



**Methodology Note:**

Latino survey conducted 3/10 - 3/20 via phones and text-to-web with 2000 registered voters who identify as Hispanic or Latino nationally. The sample was weighted to match the composition of registered voters modeled as Latino by state, gender, age, education, vote history, voter registration date, VCH score, and 2024 vote recall. The sample was also weighted by age, education, 2024 vote recall by gender, congressional district, and geography, to match the composition of registered voters modeled as Latino in each state with a sample size over 200 and in the Mid-Atlantic region (DE, MD, PA, NJ, and NY) and the Southwest region (AZ, CO, NM, and NV). Language of interview, education and other variables were monitored during the fielding. The survey was conducted in English and Spanish, according to the respondent's preference. MoE is ~2.0 % for the full Latino sample.

Non-Latino survey conducted 3/10 - 3/15 via phones and text-to-web with 400 registered voters who do not identify as Hispanic or Latino nationally. The sample was weighted by state, gender, age, education, self-identified race, and 2024 vote recall. Education and other variables were monitored during the fielding. 200 respondents were in each split sample. MoE is ~4.9 % for the full Non-Latino sample.
