AUDITIONS

Our audition process is nurturing, supportive and interactive

DATES/TIMES

All Cast Ages 7-10: Sunday, December 14, 9:00 am-1:30 pm in Group Fitness Studio All Cast Ages 11-18: Monday, December 15, 4:30-8:30 pm in Zale Auditorium

- Actors are expected to arrive promptly at the required call time and stay the entire duration until excused by the producer
- Please send water and a sandwich or snack with your actor to auditions
- Parents do not stay but may wait in the lobby or return for pick-up at 5:30 PM

WHAT TO PREPARE TO AUDITION

- Actors MUST bring one copy of their measurement sheet completely filled out. <u>Click</u> to download and <u>print</u>
- Actors MUST completely fill out the audition form and bring three copies.
- Clipped to each copy must be a headshot (does not need to be professional quality.)
 Click to download and print
- Actors MUST be prepared to sing the following song at audition: "Pure Imagination" (measure 20-37, track timing 0.44 to end of song.)
 The sheet music and MP3 can be found online. Song choice does not indicate what role you'll be cast. Click to view and download sheet music
 Click for MP3
- Actors should be prepared to show off other special talents (beyond singing, dancing and acting.) This could include playing an instrument, tumbling, juggling, etc. They can bring their "tools" if they want
- Actors need to wear comfortable clothing for dancing and wear sneakers or dance shoes

IMPORTANT CAST REQUIREMENTS - PLEASE REVIEW!

- ACTORS MUST ATTEND ALL REHEARSALS.
 If there is any unavoidable conflict it MUST be noted in advance on the audition form so we can plan rehearsals and cast accordingly
- TECH WEEK REHEARSALS ARE MANDATORY.

AUDITION DAY

Our audition process is nurturing, supportive and interactive

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Actors sign-in and will be greeted with a warm smile
- Actors will engage in a group meditation to clear their minds and unify the group with positive energy
- Actors will do a vocal warm-up and theater game to get out the wiggles and ensure everyone is having fun. This is a great opportunity for our actors to begin to bond and get comfortable with one another
- Actors will then split into two groups. One group will learn a dance (the choreography)
 and then will perform; The other group will review the audition song and then
 individually perform
- Actors will then switch groups
- Actors will then have an opportunity to show their special talent, time permitting
- Actors, at director's discretion, will then do some scene work from the script. Reading material will be provided







CASTING

Our approach services both the actors and the storytelling

DETAILS

- We will NOT be casting by age; so your actor will most likely be working with other actors of various ages
- Our experience shows this approach opens more opportunities to show off actors' talents and gives broader leeway for our directors to devise two casts that have the best chemistry to tell the Willy Wonka JR. story

If an actor has an unavoidable scheduling conflict requiring a specific cast, you MUST inform us before the audition to ensure the best opportunities for all actors. Actors can NOT request to be cast with friends.

CASTING EXPECTATIONS

"DON'T COUNT YOUR LINES. MAKE YOUR LINES COUNT!"

- Casts and roles will be announced on first day of rehearsal, **Sunday January 11**. Please have your actor meet in Zale Auditorium at 1:30 pm promptly
- **Every role is important and meaningful**: We encourage you to share this theater fact with your actor prior to auditions and after casting
- Our directors work hard to ensure **everyone has their time to shine on stage**. Please keep this in mind, especially after casting, and kindly be patient

REHEARSALS

This is where the magic unfolds – all cast members are needed

OVERVIEW

- Rehearsal is **every** Sunday starting January 11, 1:30-5:30 pm until the final performance
- Actors are expected at all rehearsals. Your actor's absence affects the entire cast, their own confidence and ability to remain current with what is being taught that day. Please email Alise with any last minute emergencies
- Tech rehearsals are MANDATORY. See dates previous page
- Parents, stay updated with what actors are learning every week by reading our blog. Important information, deadlines and exciting news will be shared

REHEARSAL EXPECTATIONS

- Actors are expected to bring their script, a pencil and a highlighter to every rehearsal
- Actors need to wear comfortable clothing for dancing and wear sneakers or dance shoes
- Actors bring a water bottle and a healthy snack. Vending machines will be off-limits
- **VERY IMPORTANT:** Actors will be held accountable by their directors to practice between rehearsals. Please encourage your actor to learn all songs, practice lines, and choreography during the week. This is a great opportunity for parents to get involved and have fun with your actor. Make it a family experience that will help them!
- Use the resource library at <u>jccdallas.org/resource</u> where we post MP3s of all the show's music tracks, weekly choreography, and songs learned at rehearsals
- Parents are highly encouraged to play rehearsal and performance tracks in the car, at home and whenever possible to encourage at-home rehearsing
