# A WORD FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

I'll be honest with you, when I walk the hallways of Portland Christian School today, I feel something I can only describe as gratitude layered on top of memory. To my fellow alumni: you are part of this. The foundation you stand on was built by people who gave faithfully before us. Now it's our turn. And to every parent, donor, teacher, and friend of PCS, thank you for trusting us with something this important.

The best days of Portland Christian School are not behind us. They are ahead. And I believe with everything in me that God is not finished with what He started here in 1924.

## **A CONVERSATION WITH THE WAITHE FAMILY**

### **“WHY WE CHOOSE PORTLAND CHRISTIAN SCHOOL”**

Everyone has a story. We recently connected with the Waithe family to learn more about their story and why they chose Portland Christian School; what brought them here, how their daughters have flourished, and what they hope their children carry with them long into the future. Thank you to the Waithe family for taking the time to share a little of your story.

**What initially drew you to this school, and what has surprised you most since becoming part of this community?**

What initially drew us to this school was the sense of community and the focus on helping each child grow academically, but also personally. From the very beginning, we felt welcomed and supported. What surprised us most has been how connected everyone is, the teachers, staff, and families who truly care about the students. Portland is an environment where children feel valued and encouraged.

**How have Olivia and Victoria grown or changed in ways you didn't anticipate?**

Victoria and Olivia have both grown so much with a sense of confidence and independence. We expected academic growth, but what really stood out was how much they developed emotionally and spiritually. They've become more comfortable with expressing themselves, trying new things, and building friendships. Seeing them excited about learning and proud of their accomplishments has been incredibly rewarding.

**What does a typical week look like for your family, and how does this community fit into that rhythm?**

Our weeks are usually very busy with our local church and after-school activities, including tennis and swimming. We prioritize our family responsibilities by spending quality time with each other, with homework and family dinners. Portland Christian's community has become an important part of our routine by helping us to prioritize our everyday family responsibilities.

The communication from teachers and staff helps us stay informed and involved, and the supportive environment makes school feel like an extension of our home. It's reassuring to know our children are in a place where they are encouraged and cared for every day.

**What would you say to a family who is considering becoming part of this community?**

I would tell them that this is a community where children are genuinely supported and encouraged to thrive. The relationships built here make a real difference, and families feel included and welcomed. If you're looking for a place where your child can grow academically, socially, and emotionally in a positive environment, Portland Christian is a wonderful community.

**Beyond academics and programs, what do you hope your child carries with them long after their time here?**

Beyond academics, I hope my children will carry confidence, kindness, resilience, and a love for learning. I want them to remember the importance of community, respect, and believing in themselves. Those life lessons and relationships will stay with them far beyond their years here.



## MISSIONS WEEK 2026: FAITH IN ACTION

This spring, Portland Christian School students stepped out in faith and into action during Missions Week 2026. Across four unique locations, our students and leaders had the opportunity to serve, grow, and witness firsthand how God is at work both locally and globally. From the mountains of Appalachia to the cities of Eastern Europe, it was a week marked by faith building moments, spiritual growth, and opportunities to see God at work in our hearts and in the lives of others.

In partnership with PROEM Ministries, a team of 23 high school students and leaders traveled to Poland. While there, students served in local schools, helping Polish students practice their English while building meaningful relationships. They also participated in sports ministry and had the opportunity to join a local youth ministry for a powerful worship service. During this time, our students were able to pray for and encourage Polish Christian youth, creating connections that went beyond language and culture. The impact of this trip continues even now, as two of our students have committed to return this summer to serve as interns with PROEM.

Another team of 24 high school students and leaders traveled to the Dominican Republic to serve alongside GO Ministries. Their week included sports outreach, construction projects, and children's ministry, creating opportunities to serve both practical and relational needs. A special highlight of the trip was visiting the home of our beloved exchange student, Evelyn Rodriguez, giving the team a deeper personal connection to the community and culture. This also marked the third consecutive year Portland Christian School has served in the Dominican Republic, continuing to build lasting partnerships and meaningful impact.

Closer to home, 15 students and leaders headed to New York City in partnership with Movement.org. This team engaged in urban ministry, prayer walks, and service opportunities throughout the city. They experienced the diversity and complexity of one of the world's most influential cities while learning what it looks like to live on mission in everyday spaces. It was a powerful reminder that ministry is not limited by geography. It is a calling wherever God places us.



Our largest group, made up of 32 middle school students and leaders, served in Appalachia with Crossroads Ministries. Students participated in hands on service projects, including home repair, community outreach, and practical acts of kindness for families in need. For many, this was their first mission experience, and it opened their eyes to both the needs and the resilience found within these communities.

While each location offered unique opportunities, a common thread ran through every trip: students grew in their understanding that God is already at work, and we are invited to join Him. No matter the language spoken or the culture experienced, we were reminded that our God is present in every place. He understands every word, every story, and every people group. They learned to step outside of their comfort zones, serve selflessl , and see people the way the Lord does.

Beyond the projects and programs, the lasting impact of Missions Week is found in the hearts of our students. Many returned with a deeper faith, a greater awareness of the world around them, and a renewed desire to live on mission in their everyday lives, whether in their homes, schools, or future careers.

We are so thankful for the opportunity to go and serve and to respond to Jesus's command to go found in Matthew 28. We are also so grateful for the kingdom work that was done in our hearts as a result.





## PCS ROBOTICS LEVELS UP

The PCS Robotics program wrapped up another impressive year marked by steady growth and standout achievements.

Our elementary and middle school team earned the 2nd place Champion's Award at the FIRST LEGO League (FLL) Louisville Regional Tournament—the event's second-highest honor. That recognition secured their spot at the Kentucky State FLL Championship at Northern Kentucky University in February. Competing against teams from across the state, they delivered a strong performance and placed 6th in robot performance.

At the high school level, the robotics team competed in league meets in Shelbyville, Murray, and Louisville. Their efforts paid off with a qualification for the Kentucky FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC) League Championship, where they received the Innovate Award—earning them a place at the FTC Kentucky State Championship at the University of Kentucky. There, the team turned in their best robot performance of the season and took home the prestigious 2nd place Think Award.

That success led to an invitation to the Run for Robots FIRST Premiere event, held at the Kentucky Horse Park at the end of May. At this event, both the elementary/middle and high school teams competed in head-to-head robot matches and participated in 25-minute judged interviews. Judged awards at FIRST competitions are highly competitive and widely regarded as the highest honors teams can earn.





## RECORD WINS, RISING STARS: A BREAKOUT YEAR FOR ATHLETICS

This school year has marked a season of growth, achievement, and renewed momentum for our athletic department.

Across all three seasons, our student-athletes, coaches, and families have contributed to a culture that emphasizes excellence, perseverance, and unity. The progress we've seen is not only reflected in wins and records, but also in the continued development of our programs and the opportunities we are creating for our students.

Our fall sports season set the tone early. The cross country program reached the state tournament, showcasing both discipline and competitive strength. On the soccer front, we celebrated meaningful expansion and success. The addition of an elementary soccer team and the launch of a girls middle school soccer program represent important steps in building a strong foundation for the future. At the high school level, our boys soccer team put together an impressive season, finishing just a few wins shy of breaking the school record for victories.

Meanwhile, our high school volleyball team made history by setting a new school record for wins in a single season - an accomplishment that reflects the hard work and commitment of both players and coaching staff.

The winter season continued that momentum. Our girl's basketball team delivered an outstanding 18–9 record, narrowly missing a new school record for wins. Their consistency and competitiveness were evident throughout the season. The boys basketball program has also shown significant improvement, totaling 24 wins over the past two seasons after managing just 8 wins in the two seasons prior. This turnaround highlights the dedication of our athletes and the steady progress being made within the program.

As we move through the spring season, our teams are continuing to compete at a high level. Tennis, track and field, baseball, and softball have all demonstrated strong performances and a commitment to excellence. While these seasons are still ongoing, the level of play and competitiveness across each program has been encouraging and reflects the overall direction of our athletic department.



Beyond team performance, this year has also been significant in strengthening the overall structure and sustainability of our programs. We successfully reintroduced summer camps for students in kindergarten through 8th grade, drawing over 120 participants. These camps are a vital part of building early interest, developing skills, and fostering a sense of connection to our athletic programs.

Additionally, we launched our first-ever athletic fundraising campaign, raising over \$20,000. This milestone will allow us to invest in much-needed resources, enhance our facilities, and continue to provide quality experiences for our student-athletes. It represents a major step forward in ensuring the long-term growth and success of our department.

Perhaps most importantly, this year has also seen several student-athletes take the next step in their journeys by signing to compete at the collegiate level. These accomplishments are a testament not only to their individual dedication but also to the support and development they have received within our programs.

Overall, this has been an exciting and impactful year. The combination of competitive success, program growth, and increased community support has positioned our athletic department for a bright future. We are proud of what has been accomplished and look forward to building on this momentum in the years ahead.

## A LEGACY OF FAITH, A FUTURE OF CULTURE CHANGERS FOR CHRIST

There's a quiet truth I've come to see more clearly this year at PCS: generosity is rarely about transactions; it's about attachment. Not to things, but to people, to mission, and to the kind of legacy that outlives us.

At Portland Christian School, we're seeing that kind of generosity in tangible ways. This fiscal year, more than 230 individuals and families have participated in giving, an 83.9% retention rate that speaks to something deeper than obligation. It reflects belief. Commitment. A shared conviction that what happens here matters.

Since arriving two years ago, I have had the privilege of sitting with a donor whose story deeply impacted me. He shared stories of PCS, summers with grandparents, and faith in Jesus. I was surprised to learn he never attended PCS. But as a young child, his mother did not just work here; she invested her life here as a teacher. What she poured into students shaped how he sees the world, how he gives, and how he chooses to steward what he's been entrusted with.

Numerous conversations led to a significant estate gift after his passing in late 2025.

He said something simple but profound: "This place impacted my family more than I realized at the time. I want that to continue long after I'm gone."

That's the essence of planned giving. It's not just about what we leave behind; it's about what continues forward. In many ways, giving in death becomes one of the clearest expressions of what we valued in life.

We are seeing momentum build in this area. More families are exploring planned gifts, stock contributions, and other strategic ways to invest in the long-term sustainability of Portland Christian School. These are not just financial decisions; they are declarations of belief in the mission.

And that mission is growing.

Year-over-year, giving has increased significantly. Even when accounting for extraordinary gifts, the underlying growth is real. More new donors. More re-engaged supporters. A strong, committed base that continues to step forward. But the opportunity in front of us is just as important.

A large portion of our community is giving faithfully at accessible levels. That matters. It's the foundation. And it creates a pathway, one where generosity can grow over time, where deeper engagement leads to greater impact. Because here's the truth we all feel, even if we don't always articulate it: **Generosity doesn't reduce what you have, it multiplies what you value.**

Every time we open our hands, we experience a kind of freedom and joy that no return statement can replicate. Not because the numbers don't matter, but because they're not the point. The point is impact. It's the student who can access a Portland Christian education because someone chose to give. It's the teacher who is equipped and encouraged to invest deeply in the lives of their students. It's the formation of young men and women who will go on to influence their communities for Christ.

That's the return.

As we look ahead, one of our priorities is increasing tuition accessibility, ensuring new and existing families who desire a Christ-centered education can experience it. Generosity plays a direct role in that. Every gift, whether immediate or planned, creates space for another student to belong, to grow, and to be shaped.

If you've already been part of this story, thank you. Your investment is making a measurable difference. If you're considering how you might engage more deeply, whether through an annual gift, a stock contribution, or a legacy plan, I would welcome the opportunity to connect. These conversations are not about pressure; they're about alignment. About helping you steward your resources in a way that reflects what matters most to you.

And if you've never taken that step, this is an invitation. Not just to give, but to attach your story to something enduring. Because what we hold onto eventually fades. But what we invest in others...that multiplies.

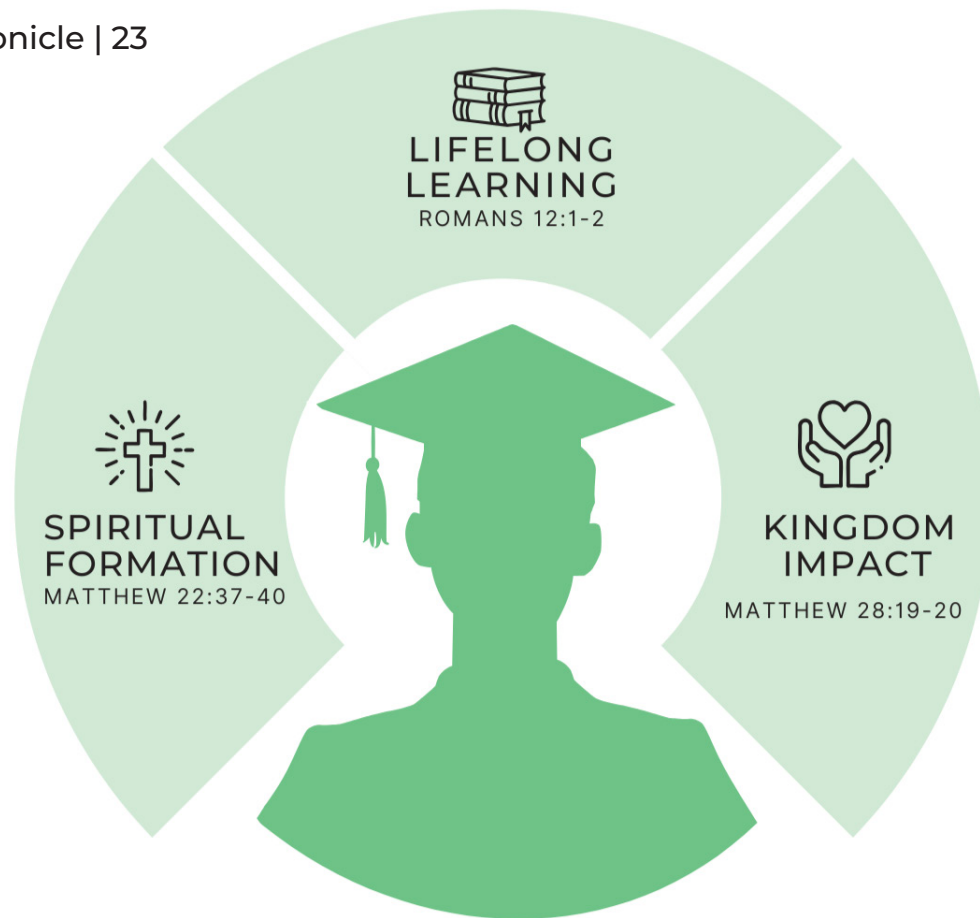

We also celebrate the growth and continued success of our robotics program. PCS robotics continues to expand in participation, skill, creativity, and competitiveness. It has been exciting to see students collaborate, problem-solve, and apply critical thinking in ways that prepare them for future opportunities in technology, engineering, and innovation.

This year was also marked by significant spiritual growth and development among our students. Our off-site retreat, Ignite, offered students a powerful opportunity to step away from daily routines, worship together, hear God's Word, and build deeper community. In addition, our Missions Week initiative sent 94 students to serve in Poland, the Dominican Republic, New York City, and Appalachia. Through these experiences, lives were changed and deeply impacted - both those being served and our students who went to serve.

We also rejoice that students received Christ and were baptized at school this year. These moments remind us that the heart of PCS is not only academic preparation, but also spiritual formation and discipleship.

In athletics, we have much to celebrate as well. We are excited that school records for wins were broken in fall sports, and we are also encouraged to see individual athletes setting new school records in spring sports. Our student-athletes and coaches have represented PCS with dedication, perseverance, and school spirit.

We are also encouraged by the launch of our student counseling program this year and excited about the planned expansion next school year. Supporting the emotional, social, and spiritual well-being of our students remains a priority.

Looking ahead to the next school year, we are anticipating record enrollment once again. We are excited to welcome our new Upper Principal, Daniel Head, and several new faculty members. Finally, we are thrilled to share the great news that we will bring a school ensemble/choir back to PCS next school year for the first time since before COVID! This is a meaningful step forward for the arts and for our school community.

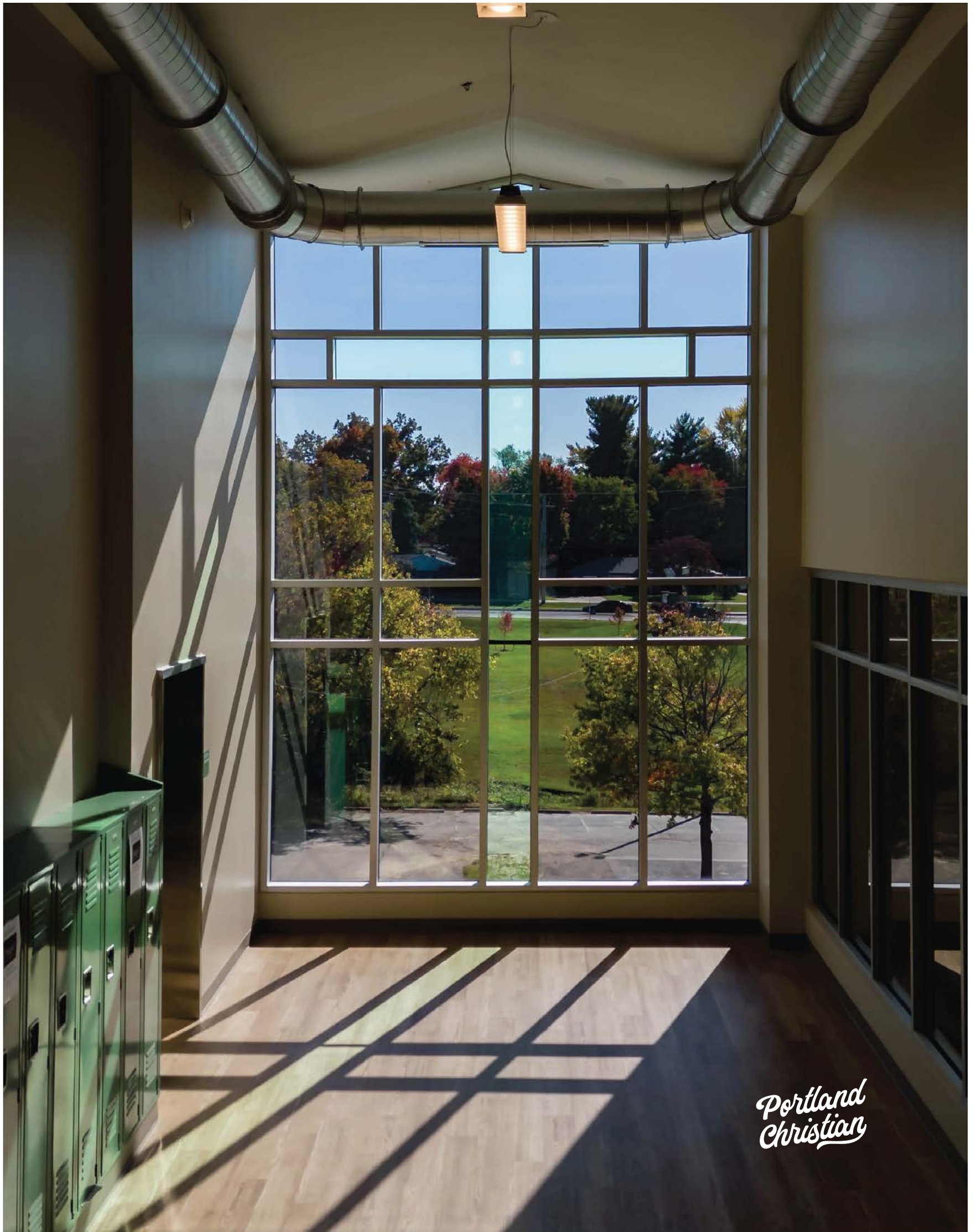
