

Food Scraps Service Reminders





year. This equals about 18 percent of all the material getting sent to our landfills. Putting food waste in the **brown food scraps** container ensures it goes to the right place and not the landfill, where it releases gases that pollute the air.

Remember the following when putting your food scraps in the food scraps container:

- Keep it Clean Remember: only food belongs in the food scraps container. For what's accepted, scan the QR code or visit www. milpitassanitation.com/services/commercial/collection-program. Always take your food waste out of any packaging and either place it directly in your food scraps container, or...
- Use Clear Bags Clear bags are permitted for the sorting and collection of food scraps. Any black, white, color, or otherwise opaque bags are not permitted in the food scraps container.



Organics Sorting = Less Methane

When sent to a landfill, organic waste emits methane, a climate super pollutant 84 times more potent than carbon dioxide. You can help reduce methane emissions by collecting your food scraps and placing them in your **food scraps** container rather than the **garbage**.

Sorting Makes a **Difference!**

Gray = Garbage Brown = Food Scraps

Blue = Recyclable Containers Yellow = Paper/Fibers

Green = Yard Trimmings

Keep recyclable items out of the landfill through proper sorting. We know that recycling can be confusing, but some fine tuning will take your recycling to the next level. Recent contamination monitoring in Milpitas showed that these items are frequently placed in the wrong containers:


Plastic Bags/Film/Wrap – Film plastic, plastic bags, shrink wrap, and bubble wrap should be placed in

your **gray garbage** container.

Non-Recyclable Plastics – Plastic utensils, plastic cup lids & straws, foam/Styrofoam, and plastic delivery/mailer packaging should be placed in your gray garbage container.
