Local Farms and Farmstands!

Berniche Family Farm in Chesterfield has acres of high-bush blueberries. If you want to get outdoors and get the freshest berries possible, go up and pick your own. Picking begins in mid-July, with regular hours Thursday – Sunday 8-5. Check Facebook for updates. (WM)

Makana Farm has a farm stand with their own produce right on Route 9 just above Pat's in Williamsburg.

The Ashfield Farmers Market is open every Saturday through October from 9AM to 1PM on the Town Common.

Oliver's Farm Stand on Main Street in Goshen has local produce year round!

Four Corners farm operates a farm stand in the red barn at 27 Old North Road, Worthington (WM)

E&J Scott Orchards has three farm stands: seasonal opening at 65 Upper St, Buckland and 66 Bissell Rd, Goshen. The stand at 853 Conway Rd, Ashfield is open year round. (WM)

Hiking

Williamsburg Woodland Trails has a list of ten trails on its website, williamsburgwoodlandtrails.org. This site also has links to trail info for Ashfield, Conway, and Goshen.

The Hilltown Land Trust has a collection of trail descriptions and maps online at hilltownlandtrust.org

For a greater distance, hike along the New England trail from Mt. Holyoke north to the NH border or from Mt. Tom south to Long Island Sound. Info at newenglandtrail.org

Driving Up High

Three local mountains have roads to the top:

Mt. Greylock (access in Lanesborough – north of Pittsfield) has stunning 360-degree views from the summit monument.

Mt. Sugarloaf reservation in South Deerfield will give you a fantastic view of our valley.

In Skinner State Park, you can look up and down the Pioneer Valley from the top of Mt. Holyoke. It's a way for people of all abilities to experience the awe of nature and our scenic area!

Lets Go Swimming

You can dip and dunk in pools as the stream cascades down along the trail at Chapel Brook in Ashfield. It's on the Ashfield-Williamsburg Road. Visit thetrustees.org for detail on visiting.

The DAR State Forest has a great beach on Upper Highland Lake in Goshen. A defined swimming area with sandy beach is surrounded by picnic tables. Mass. residents pay \$8 per car for parking. Go to mass.gov and search for DAR State Forest to get maps and details.

Musante Beach in Leeds has lifeguards and facilities. If you aren't a resident of Northampton, the entrance fee is \$6-\$7. Visit Northamptonma.gov and search for Musante beach to learn more

Ride the Bus!

PVTA

Route 42 from Williamsburg and Haydenville to Northampton Departs hourly at :20 or :25 after the hour, taking 35 minutes.

Link 413 bus to Pittsfield – Route 904

This new service connects us with Pittsfield with other local and regional routes.

Departing Williamsburg at 7:55AM, 9:55AM, 5:55PM, and 7:55PM, the journey takes an hour and five minutes. This bus stops in Goshen, Cummington, Windsor, Dalton, Merrill Rd., and Pittsfield's downtown transportation center. Fare is \$10, \$5 for seniors.

Visit the Berkshire Museum in Pittsfield, reopening in August after a complete renovation! Walk around the compact downtown, or take a connecting bus to Cheshire and climb Mt. Greylock via the Appalachian Trail! Connect in Pittsfield to Amtrak and intercity buses for points west.

Adventure

Visit Berkshire East in Charlemont for chairlift-enabled downhill mountain biking, zip line tours, a Mountain Coaster, camping, and an aerial adventure park.

Zoar Outdoors, also in Charlemont, has whitewater rafting, kayaking, and kayaking classes.

Crab Apple Whitewater also runs rafting trips on the Deerfield river.
