USE A CLEAR PLASTIC BAG FOR FOOD SCRAPS

Line your handy Kitchen Food Scraps Pail with a clear plastic bag, put your food scraps in the bag, then dump the bag and food scraps into the brown lid side of your gray garbage/food scraps split cart. Do not place the pail at the curb for collection.



CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS CAN NOW BE RECYCLED

Collect your clear plastic bags in another clear plastic bag, tie it, and place it in the **blue lid side** of your **blue recyclables split cart** to ensure they get recycled. Colored bags or un-bagged bags, whether they're clear or colored, will NOT be accepted and instead belong in the **garbage**. Other film plastics like bubble wrap and cling wrap will also NOT be accepted and belong in the **garbage**.



FREE NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP EVENTS ARE BACK!

The City of Milpitas, together with Milpitas Sanitation, is holding Neighborhood Clean-Up Events (aka Dumpster Days) to provide debris bins for residents to dispose of one (1) vehicle load (up to 3 cubic yards) of large/bulky items per household annually.

A WORD ABOUT CARDBOARD



Please remember to flatten cardboard and paper boxes and cut larger pieces to 3' x 3' or smaller before placing them into the yellow lid side of the blue recyclables split cart. This helps:

- Maximize space in the recyclables cart
- Prevent blockage inside the cart
- Keep drivers safe and the collection program efficient

Have extra cardboard? Flatten, cut, and stack next to your cart. DO NOT place in other streams.

MAINTAIN A CLEAN STREAM

Empty and scrape recyclable plastic, metal, and glass containers before placing them in the **blue lid side** of the **blue recyclables** split cart.



Sorting Makes a **Difference!**

Gray = Garbage **Brown = Food Scraps**

Blue = Recyclable Containers

Yellow = Paper/Fibers

Green = Yard Trimmings

Recycling can sometimes be tricky—but Milpitas residents are doing a fantastic job keeping recyclable materials out of the landfill through proper sorting. However, recent contamination monitoring in Milpitas revealed that a few common items are still ending up in the wrong carts:



1. Non-Recyclable Plastics - Plastic utensils, plastic cup lids & straws, foam/Styrofoam, and plastic delivery/mailer packaging are often incorrectly placed in the recycling. Place these non recyclable plastics in the

gray lid side of your gray garbage split cart.



2. Recyclable Containers – Items in this category include glass bottles and jars, metal cans and scrap pieces, aluminum foil, and hard plastic bottles, jars, tubs and trays. These items are often incorrectly thrown away with the garbage and food scraps. To ensure these

items get recycled, place them in the blue lid side of your blue recyclables container.

With just a bit of fine-tuning, we can take our recycling game to the next level.


