A conflict of interest can be about:

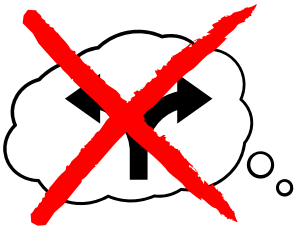
- Money

Conflict of Interest

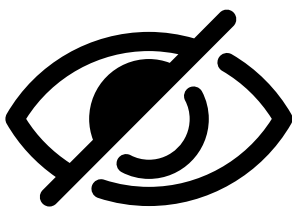
Examples of conflict of interest

If we share your private information with another company for money.

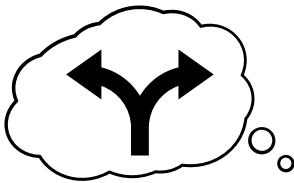
Conflict of Interest

If a conflict of interest happens:

- Staff must report it
