1.6 Explanation of terms

name	Explanation	
Surface-mounted hardware	With surface-mounted hardware, the pivot components are visible when the sash is closed.	
Concealed hardware	With concealed hardware, the pivot components are not visible when the sash is closed.	
Non-standard windows	Non-standard windows are windows or patio doors with a non-standard shape: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Round arched window• Segmental arched window• Triangular window• Pitched window	
Sash	The sash is the movable element of a window or patio door, which is mounted in the frame.	
frame	The frame is the fixed element of a window or patio door, which is mounted in the wall opening.	
Comfort mushroom cam	When the sash is closed, the comfort mushroom cam engages in the striker plate.	

2 Sicherheit

2.1 Designated use

- TITAN is a hardware system that allows windows and patio doors to open and close.

2.2 Requirements for the target group

The following persons may only operate the product if they have understood the dangers involved in handling the product or if they are supervised during operation:

- children
- persons with diminished physical, sensory or mental capabilities
- persons with a lack of experience and knowledge

2.3 Safety notes

Danger of window sash falling out due to malfunction of the window

If a window malfunctions, the window sash can fall out and cause serious injury.

- Do not continue to use the window.
- Secure the window and have it repaired by a qualified technician as soon as possible.
- Children and people who are unable to assess this hazard must be kept away from areas of danger.

Danger of window sash falling out due to improper operation

An additional weight load of the window sash strains the bearing components excessively. Bearing components could break. The window sash could fall out and cause severe injuries.

- Do not load the sash additionally.

Danger of window sash falling out due to obstacles between the sash and frame

If the window sash hits an obstacle, this places excessive strain on the bearing components. Bearing components could break. The window sash could fall out and cause serious injuries.

- Do not place obstacles between the sash and the frame.

Danger of window sash falling out as a result of hitting a reveal or exceeding the specified opening angle

If the window sash hits a window reveal or exceeds the specified opening angle, this places excessive strain on the bearing components. Bearing components could break. The window sash could fall out and cause serious injuries.

- Use a sash brake.

Danger of window sash falling out when opened incorrectly

If the window sash hits a wall projection or other obstacles, or if the specified opening angle is exceeded, the sash may fall out. The sash could cause serious injuries.

- Open the sash slowly.
- When opening the sash, do not allow it to hit a stationary obstacle.
- Never let the sash swing open in an uncontrolled manner.





A window sash can cause serious injuries.



- Do not put your hand or fingers into the opening between the window sash and frame while closing the window.
- Avoid letting window sashes slam open or shut. Close and lock windows if it is windy or there is a draught.
- Children and people who are unable to assess this danger must be kept away from windows.

Turn-and-tilt window (see page 14)	A turn-and-tilt window can be turned or tilted open depending on the position of the window handle.	
Tilt-before-turn window (see page 15)	A tilt-before-turn window can be tilted or turned open depending on the position of the window handle. It can only be opened in the turning position with the key.	
Tilt window (see page 16)	A tilt window can only be tilted.	
Comfort window (see page 20)	A comfort window can be turned or tilted open depending on the position of the window handle. The window handle is attached horizontally to the bottom of the sash. A comfort window is usually equipped with a turning lock.	






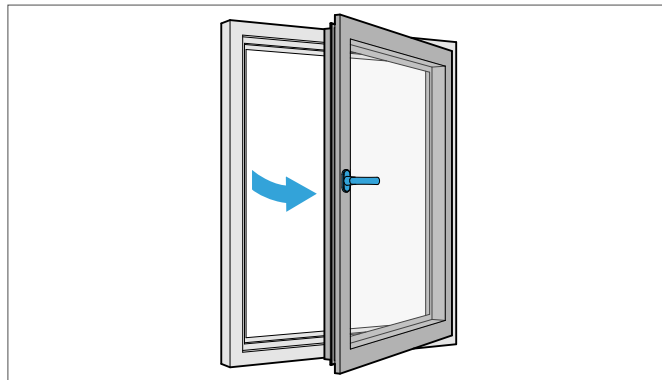
4.1 Operating a turn-and-tilt window

Opening a window in the turning position

1. Place the window handle in the turning position.

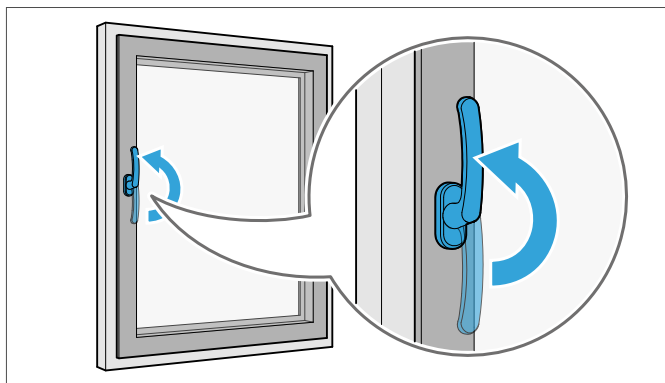


2. Open the sash.

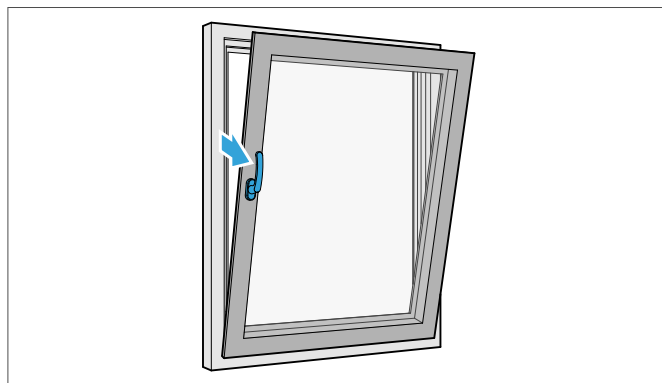


Opening a window in the tilt position

1. Place the window handle in the tilt position.



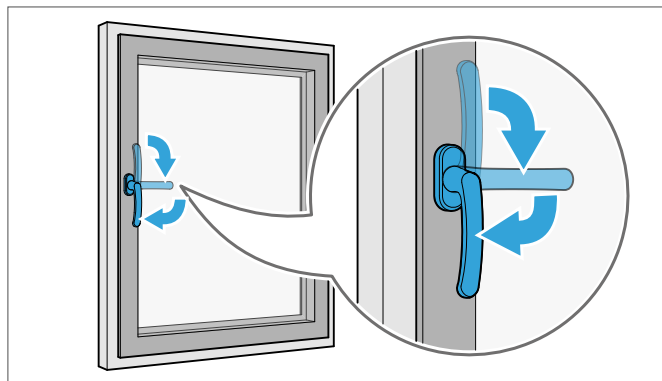

1. Close the sash.

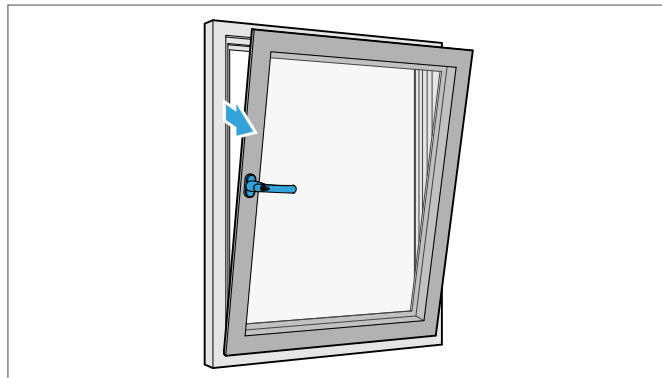
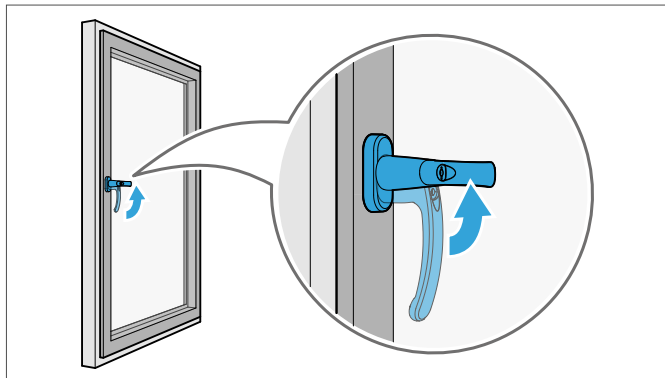

2. Tilt the sash.

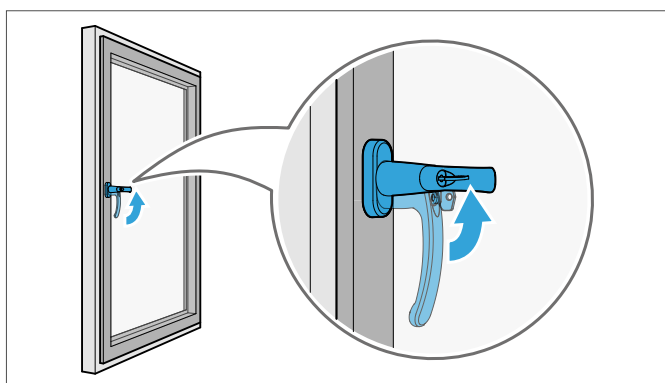

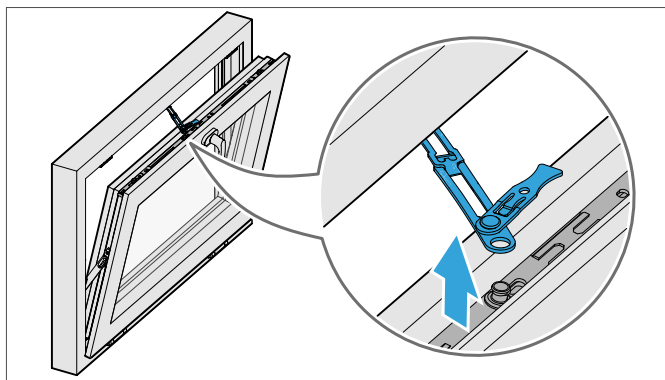


Opening a window for cleaning

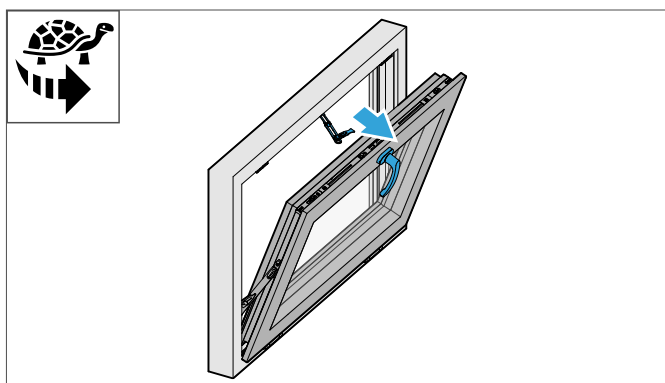
1. Flip open the catch on the 45° extension arm.
Depending on the size of the window, there may be two extension arms.



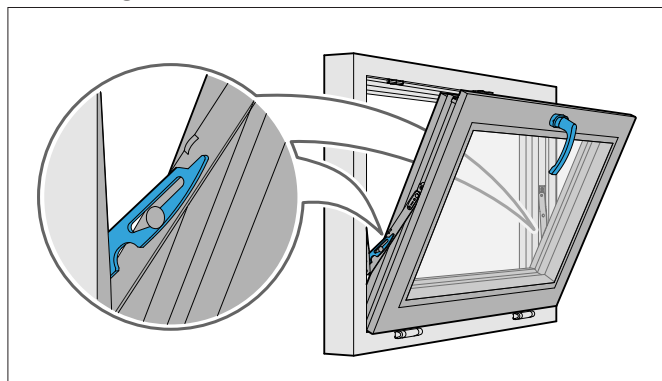
2. Lift the extension arm. While doing so, hold the sash in place to secure it.



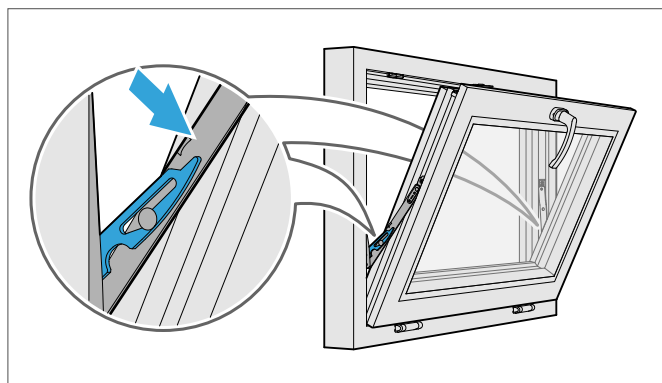
3. Slowly tilt the sash as far as it will go and hold it there.



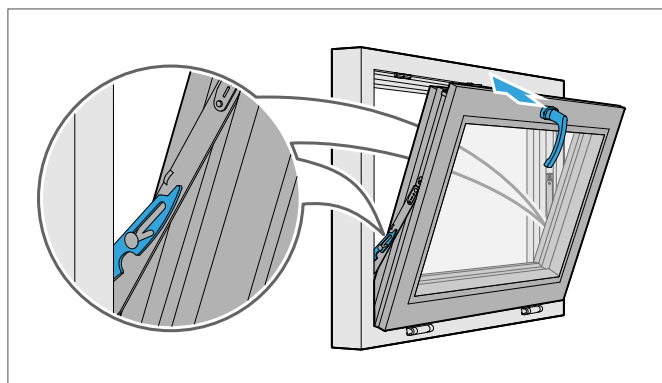
- The tilt-only safety stay restricts the opening angle.



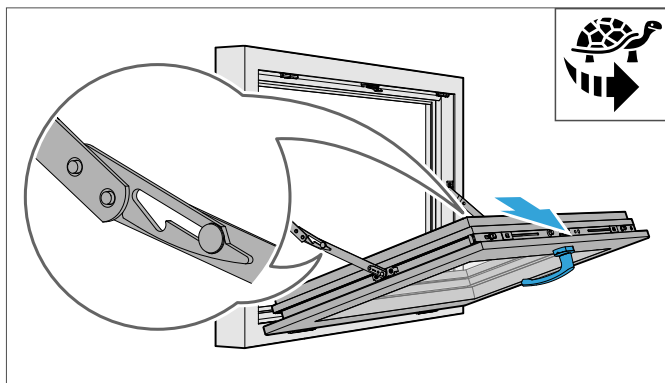
4. Push the lever arm on both tilt-only safety stays in the direction of the arrow.



5. To unlock the lever arms, push the sash closed until the bolt is at the bottom of the lever arm.

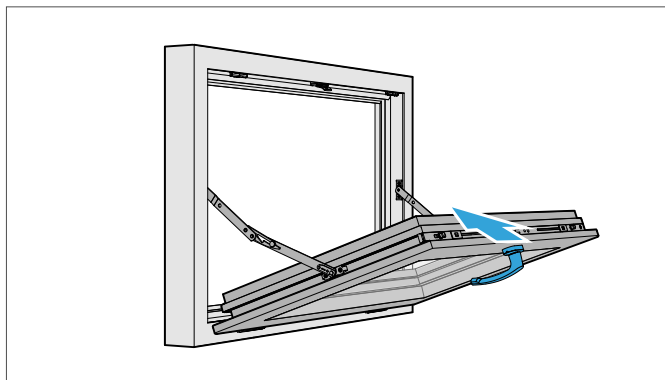


6. Slowly open the sash as far as it will go and hold it there.

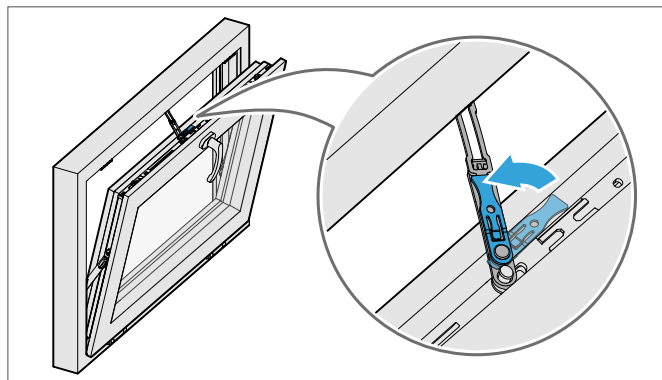


Closing the window after cleaning

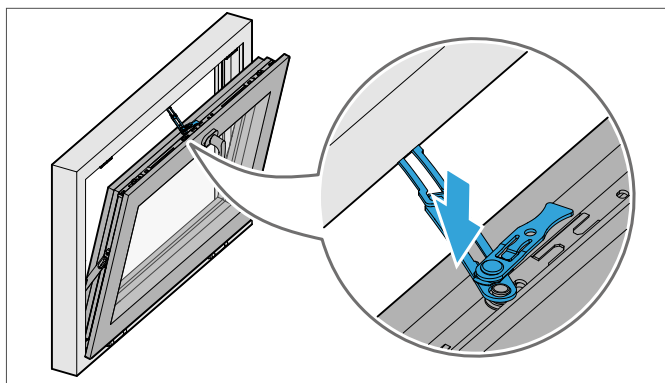
1. Push the sash closed until the tilt-only safety stays engage.



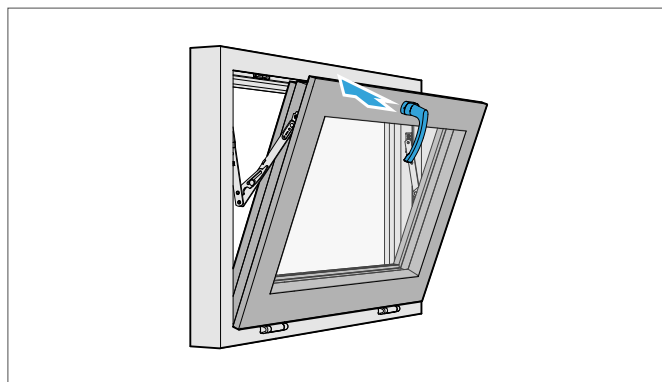

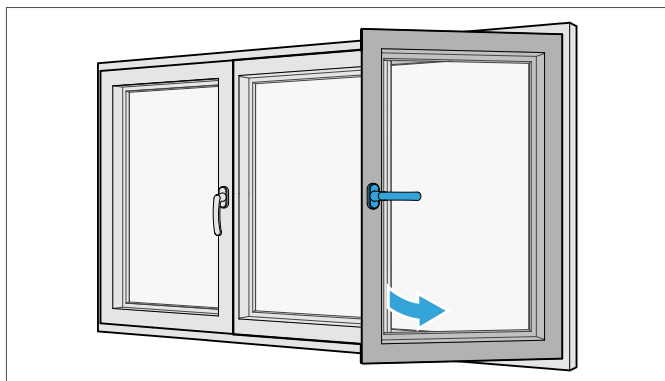
4.6 Operating a triple-sash window

7. Always close the centre sash first and swing the handle inwards. Then do the same with the secondary sash before finally closing the primary sash.

4.7 Operating the opening restrictor S

The opening restrictor S prevents unauthorised individuals from being able to open the window

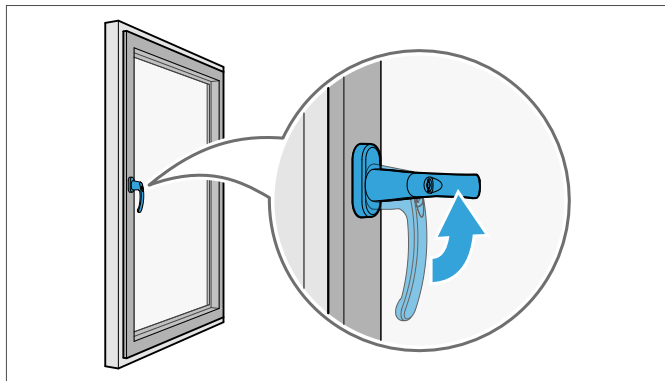
without constraint. The maximum opening width in the turning position is 89 mm. Only authorised individuals can open the window without constraint.

4.8 Operating the opening restrictor C

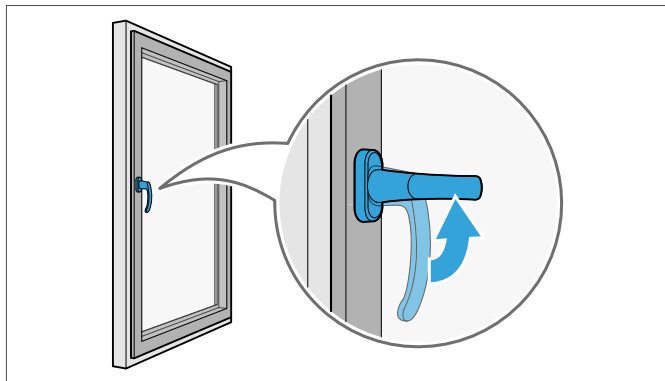
The opening restrictor C restricts the maximum opening width to 89 mm in the turning position. If necessary, users can open the window as far as they like.

Opening a window with the opening restrictor activated

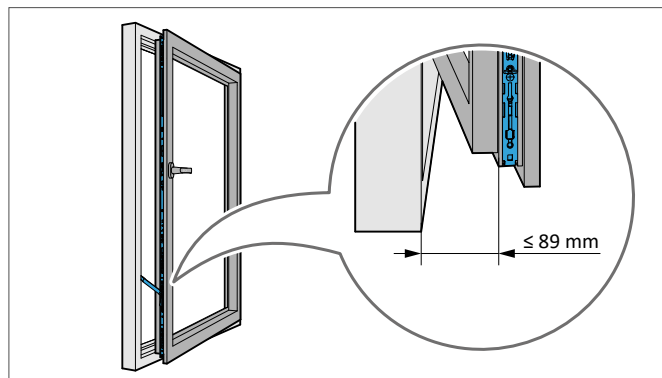

- The window is equipped with an opening restrictor C.

- Place the window handle in the turning position.



- Open the sash.

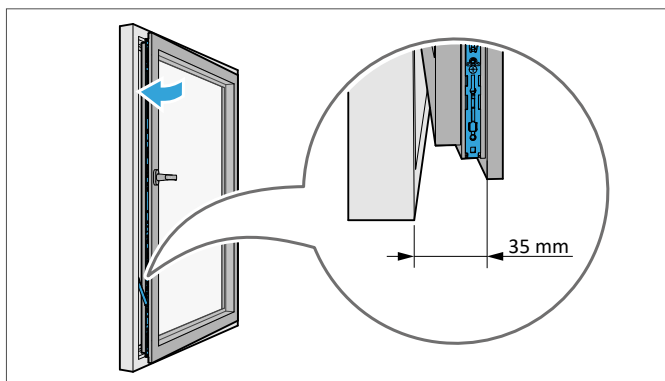

4.9 Operating the 90° opening restrictor

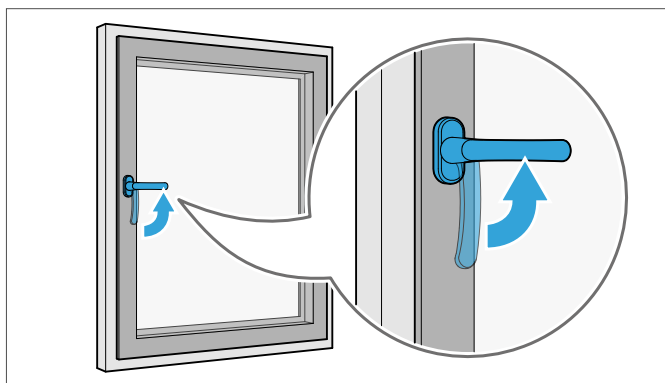
The 90° opening restrictor restricts the opening angle of a window to 90°.

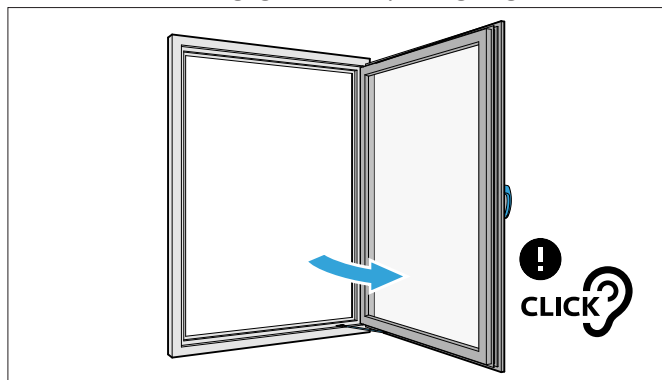
- The window is equipped with a 90° opening restrictor.

1. Place the window handle in the turning position.



2. Open the sash.

→ The sash engages at an opening angle of 90°.



4.10 Operating the sash brake

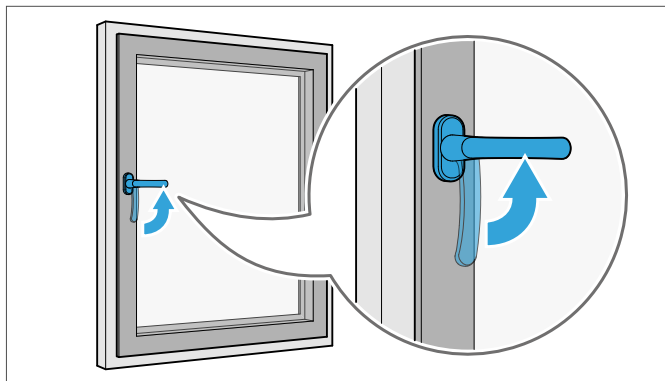
The sash brake restricts the opening angle of a window. Users can select an opening angle of between 25° and 91°. The sash stops at the desired opening angle.

- The window is equipped with a sash brake.

- Place the window handle in the turning position.

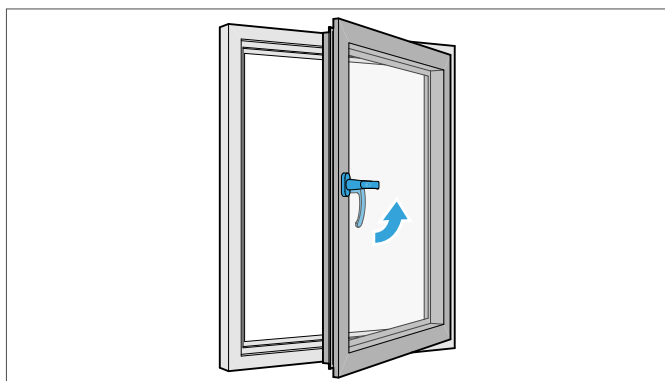


- Turn the sash to the desired opening width. Place the window handle in the locking position.

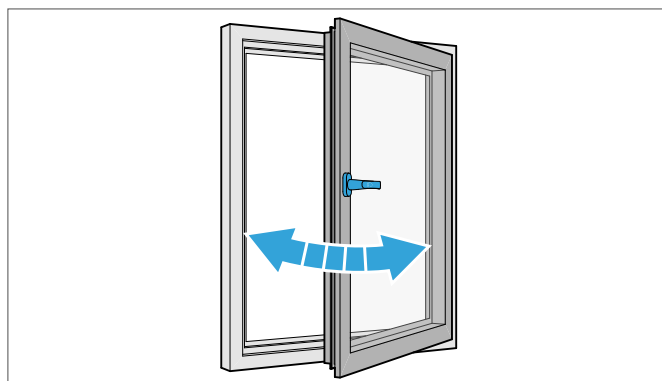


Deactivating the sash brake

4.11 Operating the sash brake TR

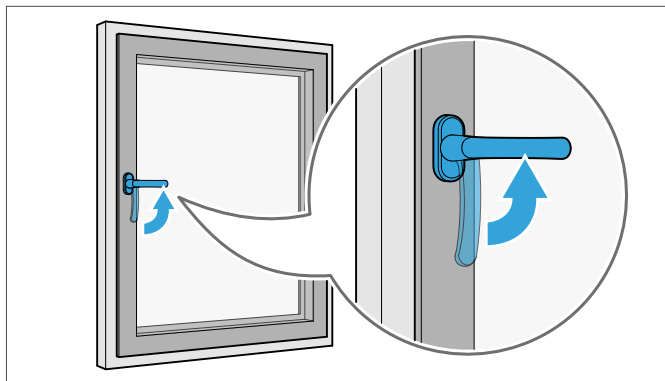
The sash brake TR restricts the opening angle of a window. Users can select an opening angle of between 15° and 90°. The sash stops at the desired opening angle.

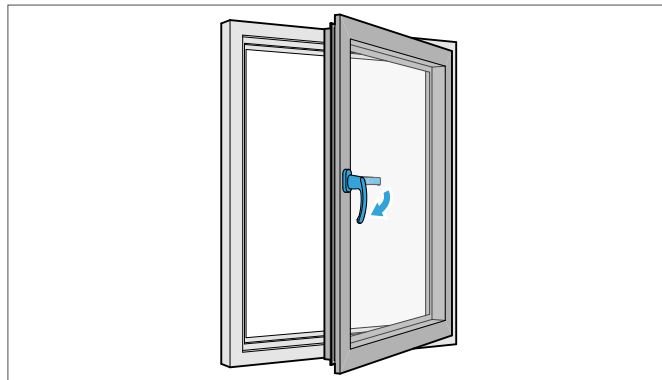

- The window is equipped with a sash brake TR.

1. Place the window handle in the turning position.

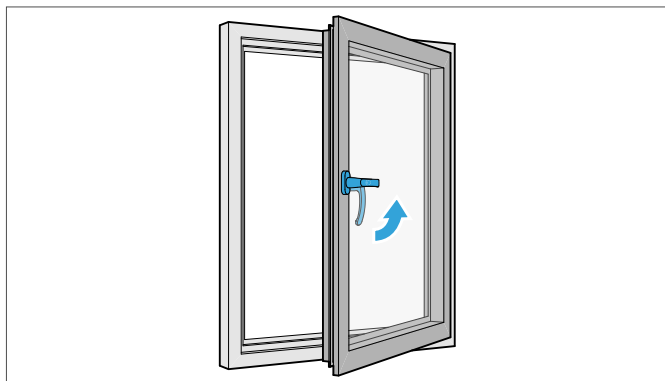


2. Turn the sash to the desired opening width (15° to 90°). Place the window handle in the locking position.

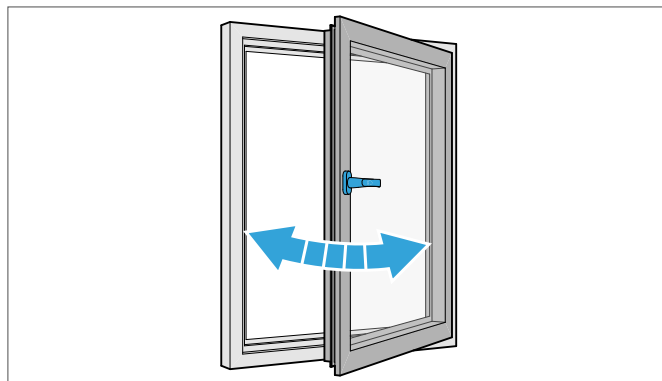

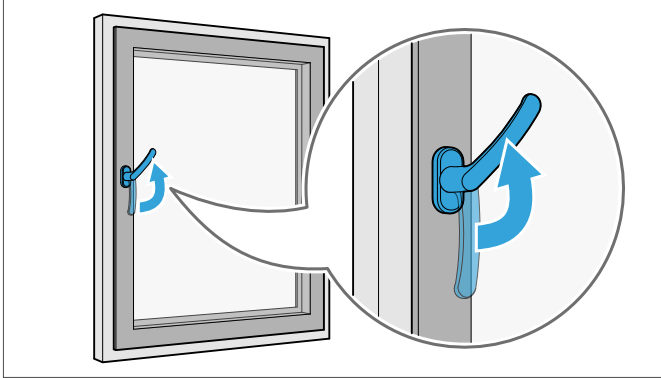
4.12 Operating the night vent

Night vent enables a window to be tilted with a small opening angle.

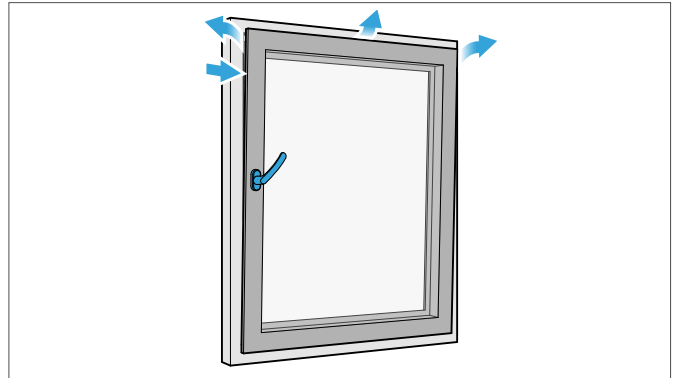

**4.13 Operating the energy-saving stay**

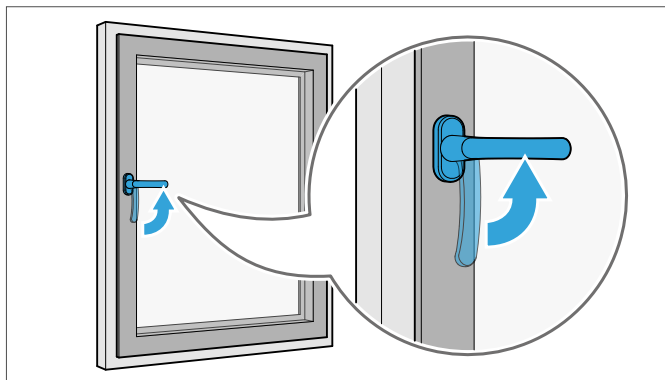
The energy-saving stay enables a window to be tilted with a small opening angle.

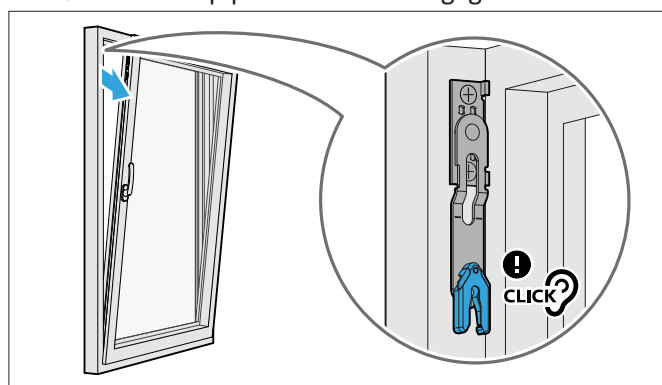
1. To deactivate the energy-saving stay once again, release the stop piece by moving it in the arrow direction.

4.14 Operating the cockspur fastener

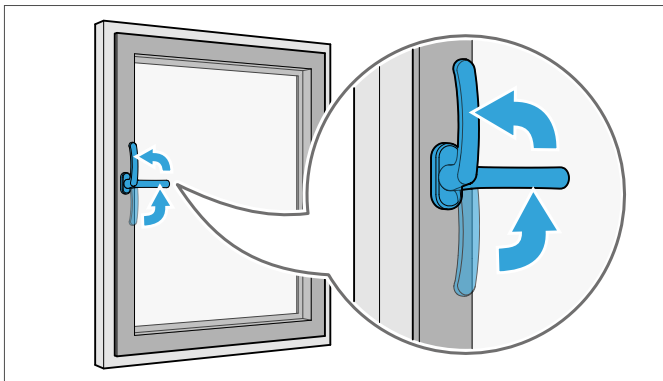
The cockspur fastener restricts the opening width of the window in the turning position or tilt position. Four different opening widths are possible with the cockspur fastener.

Locking the cockspur fastener

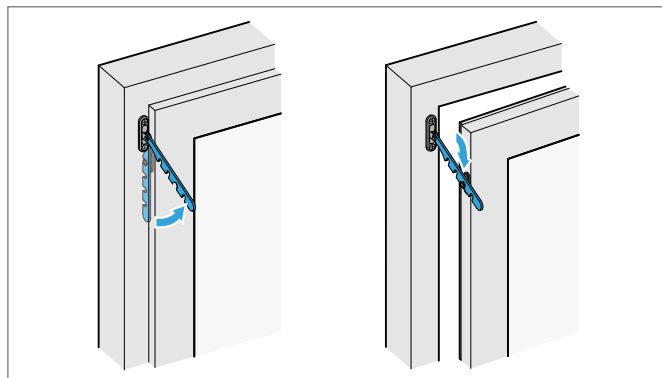
Prerequisite

- The window is equipped with a cockspur fastener.

1. Place the window handle in the turning position or tilt position.



2. Move the sash to the desired position and lock in place using the cockspur fastener.



4.15 Operating the night vent for side-hung windows

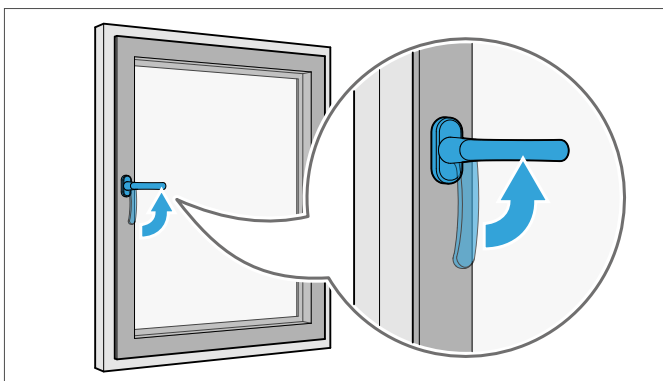
The night vent for side-hung windows restricts the opening width of the window in the turning position. Three different opening widths are possible with the night vent for side-hung windows.

Opening a window without opening restrictor activated

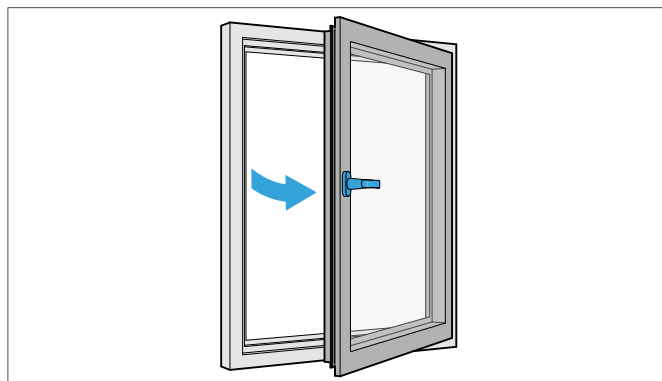

1. Place the window handle in the turning position.



2. Open the sash in the turning position.



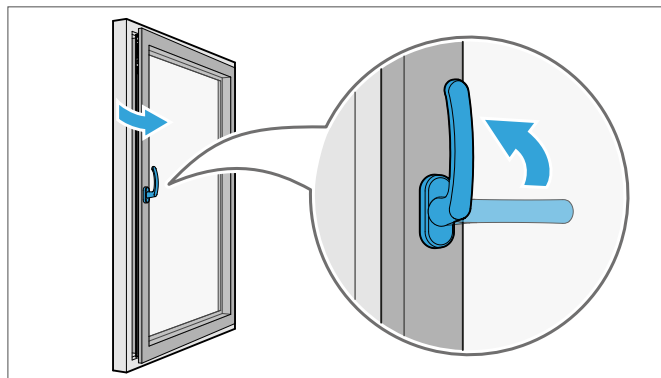
Opening the sash to the first position

2. Turn the window handle upwards and open the sash.

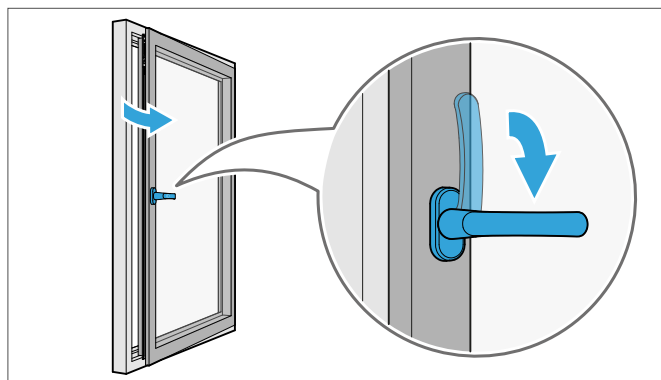


Opening the sash to the second position

◇ Place the window handle in the turning position and open the sash.

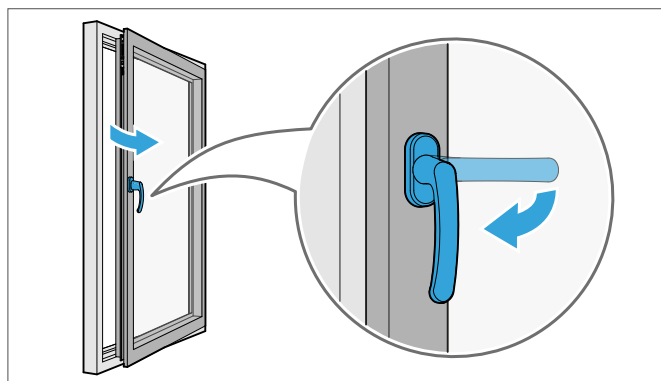


Opening the sash to the third position

◇ Place the window handle in the locking position and open the sash.

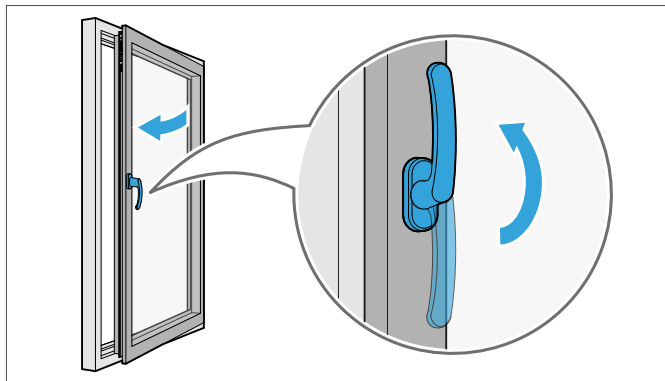

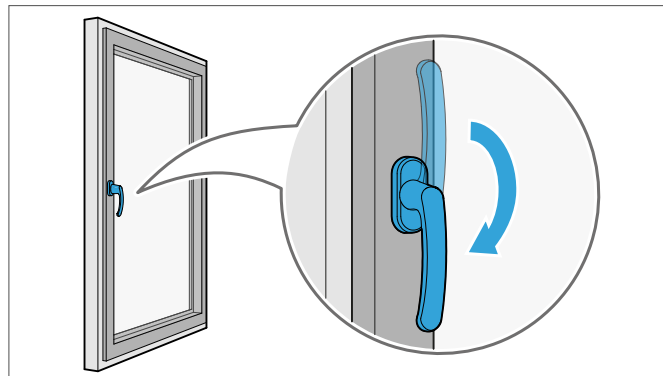

4.16 Operating the turning lock

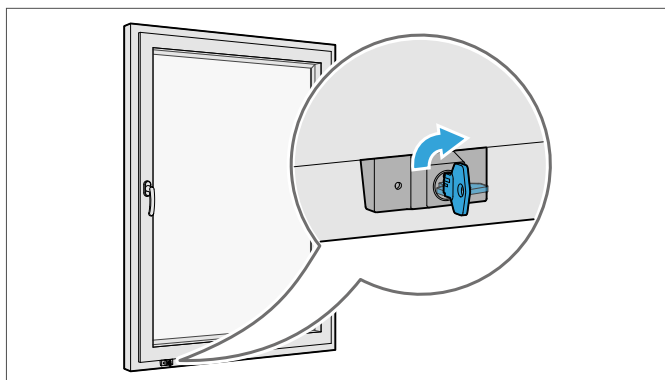
The turning lock prevents unauthorised individuals from being able to open the window in the turning position. When the turning lock is activated, the window can only be opened in the tilt position.

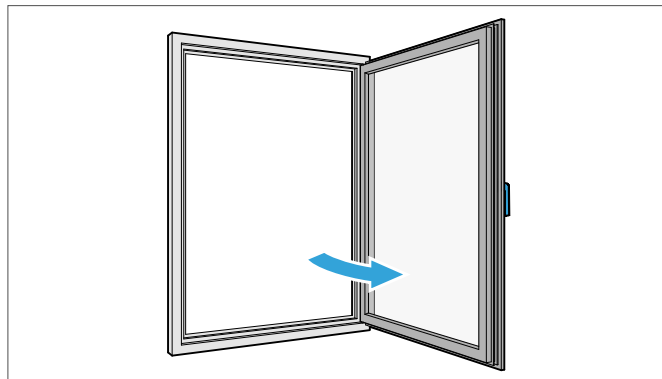
A door handle enables a patio door to be opened in the turning position. Door handles are lockable.

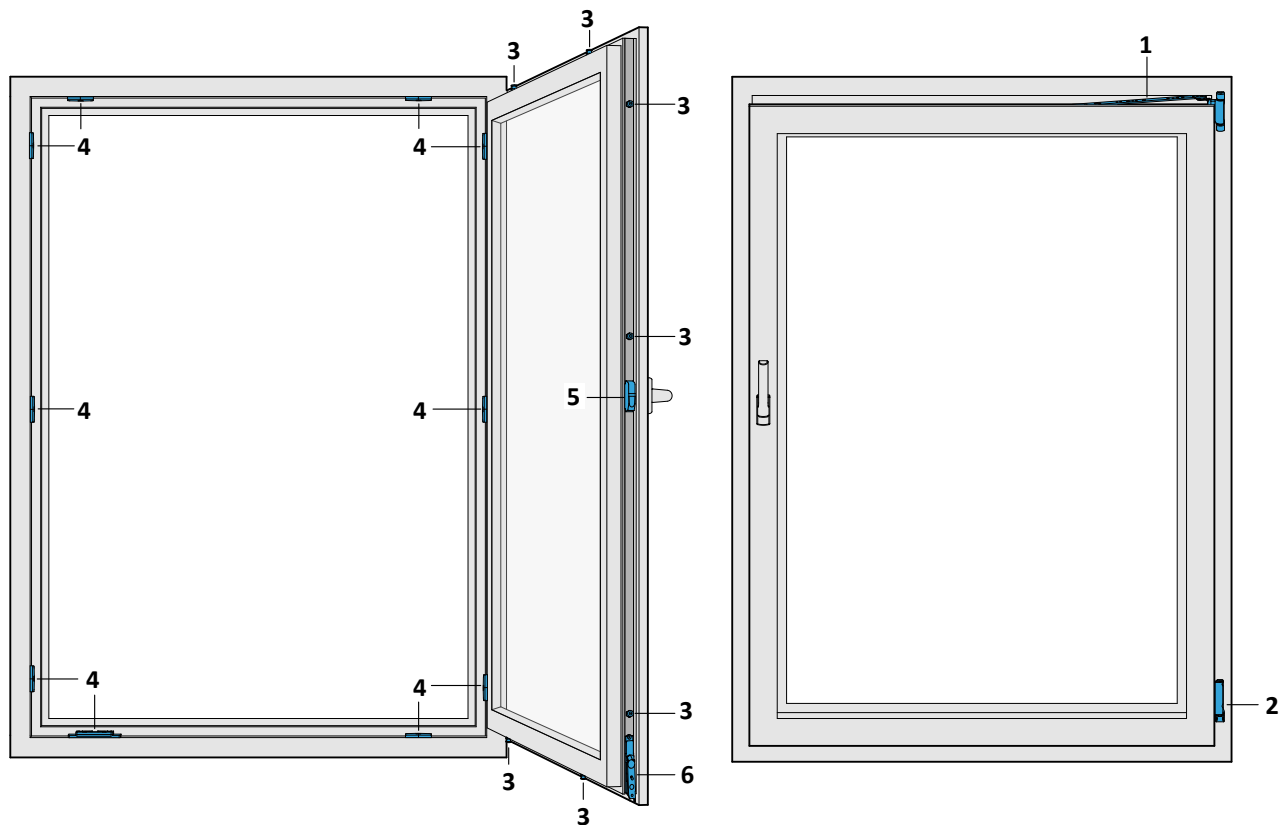
5 Care and maintenance

5.1 Notes on cleaning and maintenance



- ◇ Use a soft cloth for cleaning.
- ◇ Use a diluted, pH-neutral cleaning agent only for cleaning purposes.
- ◇ Dry the hardware thoroughly after cleaning.
- ◇ Lightly wipe the surface with an oil-soaked cloth. Use an acid-free, resin-free oil for this.

5.2 Lubricating components

- ◇ Grease or oil all moving hardware components and all locking points and check to make sure they are functioning properly.
- ◇ Check that all hardware components are secure and check for signs of wear.
- ◇ If necessary, hire a qualified technician to carry out the following maintenance work: tighten fixing screws, adjust components and replace components.



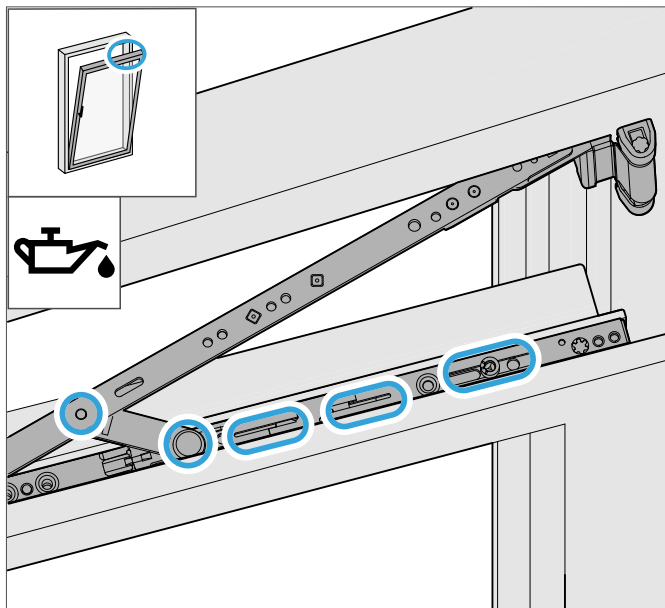

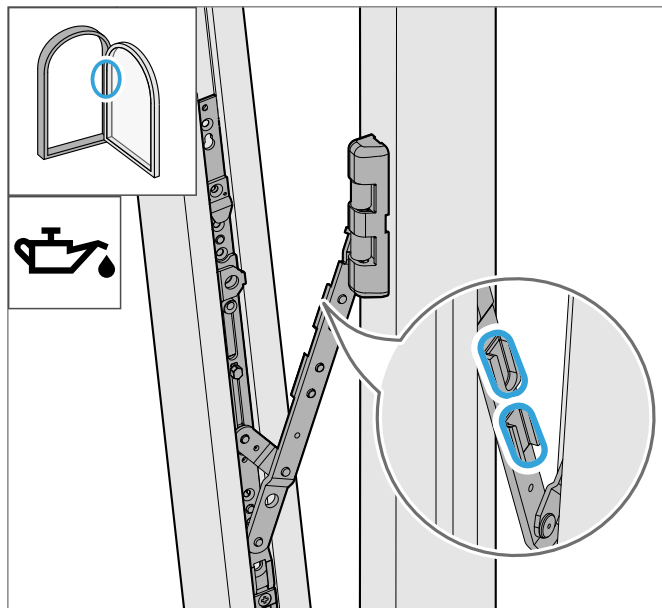

Lubricating stays

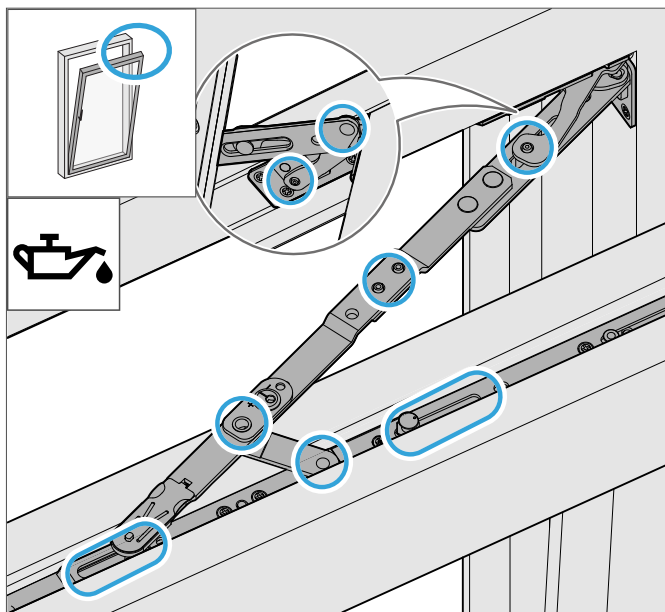
- ◇ For a window with a surface-mounted hinge side: lubricate the stays at the marked points.



- ◇ For a arched head window or other non-standard windows: lubricate the stays at the marked points.

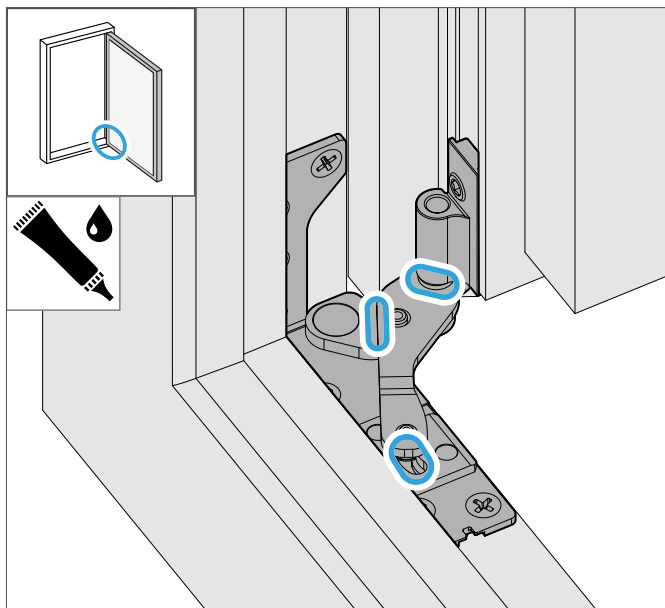


- ◇ For a window with a concealed hinge side: lubricate the stays at the marked points.



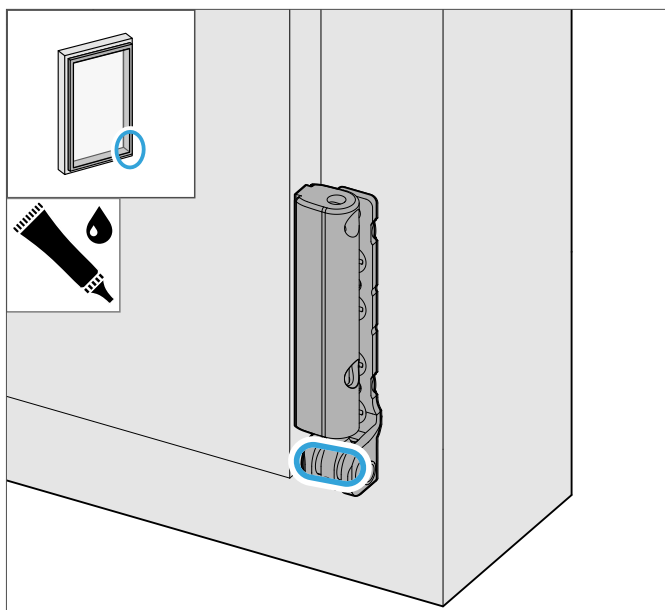
Lubricating the corner hinge

- ◇ Lubricate the corner hinge at the marked points.



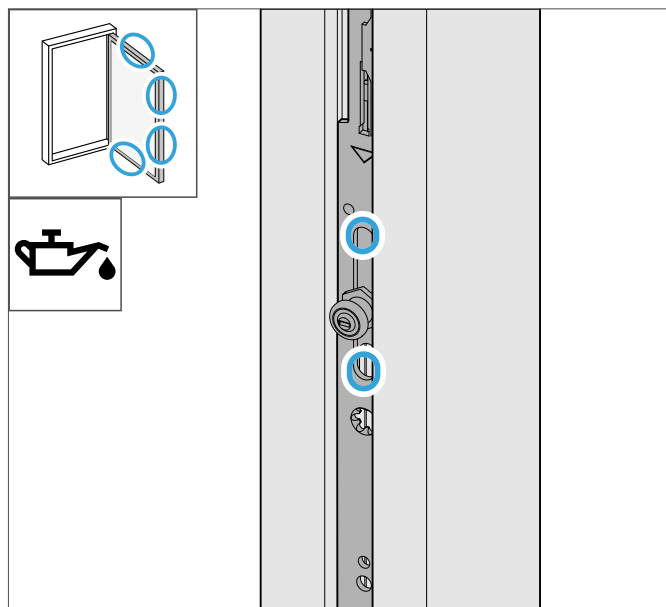
Lubricating the bottom hinge

Lubricating the comfort mushroom cams

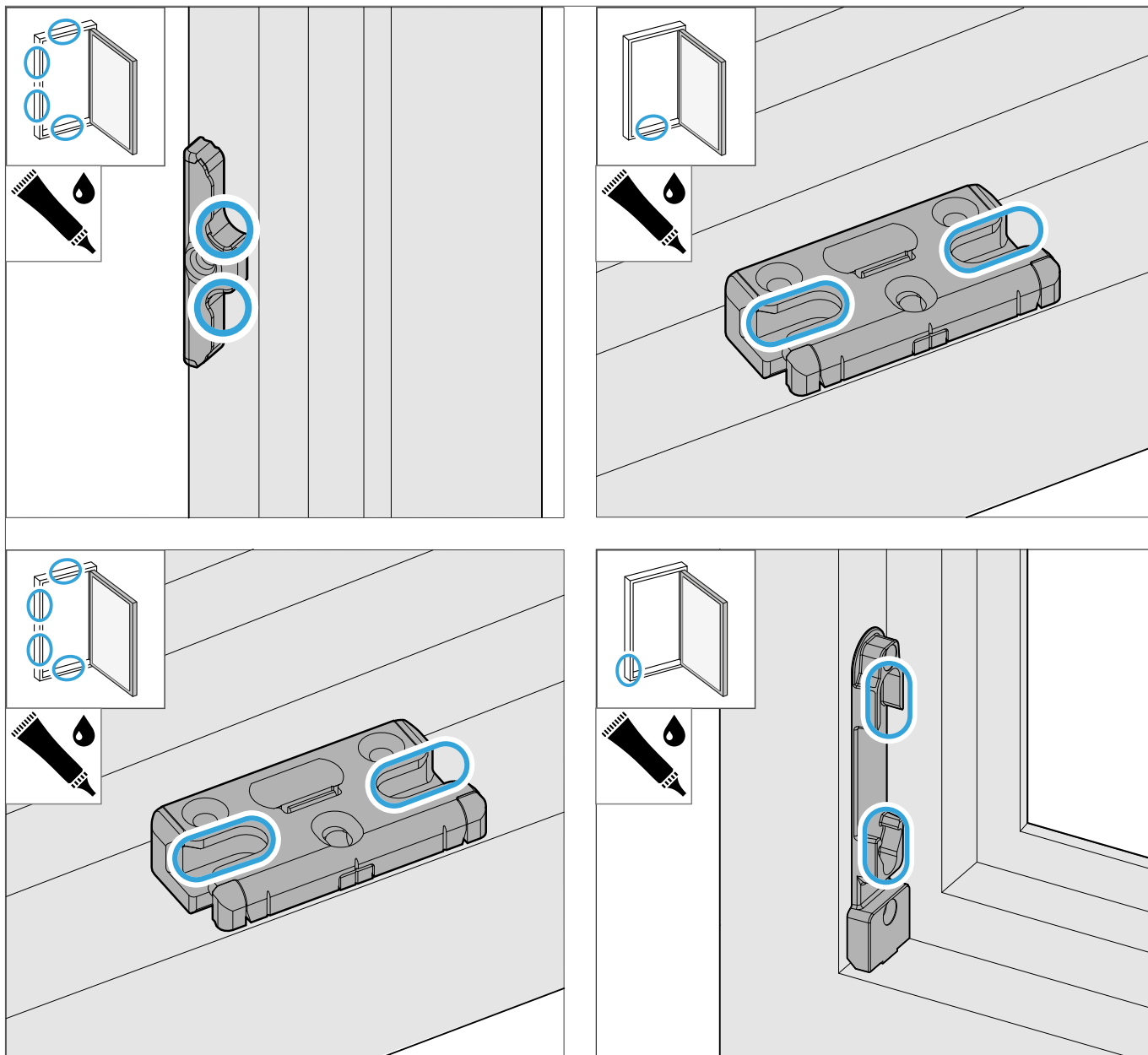
- ◇ Lubricate the comfort mushroom cams at the marked points.

The comfort mushroom cam does not move smoothly into the striker.	The comfort mushroom cam has moved during cleaning.	, the Positioning the comfort mushroom cam (see page 49).
The opening restrictor S is not functioning.	The extension arm is not hooked into the sash part.	, the Hooking the extension arm on the opening restrictor S into place (see page 49).
The opening restrictor C is not functioning.	The spring on the extension arm has moved.	, the Positioning the spring on the opening restrictor C (see page 50).

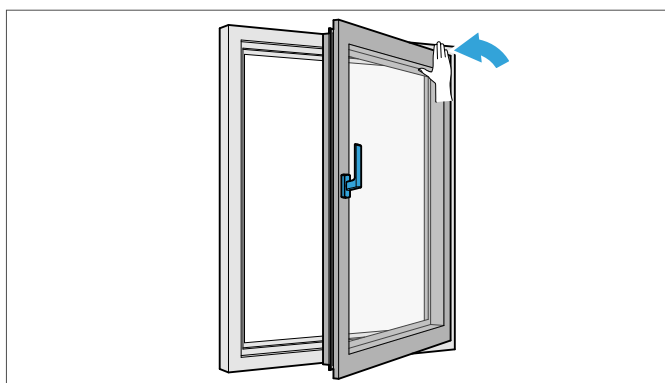

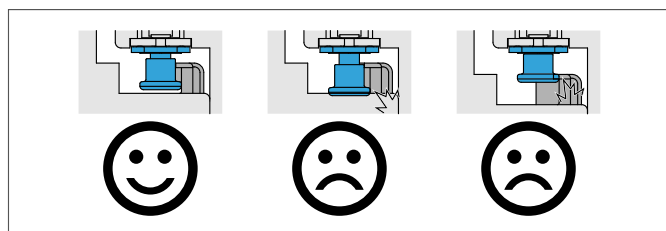

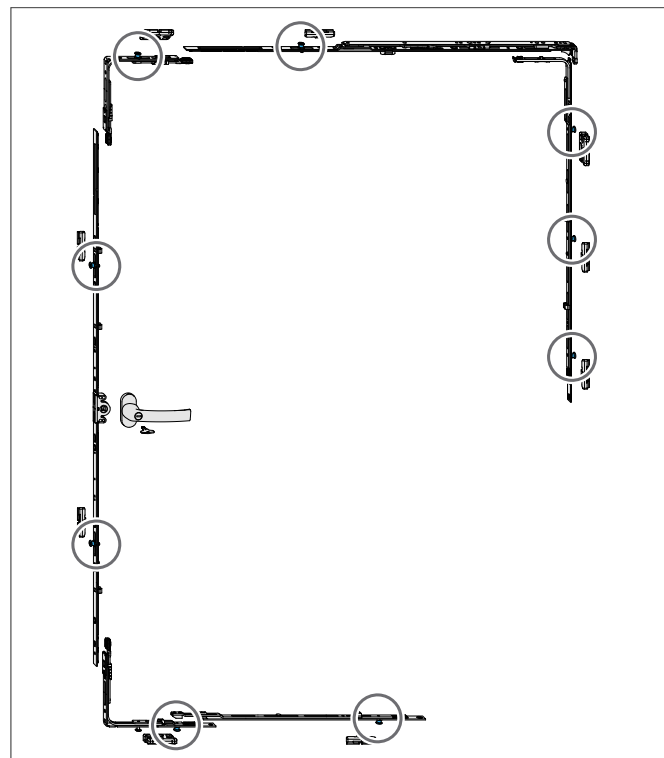

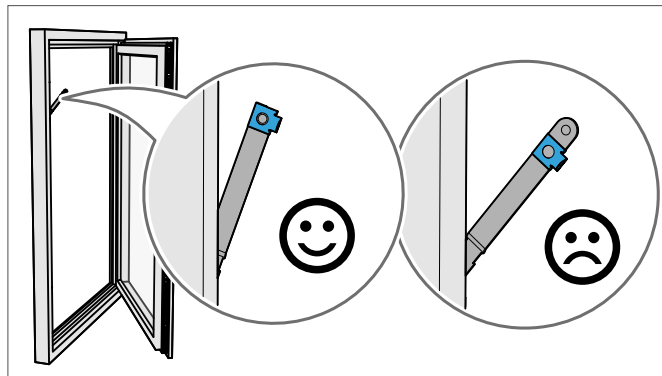


Positioning the spring on the opening restrictor C
