What happens after submitting an application?

- If we can offer you a place, we will request payment of a CHF 1,000.- non-refundable application fee per child, per session.
- Once the non-refundable application fee is paid, you will receive an invoice for the camp fees and pocket money.
If we cannot offer you a place, your application may instead be placed on the Waiting List. In this instance no payment will be required as a place on the Waiting List does not guarantee that a place will open before the beginning of the camp.
- Enrolment is confirmed upon full payment. Without payment within the timeframe specified on the invoice, the place is relinquished.

A/ Payment terms

I/ For places offered between November and March:

- The CHF 1,000.- application fee is payable upon receipt of the invoice.
- The subsequent invoice for the camp fees and pocket money must be settled within 30 days of the billing date.

II/ For places offered after April 1st:

- Any new offer of places will require one single full payment upon receipt of the invoice including the non-refundable application fee, the camp fees, and the pocket money.

III/ Conditions:

- A student may not start the camp if any outstanding fees remain to be paid.
- The sum of CHF 100.- from the pocket money will be held until the last day for additional expenses before travelling home, or special transportation arrangements. Any remaining balance of pocket money is given to the child upon departure.
- Camp fees are quoted in Swiss Francs (CHF). If a payment is made in a foreign currency, the official exchange rate of the day of the transaction will be used. Any difference in favour of the payee will be credited or, in the case of a shortfall, a further payment will be invoiced.

B/ Fees include

- Full board and accommodation (at certain special activities, in tents or mountain refuges), according to age.
- Provision of bed linen and towels.
- Full laundry service (dry cleaning is not offered).
- Classes, sports, arts, and activities offered within the programme, including associated coaching and material.

- Insurance of emergency expenses in case of accident and illness. This is a travel insurance and assistance solution providing cover in the event of a medical emergency resulting from illness or accident. If the child's health/accident insurance in his/her country of residence does not cover the costs abroad or if the child does not have health/accident insurance, our insurance is activated to cover the costs in Switzerland during the camp. In all cases, our company will contact the child's health insurance, if it exists.
 - Personal liability insurance, and local residence taxes in Crans-Montana.
 - Transport to and from Geneva Airport on the official days of arrival and departure.
 - A Régent Camps back pack as well as a water bottle.

Fees do not include

- Cancellation insurance.
- Various personal expenses (telephone, stamps, excess baggage, UM service, etc).
- Extra money held by the participants should be handed into the Direction, at checkin on arrival day, for safe keeping.
- No valuable objects, or jewellery should be brought on campus. Régent Camps is not responsible for providing students with insurance cover against theft.

C/ Cancellation and reimbursement conditions

- The application fee of CHF 1,000.- is non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Fees paid cannot be credited for a subsequent summer.
- In case of cancellation before 1st May 2026, 70% of camp fees will be refunded. Full refund of pocket money.
- For cancellations after 1st May 2026 the full amount (application and camp fees) is retained. Full refund of pocket money.
- If a participant is expelled, or leaves before the end of the camp, no fees will be reimbursed. Full refund of remaining pocket money.
- We do not offer cancellation insurance. We strongly recommend that parents verify their own insurance conditions.

D/ We reserve the right

- To withdraw an application in case of incompatibility with the chosen camp: for example, health concerns impeding full participation in the programme, schedule conflict rendering the student unable to attend for the entire camp duration, request for time allocation for work unrelated to the camp...
- To refuse admission based on unsatisfactory record from previous camp.
- During the camp, to send a student home, notably for disciplinary or health reasons.
- To modify itineraries and content in response to changes in weather conditions or unforeseeable circumstances and in the interest of students' safety and well-being.
- To cancel a session.

E/ Multimedia

Please be advised that photographs and videos taken during the Régent Camps may be used in our multimedia platforms, such as brochures, presentation videos, social media profiles and our website. F/ Data processing

Personal data provided by children and their parents or produced by the office during the admission process or linked with the education provided at the camps is used for admissions, teaching on and off-campus, all activities, life in the boarding house and the supply of goods and services to students. This data may also be used for communication, statistics, and anonymised, for marketing purposes.

To fulfil these objectives, Régent Camps may also communicate personal data to other third parties such as suppliers of educational or administrative tools. This data may be stored in Switzerland or abroad and may also be transmitted if necessary to meet legal requirements in Switzerland.

We may use video surveillance in certain public and communal areas for the safety of all and to identify behaviour contrary to the Codes.

G/ Contractual agreement and litigation

The participant's parents confirm their agreement with the conditions set out in this document and the expectations set forth in the Camp Codes. By agreeing to this document, the parents agree to abide by these policies. The contractual agreement between the parents, the child and the camp is, in the final instance, subject to Swiss law. Should there be any case of litigation between the camp, the students and the parents, this will be judged by courts in the Canton of Valais (Switzerland). The term "parents" used in this document is understood to refer to the child's legal representative.

A note about external representatives:

While families are free to choose whether to enrol their children directly or to use an intermediary to do so, external representatives such as educational consultants and agents do not influence enrolment decisions or order of importance on the waiting list.
