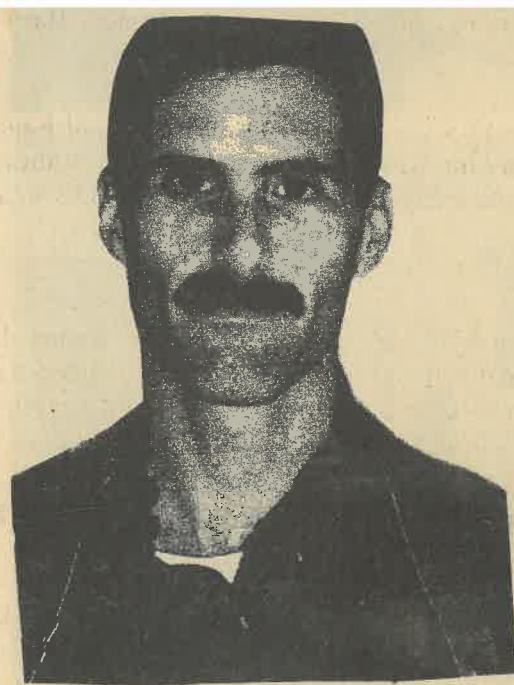
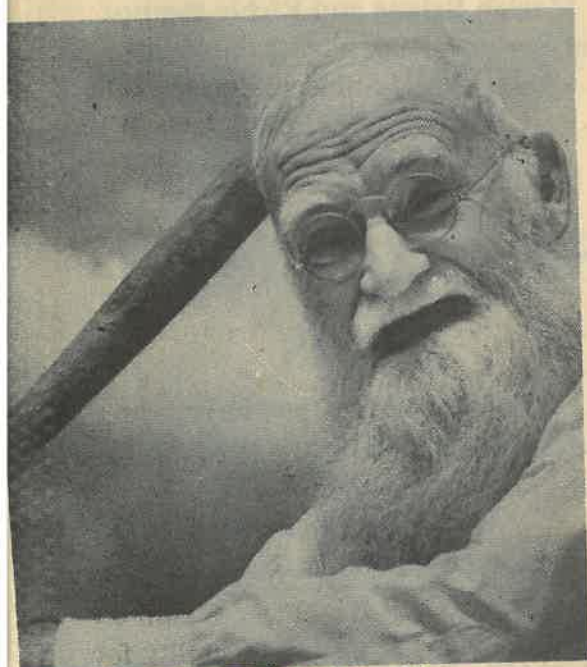

## Why Banister checked the tax law

In December 1997, I received a telephone call from a man named Joseph R. (Joe) Banister. He said that he had heard me on the radio months alleging that the income tax was voluntary and that the 16<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was never ratified. What made Joe's telephone call especially interesting was when he told me what he did for a living since 1993, he had been employed as a Special Agent (criminal investigator) in the IRS Criminal Investigation Division. Joe's job in CID was to investigate, arrest, and recommend prosecution for those who violated the federal income tax and money laundering laws. In addition to his investigative duties, Joe was the Asset Forfeiture Coordinator and Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force Coordinator for the Central California District. He also assisted in the firearms and defensive tactics training programs.

Joe told me he had heard my allegations regarding the voluntary income tax and because I had spoken on a reputable radio talk show hosted by a reputable talk show host, he felt further investigation was warranted. He was very concerned about continuing to perform his law enforcement duties if the allegations were true. Joe told me that he took his oath to support and defend the U.S. Constitution very seriously. He told me that he believed he had a moral and ethical duty to learn the truth. Joe told me that he wanted to get to the bottom of these allegations regarding the federal income tax and he promised that he would report his findings to his superiors and to the public if necessary, whether the allegations turned out to be true or false.

## The Phyllis Schlafly Report Executive Orders

The validity of particular Executive Orders has often been questioned, but neither Congress nor the Supreme Court has ever defined the extent of their power, and courts have rarely invalidated or even reviewed Executive Orders.

President Franklin D. Roosevelt proclaimed a national emergency and issued wide-reaching Executive Orders, notably his 1933 bank holiday and prohibition on private possession of gold, but those orders were subsequently ratified by Congress. The notorious Executive Order 9066 under which some Japanese-Americans were interned during World War II, was subsequently upheld by the Supreme Court under FDR's war powers. In 1952, the U.S. Supreme Court struck down Harry Truman's Executive Order 10340 to seize the nation's steel mills.

In 1996 the Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit invalidated Clinton's Executive Order 12954, which attempted to prohibit federal agencies from doing business with companies that had permanently replaced strikers.
