


## Cultural Experience Packages

### Where Culture's Meet



Experience the culture of Haudenosaunee people as you travel the Six Nations of the Grand River. Move through time as you explore rich history. His Majesty's Royal Chapel of the Mohawks. Woodland Cultural Centre, take a guided tour of Chieftown National Historic Site and Explore the Six Nations community by bus to discover where we reside today.


### On The Water



Soak in the beautiful scenery of the Canadian forests as you paddle down the Grand River by canoe or kayak.

While on this three-hour tour listen to the Creation Story and the rich history of the Six Nations people. The guided tour will take you through rare ecosystems along the Grand River as you learn about the importance of all living things within the Haudenosaunee culture.

### Day of Play



Try out Traditional Haudenosaunee games then venture out to the Nature Trail, home to the largest area of Canadian forest in Canada.

Enjoy a guided tour of Chieftown National Historic Site and learn about the history of the Haudenosaunee medicine game, Lacrosse. Test your skills in a scrimmage game of lacrosse and archery. In the summer months indulge in canoeing/kayaking on the Grand River.



1883 - 2023

The Six Nations Agricultural Society was formed in 1883 and in 1883 they held the first Annual Fall Exhibition, a community tradition that continues to this day.



Chief George Johnson (E. Pauline Johnson's father) could speak 9 languages—all six of the Six Nations languages plus English, French and German.



In 1923-24 Levi General confederacy Chief Deskaheh travelled to Geneva to meet with present day United Nations marking the first North American Indigenous group's claim for sovereignty to an international forum.


