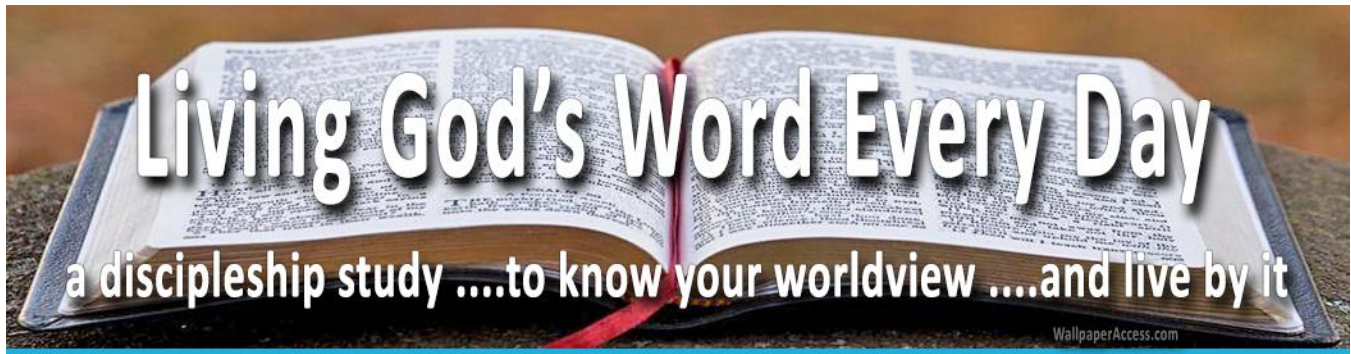




What is your assignment from Jesus?

STUDY ASSIGNMENT

Go to ***KnowYourWorldview.org*** and read **Chapter 22**. Let’s talk about your assignment(s) as Jesus’ Disciple. What is He calling you to do for Himand with Him. We’ll discuss it,but only you can do something about it.



Every Disciple of Jesus lives to be doing something with Himfor Him. Your assignment(s) will match your abilities, use your spiritual gifts,and stretch you with new challenges.

“God was thinking about you when He devised His plans for you. He considered what would be best for you, help you, encourage you. As you work together in His Kingdom, you are saying, ‘God, I love You and trust You, and I want to be with You.’” (Daniel Floyd, *Living The Dream*, p 125)

People who work with Jesusput in the time and effort to be:

an Encourager – a person who inspires others with the courage and confidence to do something. An encourager helps others by listening well and focusing on their needs in facing life’s challenges. They offer genuine support, motivating others to lead significant lives.

a Mentor – a person with experience and knowledge,who gives another person help and advice for their well-being. Synonyms include: adviser, coach, counselor, guide, teacher....

a Friend – a person attached to another by feelings of affection or personal regard. A good friend is genuinely supportive and celebrates when things go well in another person’s life. Friends are forgiving, and hold themselves accountable to be a trustworthy and reliable friend.

If Jesus is ALL of these,then what is He calling you to beand to do with Him?

Question 1: How do you know your assignment from God?

In chapter 22, we discuss knowing and following God’s will for your life. At 80-ish, I can tell you it is an evolving relationship with our Lord. What you do with and for our Lord progresses and expands as you grow in your knowledge of Godand progress in life’s experiences with Him.

Whatever you do with God, always strive to finish well. That never goes unnoticed with Him.

Listen to your heartas you listen to God’s Spirit.
