Adoption Letter and Statement of Commitment to the Global Digital Public Infrastructure
Safeguards Framework (DPI Safeguards)

Dear members of the DPI Safeguards Secretariat,

Through this letter, we write to you on behalf of the Consortium formed by the Latin American Open Data Initiative (ILDA), the Center for International Strategic Thinking (Cepei), and the Open Data Charter (ODC), to express our formal endorsement and onboarding as adopters (endorsers) of the UN DPI Safeguards Framework.

Our organizations, leaders in data governance, the use of open data for sustainable development, and the promotion of digital rights in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC), have established this Consortium to drive a fair, inclusive, transparent, and rights-oriented adoption of Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) in the region.

1. Organizational Profile and Geographic Scope

- ILDA: Leader in data governance, inclusion, and digital rights in LAC.
- Cepei: Specialists in data governance for sustainable development and public policy monitoring at the multilateral level.
- Open Data Charter (ODC): Global network promoting open data, ethical data governance models, and digital rights in collaboration with governments.

2. Vision and Key Safeguard Focus Areas

Recognizing that political processes, technical capacities, and country priorities in our region vary significantly, our Consortium will focus its efforts on contextualizing and promoting operational safeguards for DPI under a "Readiness & Influence" framework, prioritizing the following areas:

- Prevention of Harm and Rights-Based Approach (Do No Harm): Avoid risks of exclusion, undue surveillance, or service fragmentation in Digital ID, Payments, and Data Exchange deployments in LAC.
- Governance, transparency, and accountability: Strengthen the closure of the operational gap

between high-level principles and actual implementation through robust institutional frameworks and multi-stakeholder governance processes.

- Inclusion and regional contextualization: Adapt international recommendations to the institutional, social, and legal realities unique to Latin America and the Caribbean.

3. Preliminary Action Plan

To ensure an effective transition from a public statement to measurable impact, the Consortium will execute the following strategic lines of action:

- Checklist and rapid risk assessment template: Practical tool aimed at lawmakers, decision-makers, and technical teams to identify baselines and mitigate risks throughout the DPI project lifecycle.
- Multilateral and regional coordination: Direct dialogue with multilateral bodies such as UNDP and coordination with key regional networks like the Inter-American Network on Digital Government (Red GEALC), especially on cross-border Digital ID initiatives.
- Value generation and visibility: Highlight experiences and voices of LAC actors through case studies, events, publications, and regional and international platforms. Priority regional events for 2026: Abrelatam/Condatos in Guatemala and the Red GEALC Annual Meeting in the Dominican Republic.
- Living repository: Creation and maintenance of an open repository of knowledge products on regional learnings about DPI and Safeguards for decision-makers and civil society organizations.

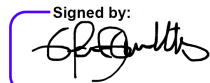

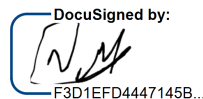
