## Independent Accreditation of Consumer Apps

The CARIN Code of Conduct for Consumer-Facing Applications (CARIN-CFA) Accreditation Program enables patient and data holder confidence in app developers' ability to safeguard sensitive consumer health data. DirectTrust's CARIN-CFA Accreditation Program was established in collaboration with the CARIN Alliance.

The [CARIN Code of Conduct](#) was first developed to provide expectations for data handling practices of digital health applications which may not be subject to HIPAA. The Code supports the goals of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) rulemaking, including the Interoperability and Patient Access Rule, which aims to accelerate the ability of individuals to access personal health information via applications that leverage HL7® FHIR® application programming interfaces (APIs). The Code represents the consensus view of a group of over 60 multi-sector stakeholder participants and references internationally recognized standards and best practices.

As consumer-directed exchange expands, so do expectations around privacy, data use transparency, and accountability, particularly for entities not covered by HIPAA.

DirectTrust's CARIN-CFA Accreditation Program transforms the voluntary Code into a structured, independent accreditation conducted by subject matter expert Assessors.

By achieving accreditation, organizations demonstrate validated implementation of the Code's principles through third-party review.

### Independent Assessment

- Validation discussions confirm that policies are implemented in practice.
- Assessors review content as subject matter experts and give consultative feedback as part of the accreditation process.

### Evaluation areas include:

- Privacy and security safeguards
- Transparency and consumer notice practices
- Data use and secondary sharing controls
- Consumer rights and revocation mechanisms
- Organizational governance and accountability
