



# Kids' Activity: The "Power Scout" Adventure



**Goal:** Help children learn that some toys and electronics have rechargeable batteries, must be charged in a safe place, and should only be plugged in with adult help.

## Step 1 — Find the "Hidden Power" (Colouring Page)

### What to do

1. Give your child colouring page.
2. Ask them to find and colour the toys and devices that need batteries.

### What to say

"Some toys and electronics have rechargeable batteries inside. They need electricity to wake up. We plug them in to charge the battery – but we always charge them safely."



## Step 2: The Scavenger Hunt (The Mission)

### What to do

Give each child a "Power Map" where they've circled the different lithium-ion objects they've found. They can pick up one toy powered by lithium-ion and bring it back to the table

**The Hunt:** Grab a pencil. Your mission is to find 6 Hidden Batteries:

- ✓ 2 Grown-up things (like a laptop, phone, or toothbrush)
- ✓ 2 Kid things (like a tablet, toy car, or headphones)

### What to say

**The "No-Touch" Rule:** To keep it safe, tell them: "You are a Power Scout! Scouts use their eyes, not their hands. Point to the big things, and only bring A small, unplugged toy to our 'Charging Station' (a hard, flat surface like the kitchen table)."





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## Step 3: The "Safety Sorting" (The Lesson)

**Goal:** Help children learn that some toys and electronics have rechargeable batteries, must be charged in a safe place, and should only be plugged in with adult help.

### **What to do**

Once everyone is back at the table with their item (or their list of found items), it's time for the **Safety Check**.

### **What to say**

"All these things have batteries. They need to be charged safely."

The **"Breathe" Test:** Is this table hard and flat? (Yes!) This is a Happy Charging Spot because the battery can stay cool. Is a bed or couch a good spot? (No! Those are too "stuffy.")

### **Teach the Grown-Up High-Five Rule:**

"Plugs are for grown-ups. When a battery is low, what do you do?"

Answer: Find a grown-up and ask for help.

**Give your child a high-five to celebrate.**

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## The Power Scout Pledge

Have them hold up their pledge and repeat:

- ✓ I find the battery!
- ✓ I ask a grown-up before plugging in my toys

**The Scout Rule:** Use your eyes, not your hands!


Circle the items you find. Then, pick up **ONE** small toy with a battery and bring it back to Base Camp (the kitchen table).
