Letter from the CEO



Not only does this create sustainability in countries where unemployment rates are through the roof, but it allows for a long-lasting impact, focusing on leadership development from within.

Haiti Updates

Hospital Cap-Haïtien

In August of 2025, we were honored to host the grand opening of our brand new hospital, located just outside the second largest city in Haiti, Cap-Haïtien. The funding came in within a 2-year period (about \$350,000 to construct the entire hospital), and the work was completed from start to finish in under a year.

Today, this hospital allows us to minister to and care for 50-60 people every single day. Before, we were only open on weekdays, seeing about 20-30 patients; now we are open 24/7. **Our staff continues to grow, and our services continue to expand.** We are humbled that, despite the ongoing challenges in Haiti, the Lord is allowing this ministry to thrive.



Haiti Updates

Remote Clinic

Bois de Lance

Bois de Lance is a village far up into the mountains and very difficult to get to. There you'll find six villages comprising about 1,000 people per village, with no healthcare facilities for miles. The nearest clinic would be a three-hour trek down the mountain to the next largest city of Ranquitte.

Three Strands is constructing a clinic with the hopes of being fully operational by the end of 2026.



Central African Republic Updates

Hospital Bangui

Bangui is our stomping grounds, where Three Strands first began. Although our beloved founder and brother in Christ, Dr. Paul, went to be with Jesus early in 2025, we aspire to honor his obedience to the Lord and his strong passion and love for his people.

We have a newly formed leadership team in Bangui, designed to create ownership, responsibility, and the opportunity for growth within every department of our organization.





In 2026, we are launching a new program called "Medi Moto", with our Bangui hospital as the launch pad.

We will be sending 2-3 motorcycle units, staffed with a medical professional, supplies, and equipment to bring basic healthcare to the least reached villages. While our surgical, maternity, pediatric, ophthalmology, primary care, and malnutrition programs will continue as normal, we feel that God is calling us further. We pray for God's blessing over this endeavor and the thousands of people we'll be able to touch with the Love of Christ!

Seminary Location

Belagoro

"Belagoro", which means "good heart", was born last year out of a strong desire to come alongside our brothers and sisters in Christ at the Grace Brethren Seminary located an hour or so outside of the city limits. There are about 100 seminary students enrolled, being equipped to plant churches with their families once they graduate. Their families all live on the seminary compound, and there was no access to healthcare. These students and their families are mostly studying on scholarships and have little to no source of income, therefore making it difficult to pay for basic healthcare. We felt burdened by this and felt compelled to ignite a partnership. The campus had a vacant building and we were blessed with the ability to provide everything else. **Now there is a registered nurse stationed every day at this clinic, providing healthcare to all the students and their families - just over 300 people!**



Central African Republic Updates

Remote Clinic Cite Dongue

Cite Dongue is a rapidly expanding area about 26km outside of the capital. The Central African government is looking to boost the economy in this region bringing, business to the region as it serves as an entry point for all the imports coming in on semis from the port in Cameroon. This is why we chose to begin construction of a new clinic in this region, as thousands of people are moving here, again with no healthcare facilities close by.

The bulk of the construction is complete, but work has been paused as we continue to raise funds to bring this project to completion. Please pray with us for God's provision and wisdom!



Central African Republic Updates

Remote Clinic Gomoko

Gomoko is our longest-standing remote clinic and has been in operation since 2013. We have strong ties with the four village chiefs and are located directly across from a Grace Church. Pastor Calvin is respected and very involved in the community. In fact, his wife, Valerie, is on staff with Three Strands and runs our malnutrition program in Gomoko. The majority of the patients we see are part of the Fulani tribe. **We thank the Lord for this incredible opportunity to be a light to a people group that is less than 1% evangelized.** Continue praying for fruit, and that the gospel would go forth.

2025 Milestones

1. Job Creation

In 2025, we were able to add **9 new staff** overseas.

2. Data Collection

Training our teams in data collection has resulted in a **clearer picture of what the greatest needs are** in treatments.

3. Leadership Development

Three Strands, in its infancy, functioned like a small “mom and pop” ministry. As our team has grown, **we’ve been able to delegate key leadership roles to staff members** who show qualities of good leadership.

4. Supply Chain Improvement

In 2025, we shipped more supplies/materials than we ever have before. This was possible because of an incredible volunteer team stateside, and stronger communications and data collection from our teams in Haiti and CAR!

5. Expansion

Despite political tensions, gang violence, constant hindrance in travel plans, and many more reasons that make working in Haiti and CAR difficult... **The Lord has still allowed us to grow and expand** our staffing, locations, impact, and reach. Praise the Lord!
