Tim Crain Presents**Vietnam: America's Longest War, 1954–75
A 7-Part Series**

Wednesdays | 6:30 p.m. | O'Donnell Room

April 1: The United States and the Creation of South Vietnam, 1955–1960

Explores how the U.S. replaced France in backing South Vietnam under Ngo Dinh Diem, canceled nationwide elections, and built an anti-communist state. Addresses internal unrest, the early Viet Cong insurgency, and the influence of Cold War ideology on U.S. policy.

April 8: Escalation Under Kennedy and Johnson, 1961–1965

Traces expanding U.S. involvement, the 1963 coup against Diem, the Gulf of Tonkin incident, and Congress's authorization of force. This examines President Lyndon B. Johnson's launch of Operation Rolling Thunder and the deployment of combat troops in 1965.

April 15: Fighting the War, 1965–1968

Focuses on peak U.S. military engagement, attrition strategy, search-and-destroy missions, air power, chemical defoliants, and rising human and financial costs. Concludes with the Tet Offensive and its major psychological and political impact in the United States.

April 22: The War at Home and Vietnamization, 1968–1973

Examines the U.S. anti-war movement, draft resistance, media coverage, My Lai, and Kent State. Analyzes President Richard Nixon's Vietnamization policy, expansion of the war into Cambodia and Laos, secret negotiations, and the 1973 Paris Peace Accords.

April 29: The Legacy of the Vietnam War, 1973–1975 and Beyond

Assesses the collapse of South Vietnam and the fall of Saigon in 1975, humanitarian consequences, and re-education camps. Concludes with the war's lasting impact on Vietnam, the United States, Cold War politics, military policy, and the debate over the "Vietnam Syndrome."

"The Lottery" by Shirley Jackson

"The Lottery" by Shirley Jackson is a short story about a small town that holds an annual ritual called the lottery. At first, the event seems like a normal community gathering, with families chatting and children playing. However, as the lottery proceeds, it becomes clear that the tradition has a dark purpose. Each family draws a slip of paper from a black box. The family that draws the marked paper must draw again to select one individual. In the end, Tessie Hutchinson is chosen, and the townspeople—including her own family—stone her to death as part of the tradition. The story reveals how people can blindly follow traditions without questioning their morality. "The Lottery" explores themes of conformity, tradition, and the dangers of group think, showing how ordinary people can participate in cruelty simply because "it has always been done that way."
