
Vision Statement: Seeing our students educated, equipped and empowered for their God-given purpose in the world.

The School

Newstead Christian School is a vibrant Christian School situated in Newstead, a suburb of Launceston, Tasmania. The school is a Christcentred, caring community and is registered for Kindergarten to Year 10. The census figures for August 2024 were 98 students enrolled in Prep — Year 10, with 5 students in Kindergarten. The School is owned and operated by Newstead Christian School Inc. in the state of Tasmania. The School teaches the Australian Curriculum from a biblical perspective, and seeks to equip our students, not just with knowledge and skills, but also Christ-like character. This is reflected in our motto — Equipped, Empowered to Serve.

Staff Retention

In the course of the year, there were some personnel changes. Mrs. Samantha Reid finished at NCS at the end of Term One, Ms Sarah Cameron joined us as a part-time Teaching Assistant, and Ms Bridie Maynard joined our administration team. Mrs. Melanie Duffy sadly resigned from her role of Community Relations Officer, and Mrs. Melanie Nugteren was appointed to this position.

At the beginning of Term Two, it was announced with sadness that, after much prayer, Ms. Diane Hooley had decided it was time to leave the school at the end of the year. It is to the goodness and glory of God that an excellent new principal was found in Mr. Glenn Mace. Glenn has many years of Christian school leadership experience and is already known to many of the NCS community from his time as interim principal when Diane was on sick leave for two terms in 2022. We thank God for His provision. Throughout the year, the culture among the staff was one of mutual support and compassion, fun, prayers, tears and laughter.

Expenditure & Teacher participation in Professional Learning	In 2024, our staff engaged in a number of professional development opportunities. The key focus of the professional development budget was Literacy, especially Structured Literacy, in line with the State Government mandate to improve literacy outcomes for all. In January, six members of staff which comprised of the Principal, the Director of Teaching and Learning, three primary school teachers, and a High School teaching assistant, took part in the five-day Yoshimoto Orton-Gillingham Structured Literacy basic training. In July, another primary teacher completed the same training, and three teachers took part in the Advanced Morphology training run by the same team. Four teachers attended the 3-day International Transforming Education Conference in Perth, W.A. One teacher achieved Full Registration status with the TRB in 2024.
