Some Plastics Aren't Recyclable



The following plastic items are not currently recyclable: film plastic, shrink wrap, bubble wrap, plastic utensils, plastic drink lids & straws, foam/styrofoam, & plastic delivery mailers. Place these items in your **gray garbage** container.

Clear plastic bags can be bagged together and placed in your **blue recycling** container.

A Word About Cardboard



Unlike the items mentioned above, cardboard can currently be recycled. All clean, dry cardboard should be placed in the **blue recycling** container (**yellow lid** side/container, if applicable). To create more room in the recycling container and help prevent litter, flatten all cardboard and paper boxes and cut larger pieces to 3' x 3' or smaller.
