clinical staff lead mock trials to build confidence, encouraging each girl to be steady and brave as she gives her testimony.

**Right now, four girls in our care are preparing to testify.** Each case is complex and depends on the cooperation of local police. We are deeply grateful for the strong relationships we hold with both police and government officials.

**Please join us in praying** for these four girls as they take this courageous step, and for the staff who will faithfully walk beside them.

## SARAH'S HOUSE RESIDENT REINTEGRATES HOME



We are celebrating a beautiful milestone as one of the young women at Sarah's House has completed her residential program and is returning home to her family. The journey was not easy, but she persevered, and we could not be more proud!

When home is safe, returning is a powerful step in a survivor's healing process. It restores a sense of belonging in her family and community and gives her the chance to carry new strength and support into this next season of life.

This reintegration also opens space in our shelter to welcome the next girl who needs the safety and care that Sarah's House provides.

## 20 YEAR REFLECTION ON HURRICANE KATRINA & CF'S BEGINNING



You may know, or maybe this is news, that Compassion First's story began as a disaster relief response in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. You may have even been part of it yourself. As we mark twenty years since that storm, Mike reflects on our beginnings...

It is hard to believe two decades have passed since Katrina devastated the Southern seaboard. Just last week marked the anniversary. Our first deployment to Mississippi did not come until two weeks after the storm had passed, already late by most measures.



By then, hundreds of groups had rushed to respond with good intentions. American closets were emptied of clothes not worn in years, only to end up in big-box parking lots where they soon became landfills...

# WHAT WE DO

## *Prevention*

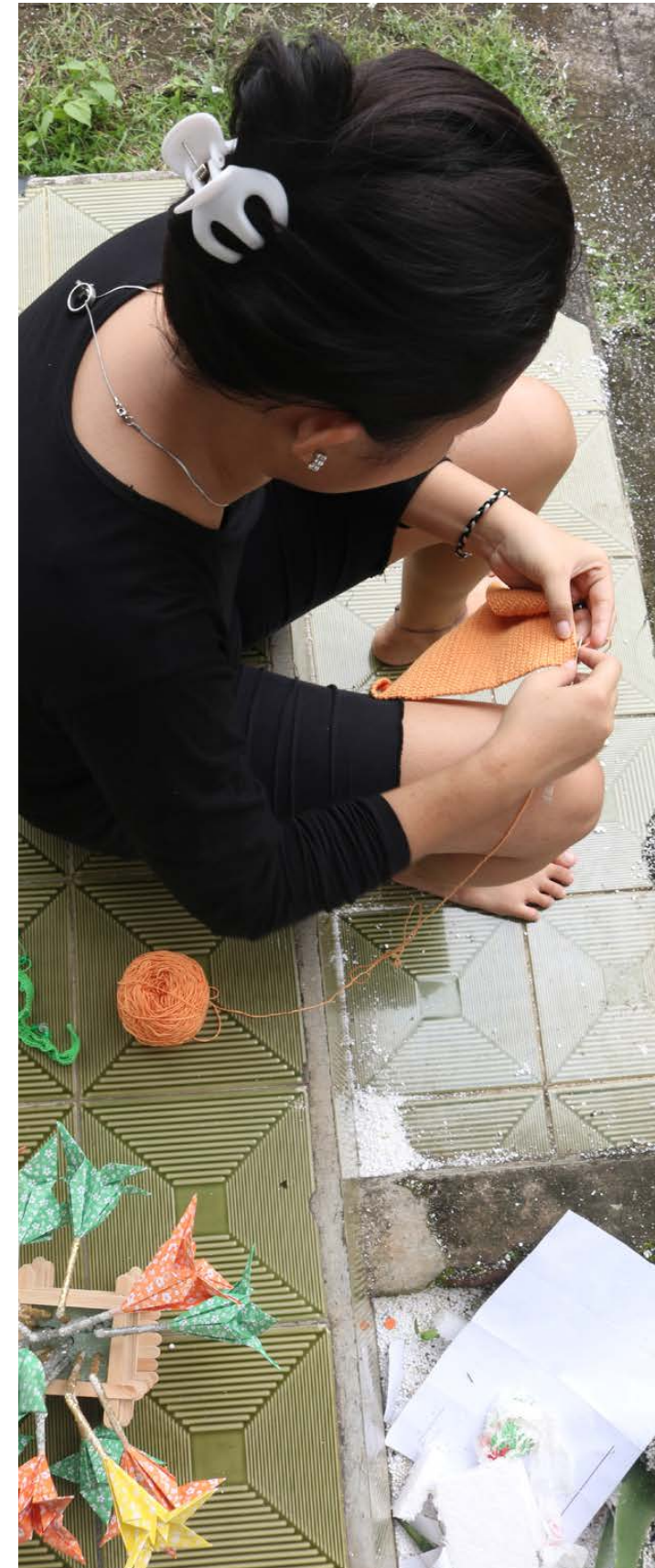
We prevent trafficking by supporting children and families who are extremely vulnerable to exploitation in some of Indonesia's poorest communities. Our holistic approach to community development includes several drop-in centers, educational scholarships, entrepreneurial opportunities, and community events.

## *Survivor Care*

We provide personalized, trauma-informed care for girls who have been rescued from trafficking in secure 24-7 residential homes and through community-based care for those who have safe homes to return to.

## *Government Collaboration*

We provide support and resources to help local law enforcement carry out rescues and partner with government agencies by providing training and resources. Additionally, Compassion First works alongside port authorities to conduct transit monitoring, intercepting potential victims before they are trafficked.



# WHERE WE WORK

Indonesia is the fourth most populous country in the world and includes more than 17,000 islands. It is also one of the largest child sex tourism destinations in the world. We are one of only a few anti-trafficking organizations operating within the country.

## North Sulawesi

Our work began in North Sulawesi in 2010 with 24/7 residential survivor care. Today, the region is home to Sarah's House, our flagship survivor care home, and Sarah's House 2, a transitional home supporting girls as they prepare to reintegrate into society independently. Our work has since expanded to include transit monitoring at three key ferry ports and one airport, plus trafficking prevention through community development work in Palm Village.

## West Java

West Java is home to the mega-city and capital of Indonesia, Jakarta. We are building government relationships to facilitate the sustainable reduction of trafficking in this region. Our second residential home for survivors, Promise House, is also in West Java.

## East Java

Our child and family sponsorship programs support vulnerable children and families in the Marigold and Rose communities in East Java, where the risk of trafficking is high. We are also serving survivors in this region through community-based care.

## Bali

Bali is an international child sex tourism destination. We partner with other organizations in Bali to support law enforcement, caregivers, and partnered rescues.

# Prevention

## IN 2025, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ROUTINELY SERVED...

over 100 children in three communities. Palm Village celebrated its second year, with kids eager to gather for English classes, games, and homework help. The Marigold and Rose Communities saw the development of a futsal (soccer) and sports ministry this year. The kids love it, and often invite their friends to come and join!

Throughout the year, we saw the community members share their talents and skills with one another. From community-led cooking classes to our college students sharing computer skills, journal-making, and bouquet-making, many had the opportunity to contribute. Our entrepreneur program saw more teens return to participate in journal making. We also had opportunities to join boutiques, conferences, and local events to sell journals

The year was also filled with toddler and kid classes, the annual play festival, traditional dances and exercise, tutoring, and our annual community-wide Thanksgiving celebration that showcased all these community talents and inspired us all!



## RATNA'S COURAGE

Two years ago, Ratna was diagnosed with bone and pulmonary tuberculosis, an illness that left her unable to move from the neck down. After months of intensive treatment, surgery, and rehabilitation, she courageously began learning to move again.

Throughout the process, the biggest battle she had to face was fear: Fear of trying to sit up, standing, and learning how to walk again after everything her body had been through. But she also saw how people celebrated every point of progress she made, that every tiny step mattered. She kept fighting because she knew she wasn't alone. Her mom never left her side, always caring for her with so much love.

Ratna lost nearly a year of school, but in her words, "God is good". Within just three months, she managed to catch up on everything she had missed with the support of her teachers and friends.

Before all of this, Ratna thought of herself as the quiet girl who would probably be forgotten. Now she knows she has so many people who care and want to see her thrive. Today, Ratna is thriving. She loves school, and soon will join her school team in a city-level choir competition.

in our residential care. Promise House opened in East Java, creating space to serve more residents and providing an environment where healing and personal growth can continue. In North Sulawesi, Sarah's House 2\* reopened, allowing girls to reintegrate into their communities while continuing their education under CF's umbrella of care. This reopening also created additional space in Sarah's House, enabling newly rescued girls to receive timely care and support.

We continued to strengthen pathways toward independence through expanded vocational training opportunities. Girls in residential care now have access to training in barista skills, makeup and nail artistry, cooking, hair styling, and more. These programs equip them with practical skills and increase their opportunities to secure stable employment as they reintegrate into their families and communities.

Our staff across all three locations deepened their engagement with families through coaching and relationship-building. This approach helps families better utilize resources within their own communities and prepares them to receive their daughters with greater understanding and support upon reintegration.

*\*Sarah's House 2 is a transitional home providing a semi-independent living space for girls who are close to completing the full aftercare program. This home also opens up space in Sarah's House sooner, allowing us to serve more girls.*



## MELODY'S RESILIENCE

When Melody joined the CF program, she was two years behind in school and struggled to focus on her studies. With tremendous support from our teachers and staff and a lot of hard work, she was able to catch up and pass the National Final Exam for Elementary School.

Transitioning to junior high school brought new challenges, including being the oldest student in her class and struggling to keep up with coursework. Many times, she felt the desire to give up. Despite these moments of discouragement, Melody persevered through consistent encouragement from staff and family, ultimately completing junior high school.

As her confidence grew, Melody learned to recognize her strengths and stand strong on her own. She went on to vocational high school, where she excelled—finishing first in her class and representing her school in inter-school activities. She also completed a makeup artist course with excellent grades and began building her skills through practicing on the girls and staff at Sarah's House.

Now reintegrated back home with her family, Melody is focused on two things: continuing her studies in vocational high school and starting her makeup business on weekends and school holidays. She hopes to save her earnings to help her parents start a home-based food business. Melody has become a cheerful, strong young woman whose journey reflects resilience and growth.

## Government Collaboration

with government partners continued to strengthen and bear meaningful fruit. We successfully established a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ministry of Women Empowerment and Child Protection, marking a significant milestone in our partnership. At both national and local levels, we further deepened our relationships with government institutions and law enforcement—especially the newly established Directorate of Crimes Against Women and Children and Human Trafficking, now active in 11 provinces.

Team members across various regions were invited to speak and provide training at numerous government-hosted events, reflecting growing trust in our expertise and contributions. Our role as Secretary of the National Network of Anti-Human Trafficking has further elevated our engagement, enabling closer coordination and more direct communication with key stakeholders.

We remain committed to working hand in hand with government partners to advance prevention and protection for vulnerable communities.



### TRANSIT MONITORING AT THE AIRPORT

Our perseverance in building partnerships with the government required time, patience, and many meetings, but in the end, it resulted in real and measurable impact. One clear example is our transit monitoring work at an international airport, which required close coordination and formal approval from airport authorities before it could begin. The process was not immediate, but once permission was granted, the impact was significant. Within just a few months, we were able to intercept more than 40 potential victims.

This collaboration has also strengthened prevention efforts by encouraging more active involvement from law enforcement and the wider community. For us, working hand in hand with the government is essential to building effective protection systems and stopping trafficking in our country.

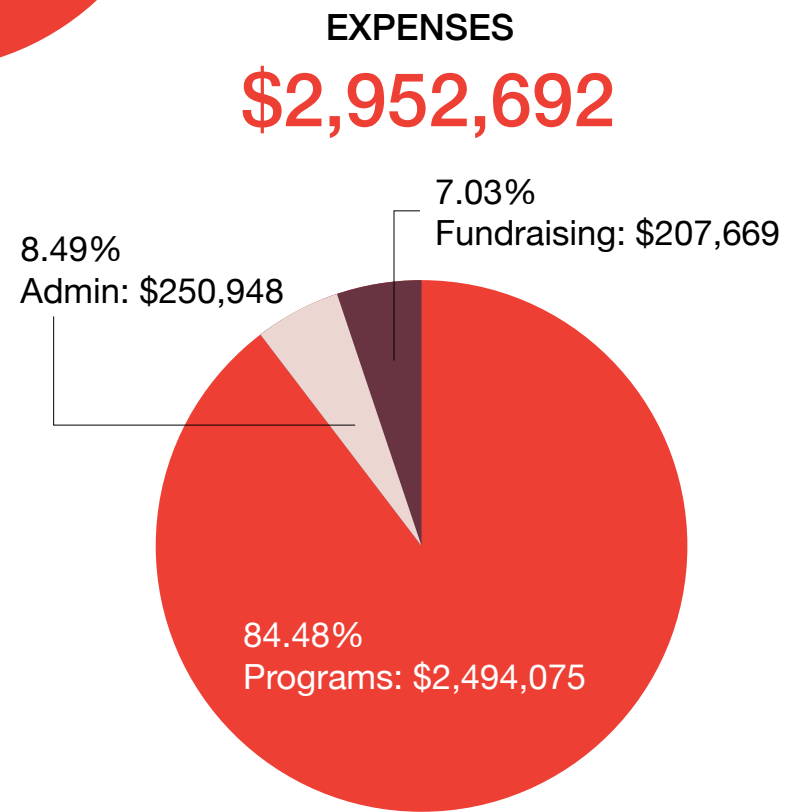
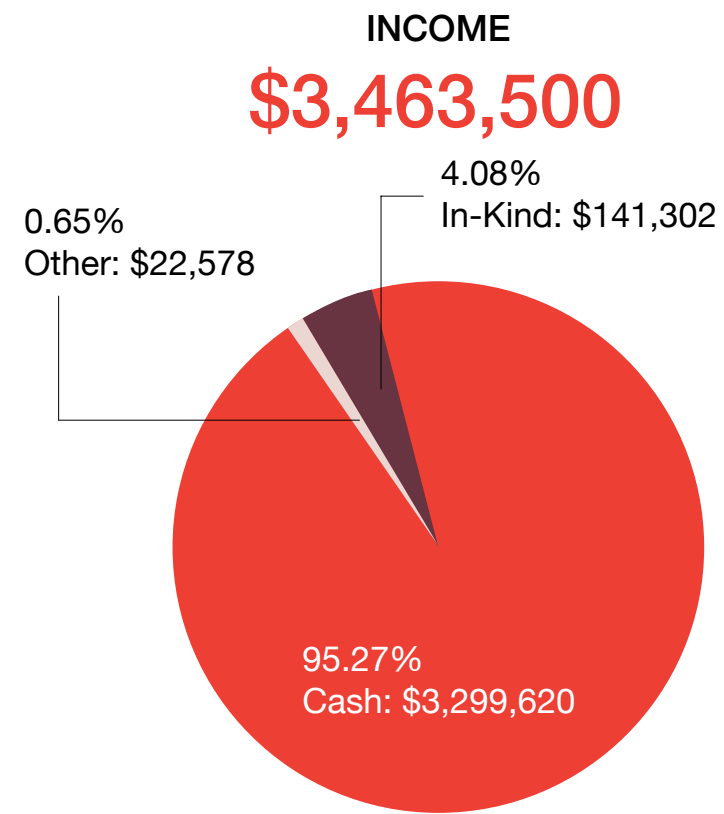
2025 PASTORS RETREAT

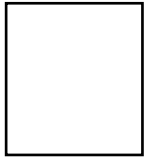
