When compostable materials decompose in landfills, they produce methane, a powerful greenhouse gas that contributes to climate change.

California's SB 1383 aims to keep compostable materials out of landfills. In Alameda County, the Organics Reduction & Recycling Ordinance helps residents and businesses comply, supported by a partnership between local agencies.

WHAT DOES THIS LAW MEAN FOR MY BUSINESS OR MULTIFAMILY PROPERTY?

- All sites must have compost and recycling services. Free help and indoor green bins are available.
- Place compost and recycling bins next to all garbage bins, except in restrooms, and ensure items are properly sorted.
- Large businesses with surplus edible food must donate it to food recovery organizations.

Opt for containers that match your needs and ensure a tidy, efficient collection area.

More Ideas to Make the Most of Your Service:

- Make sure the area around containers is clear and accessible for service.
- Close container lids tightly to prevent birds, critters, and rain from getting in.
- Schedule additional service when you have overflow, large items, or construction/demolition debris.
- Flatten and/or cut boxes to maximize space in the **RECYCLABLES** cart/bin.
- Please remember **no glass, metal, & plastic** in the **ORGANICS** cart/bin.
