CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL FOR THE PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION OF A WAREHOUSE PLANT

In addition to implementing the mitigation measures and the Environmental Management Plan outlined in the Project Brief, this Certificate of Environmental Impact Assessment approval is granted on condition that the developer - M/S Export Trading Company (U) Ltd shall:
