Surprised by Christmas — Advent Daily Practices (Nov 30–Jan 1)

Series Introduction: The Season of Surprising Grace

Advent is a season of waiting — four weeks that prepare our hearts for Christmas and remind us that **God still surprises the world**. The word **Advent** means "arrival." We pause to remember Jesus' first coming in humility and to look forward to His return as King.

This year's theme, "Surprised by Christmas," invites us to rediscover the wonder of God's ways. The first Christmas caught everyone off guard. No royal parade. No palace. No headlines. Just a quiet stable in Bethlehem where heaven met earth in the most unexpected way.

Maybe you've been surprised by life this year — its twists, turns, or delays. Advent whispers that **God's surprises are always good ones**. His plans may not unfold the way we expect, but they always lead to redemption.

Parent Guide (use nightly in 5–10 minutes)

This guide is for everyone. Even adults with no children in the home can do the Family Activities! Below is a simple structure for engaging each day.

- 1. **Light a candle** (add one each week to mark our longing for Jesus, the Light of the World).
- 2. Read Scripture aloud.
- 3. **Devotional Thought** (1–3 short paragraphs).
- 4. **Pray + Listen (60–90 seconds of quiet).** Coach kids to close eyes, breathe, and ask: "Jesus, what do You want me to know or do?"
- 5. **Family/Children's Activity Surprise Nativity:** add one item that fits the day's Scripture. You may want to gather the simple supplied necessary to add to the nativity daily.
- 6. **Share Together:** one quick question to answer around the room.
- 7. **Sing a carol** (suggestions provided each week).

WEEK 1 — Surprised by Salvation

Dates: Nov 30-Dec 6

Hymns for the week: Joy to the World • Mary Did You Know? • O Little Town of Bethlehem

Gather These Supplies (for the week's build): small box or paper "stable," straw/tissue paper, small slips of paper + pen, strip of cloth (for "swaddling"), paper + string to make a tiny **scroll**, simple **Mary, Joseph, and Baby Jesus** figures or paper cutouts, 1 tea-light/candle, tape.

Scripture: Luke 2:10–12
Devotional Thought:

For **400** years God seemed silent, yet heaven hadn't forgotten. Then—angels in a field, a manger in the dark, "a Savior... the Messiah, the Lord." Salvation arrived not with armies but with presence. God still loves to start His greatest work in places we'd never expect and in hearts that feel very ordinary.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, where are You quietly at work in **my** life right now? Surprise me with Your peace in **one specific** place I'm worried about."

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #1):

Set out an empty stable/box. Light one candle. "We're waiting."

Share Together: Where do you most want to notice Jesus this week?

Dec 1 — Day 2: The Need We Didn't Expect

Scripture: Romans 3:23-24

Devotional Thought:

People hoped Messiah would fix what was wrong **around** them—Rome, politics, pressure. Jesus came to heal what was wrong **within** us. The Bible names it **sin**—the bent that pulls us from God and from each other. Salvation is not self-improvement; it's **rescue** and **new birth** by grace.

Pray + Listen:

"Lord, I'm tired of trying to fix (name the place you struggle) on my own. What are You inviting me to surrender so I can receive Your grace?"

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #2):

Place the **manger with straw/cloth** inside the stable. Each person tucks a slip of paper with a worry or mistake under the straw. Pray, "Jesus, we need Your forgiveness and help."

Share Together: What's one way we can show grace to each other today?

Dec 2 — Day 3: A Savior for Everyone

Scripture: Luke 2:30–32 Devotional Thought:

Simeon called Jesus "a light for revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of Your people Israel." From the start, salvation's **scope** was global. The manger is God's open door to **every** tribe, tongue, and story—no outsiders.

Pray + Listen:

"Father, who around **me** feels far from You—at school, work, or in my neighborhood? Show me one name and one way to love them this week."

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #3):

Add a small **paper globe** or **people-chain** beside the stable. Pray for the name God brought to mind and for a nation you want to bless.

Share Together: How can our family welcome someone who may feel left out?

Dec 3 — Day 4: The Way of Salvation

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 5:21

Devotional Thought:

The cradle and the cross tell one story. **"He who knew no sin became sin for us."** Jesus didn't just bring advice; He **became** our rescue. He took our place so we could receive His righteousness. We don't climb to God—**God came down**.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, what shame or self-reliance am I carrying? I place (name it) in Your hands. What truth do You want me to receive instead?"

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #4):

Lay a **swaddling cloth** in the manger. Say, "He was wrapped for us." Whisper one sentence of thanks to Jesus. **Share Together:** Where have you seen Jesus forgive or restore something in your life?

Dec 4 — Day 5: Heaven Wasn't Surprised

Scripture: *Galatians 4:4–5*

Devotional Thought:

From Eden's first promise to Bethlehem's cry, heaven moved history toward "the set time." God is never late, never scrambling. If the world's surprise was loud, heaven's confidence was louder. He is writing a story bigger than our delays.

Pray + Listen:

"God, I'm waiting for You in (name a situation). What promise do You want me to hold while I wait?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #5):

Hang a tiny **scroll** (rolled paper, tied with string) near the stable—**God's promises**. Sing *Mary Did You Know?*. **Share Together:** Tell about a time God kept a promise to you.

Dec 5 — Day 6: The Gift We Could Never Earn

Scripture: Ephesians 2:8-9

Devotional Thought:

Salvation is **gift**, not a wage. We don't hustle for God's approval; we **receive** it in Christ. Grace disarms our striving and frees us to live grateful, generous lives.

Pray + Listen:

"Generous Father, what gift of grace do I need to unwrap today? Who are You prompting me to bless?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #6):

Add **Mary and Joseph**—people who said **yes** to God's gift. Each person shares one small "yes" for today. Light the candle and sing *O Little Town of Bethlehem*.

Share Together: What's one gift of grace we've seen in our family this week?

Dec 6 — Day 7: Surprised by Joy

Scripture: Luke 1:46–47
Devotional Thought:

Mary's song blooms in hardship. Joy is not denial of pain; it's the fruit of **God-with-us**. When salvation settles

in our hearts, joy rises.

Pray + Listen:

"Lord, where do You want to plant **Your joy** in me today—especially where life feels heavy?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #7):

Place **Baby Jesus** in the manger. Celebrate with a cheer or a cupcake. Sing *Joy to the World*.

Share Together: What brought you joy this week because Jesus was with you?

WEEK 2 — Surprised by the Impossible

Dates: Dec 7-13

Hymns for the week: Angels We Have Heard on High • O Come, O Come, Emmanuel • What Child Is This

Gather These Supplies: paper dove cutout, star stickers, 1-2 tea-lights/battery candles,

mini doorway/Bethlehem sign(paper/craft stick), shepherd figure, tiny paper tool (for Joseph),

small "YES" banner (paper + string), tape.

Dec 7 — Day 8: "How Can This Be?"

Scripture: *Luke 1:34–35* **Devotional Thought:**

Mary stands where faith meets mystery. Her question isn't defiance but wonder. God answers with

Himself: the Holy Spirit will come upon you. The impossible is not a puzzle for us to solve; it's an invitation to

trust the One who can do what we cannot.

Pray + Listen:

"Holy Spirit, here is my 'How can this be?' — (name it). What step of surrender are You asking of me?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #8):

Place a dove by the stable to symbolize the Spirit. Pray, "Come, Holy Spirit." Sing O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.

Share Together: What's one thing that feels impossible for you right now?

Dec 8 — Day 9: Nothing Is Too Hard for the Lord

Scripture: *Genesis 18:14* **Devotional Thought:**

Sarah laughed at God's timing; God turned her laughter into a lullaby. Our limits don't limit Him. He

makes new beginnings where we see dead ends.

Pray + Listen:

"God, revive hope in **(name a 'barren' place)**. Show me one practical way to cooperate with what You're doing."

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #9):

Stick stars over the stable—God's promise to Abraham. Pray, "Nothing is too hard for You."

Share Together: Tell a story when God surprised you with an answer.

Dec 9 — Day 10: God Can Do Anything

Scripture: Luke 1:37 Devotional Thought:

Angels declare it; creation proves it: **nothing is impossible with God**. He is not constrained by our past or our power. His strength is made perfect in weakness.

Pray + Listen:

"Mighty God, where am I relying on my strength? I give You (name it). What do You want to do in me today?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #10):

Add a **tea-light** by the manger. Turn off the room lights: "God's power brings light into dark places." Sing *Angels We Have Heard on High*.

Dec 10 — Day 11: God Can Be Anywhere

Scripture: Matthew 1:23
Devotional Thought:

Immanuel means there are no God-forsaken places. Stables, classrooms, break rooms, hospital rooms—He chooses the ordinary and the messy.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, meet me today in (name a specific place you'll be). What do You want me to notice with You there?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #11):

Make a small **Bethlehem sign/doorway** for the stable. Pray over each room in your home for Jesus' presence.

Dec 11 — Day 12: God Can Save Anyone

Scripture: *Luke 19:10* **Devotional Thought:**

From **shepherds** to **tax collectors**, Jesus seeks and saves. Grace erases the line between "good people" and "bad people"—leaving only **people Jesus loves**.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, who are You seeking through **me** this week? Put one name on my heart and show me how to join Your rescue."

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #12):

Add a **shepherd**. Pray by name for someone who needs Jesus' love. **Share Together:** What might loving that person this week look like?

Dec 12 — Day 13: God Can Use Anybody

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 1:27–29

Devotional Thought:

God delights to use the "foolish" and the "weak"—a young girl, a carpenter, shepherds, foreign wise men. He isn't impressed by résumés; He empowers availability.

Pray + Listen:

"Lord, I offer You my gifts **and** my limitations. What simple act of obedience are You asking of me today?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #13):

Make a tiny **paper tool** (hammer/saw) and place it by **Joseph**. Choose one family service act to do before the week ends.

Dec 13 — Day 14: 'Let It Be to Me'

Scripture: Luke 1:38
Devotional Thought:

Mary's surrender didn't remove risk; it reoriented her life around God's promise. **Faith steps are the doorway to the impossible.**

Pray + Listen:

"Father, I say yes to You in **(name one area)**. What courage or next step are You giving me?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #14):

Create a small YES banner and hang it by Mary. Pray, "We are Your servants."

Share Together: What "yes" are you offering Jesus this week?

WEEK 3 — Surprised by Love

Dates: Dec 14-20

Hymns for the week: Away in a Manger • Lowest of Lows • What Child is This • O Holy Night

Gather These Supplies: paper/ornament **hearts**, **donkey** figure, **wise men** + three tiny gift boxes, cotton balls/toy **sheep**, several **stable animals**, small **cross** (two craft sticks + string), paper for **footprints/path**, extra candles.

Dec 14 — Day 15: He's What?!

Scripture: 1 John 4:9–10 Devotional Thought:

The most surprising line in Scripture may be this: **"God is love."** Not mere affection—**self-giving action**. He sent His Son, took our place, and made us alive. The world expects performance; Christmas announces **belovedness**.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, show me where I'm unsure of Your love. What do You want me to hear from Your heart today?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #15):

Place a **heart** near the manger. Each person names one way Jesus shows love. Sing *Away in a Manger*. **Share Together:** Finish the sentence: "Because God loves me, I can...."

Dec 15 — Day 16: Love That Lasts

Scripture: Ephesians 3:17-19

Devotional Thought:

Human love can fade; **Christ's love is wider, longer, higher, deeper** than our failures. He doesn't give up; He abides. Let His settled affection steady your soul.

Pray + Listen:

"Lord, where do I doubt Your staying love—(name a relationship or fear)? Wrap me in Your faithful presence."

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #16):

Add the **donkey**—love that keeps going. Pray for travelers, missionaries, and those far from home.

Dec 16 — Day 17: Love That Reaches Everyone

Scripture: John 3:16
Devotional Thought:

God's love crosses every border. The **Magi** from far away knelt at a Jewish child's cradle. Love moves us toward those unlike us.

Pray + Listen:

"Father, who is my 'far away' today—someone different from me? Show me one step to bridge the gap." (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #17):

Add the **wise men's gifts** (three tiny boxes). Pray for another nation or neighbor from a different background. Sing *We Three Kings* or *What Child Is This*.

Dec 17 — Day 18: Love That Values Everyone

Scripture: *Luke 19:10* **Devotional Thought:**

Jesus called the overlooked by name. In His kingdom, no one is beyond reach and every soul is priceless. Our

churches and homes become places of welcome because His love found us first.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, who near me needs to know they matter? How can I show Your value to them?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #18):

Glue **cotton-ball sheep** near the shepherd. Make one **encouragement note** for someone who may feel left out.

Share Together: Who encouraged you this week? How did it feel?

Dec 18 — Day 19: Love That Stoops Low

Scripture: Philippians 2:6-8

Devotional Thought:

The manger was **God's chosen address**. The High King bent low, taking the form of a servant. True love kneels, shares power, bears burdens, and **gives crowns back to Jesus**.

Pray + Listen:

"Humble King, where are You asking me to lay down my 'crowns'—my rights, pride, or preferences—for someone's good?"

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #19):

Add **stable animals** around the manger. Do a hidden act of service for someone at home today.

Share Together: How did serving change your heart? Sing *Lowest of Lows*

Dec 19 — Day 20: Love That Changes Everything

Scripture: Romans 8:38-39

Devotional Thought:

At the manger we see the **trajectory** of love—toward a cross and an empty tomb. No power—sin, shame, or death—can separate us from Christ's love.

Pray + Listen:

"God, speak Your inseparable love over (name a place of pain or regret). What promise should I carry into it?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #20):

Place a small cross near the manger. Sing O Holy Night or How Deep the Father's Love for Us.

Dec 20 — Day 21: Where Love Leads

Scripture: Luke 2:11–12 Devotional Thought:

The angel's word ended with an action step: **"Go and see."** Loved people become **sent** people—toward worship, generosity, and reconciliation.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, where are You sending me/us to love today? Give us someone to bless and the courage to do it."

(Pause & listen.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #21):

Lay **paper footprints/path** leading to the manger. Do one simple act of generosity as a family today (deliver cookies, text encouragement, donate food).

Share Together: Where did love lead us? What happened? Sing *Use Me* by Josiah Queen

WEEK 4 — Surprised by Joy

Dates: Dec 21-25

Hymns for the week: Hark! The Herald Angels Sing • O Come O Come Emmanuel • Joy to the World Gather These Supplies: paper music notes/bells, paper crown, small "Immanuel—God With Us" tag, small mirror or shiny ornament, "Joy to the World" banner supplies (paper/markers/string), matches/tealights.

Dec 21 — Day 22: Experiencing Joy

Scripture: Luke 2:10 Devotional Thought:

The angel's first words cut through fear: "Do not be afraid... great joy." Joy is the surprised discovery that God is here and His rescue is for you. It blooms even when life is noisy or uncertain.

Pray + Listen:

"God, where am I afraid? Speak Your good news into **that** place and let Your joy rise in me." (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #22):

Hang paper music notes or bells above the scene. Ring a bell and shout, "Jesus is here!"

Share Together: What good news do you need to remember tonight?

Dec 22 — Day 23: God Is Above Us

Scripture: *Psalm 47:2* **Devotional Thought:**

Joy takes root when we remember who reigns. **The Lord Most High** rules over calendars and crises. Our lives are not at the mercy of chaos; they're held by a King.

Pray + Listen:

"King Jesus, I place (name your worry) under Your rule. What truth should I cling to today?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #23):

Add a crown above the stable. Pray, "You are our King." Sing Hark! The Herald Angels Sing.

Scripture: *Matthew 1:23* **Devotional Thought:**

From the first cry in Bethlehem to His Spirit with us now, Jesus is **Immanuel**. You are never unseen or alone. Joy grows where presence is practiced.

Pray + Listen:

"Immanuel, meet me in **this** moment. What comfort or courage do You want to give me tonight?" (Pause 1–2 min & listen.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #24):

Place an 'Immanuel—God With Us' tag near the Baby. Light all your candles; sit in quiet; sing O Come, O Come Emmanuel.

Share Together: Where did you notice God with you this week?

Dec 24 — Day 25: God Is For Us (Christmas Eve)

Scripture: Romans 8:31 **Devotional Thought:**

Bethlehem declares it; Calvary guarantees it: **God is for you.** He doesn't stand against you; He's moved heaven and earth to bring you home. That's the secret of unshakable joy.

Pray + Listen:

"Father, thank You that You are for **me**. What blessing or assignment are You giving me today?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #25 — Final Touch):

Set a small **mirror or shiny ornament** near the manger. Let each person look in and say, "God is for me in Jesus." Sing *Joy to the World!*

Share Together: How will we carry today's joy into the week?

Dec 25 — Day 26: Expectant Joy (Christmas Day)

Scripture: Revelation 21:3-4

Devotional Thought:

Christmas joy points ahead: the King who came will **come again**. On that day, "no more death, sorrow, or pain." Until then, we live as people of **resurrection hope**—praying, serving, and shining His light.

Personal Prayer + Listen:

"Lord, as this day closes, what new hope are You planting in **me/us** for the year ahead? Show us how to join Your work."

(Pause 1-2 min & listen.)

Family/Children's Activity — Surprise Nativity (Add #26 — Send):

Stretch a 'Joy to the World' banner across your completed scene. Pray blessings over each person by name and ask Jesus to make your home a light in the neighborhood.

Share Together: What surprised you most this Advent? Where do you sense Jesus leading us next?

Week 5 — Surprised into the New Year

For Parents

This week bridges *celebration* and *calling*. Keep your candles or lights near the nativity. Each night, relight one and say, "Jesus, You are still here."

Encourage every person to bring a journal or paper for listening prayer.

Gather These Supplies

Scissors, crayons or markers, glue/tape, blank paper for reflection, one envelope or small box labeled "God's Surprises 2026." Keep your completed nativity ready.

Dec 26 — Remembering the Story

Scripture: Luke 2:19

"Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart."

Devotional Thought:

After the visitors left, the stable grew quiet again. Mary held memories like treasures — angel songs, shepherd stories, God's promises whispered in the dark. Reflection is how joy sinks deep. Advent's surprises don't end; they turn into **remembrance** that shapes the year ahead.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, what do You want me to treasure from this Advent season? What are You inviting me to remember and keep?"

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family Activity — "Memory Stars":

Cut small paper stars. Write or draw one surprise or joy from December on each. Hang them above the nativity or tape them on a window.

Share Together: What memory or surprise do you want to carry into 2026?

Dec 27 — The God Who Still Saves

Scripture: Philippians 1:6

"He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion."

Devotional Thought:

Salvation is not a single moment; it's a lifelong rescue mission. The baby who saved us keeps forming us. God finishes what He starts — even when growth feels slow or hidden.

Pray + Listen:

"Savior, what work are You continuing in me right now? Show me one area You want to grow this year." (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family Activity — "New Year Scroll":

Unroll a long strip of paper. Across the top write 'God's Good Work in Us.' Each person draws or writes one area they want Jesus to grow in them this year. Roll it like a scroll and place near the nativity.

Share Together: What part of your life do you want Jesus to keep shaping?

Dec 28 — The God Who Makes the Impossible Possible

Scripture: Ephesians 3:20

"Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine..."

Devotional Thought:

Every year brings unknowns. Faith looks at what seems impossible and remembers Christmas — a virgin birth, angels singing, sinners redeemed. The God who spoke galaxies can still surprise us with "immeasurably more."

Pray + Listen:

"Lord, where am I afraid to hope? What impossible thing are You inviting me to pray for in 2026?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family Activity — "Hope Lights":

Light a candle or small flashlight for each family member. As each light shines, name a hope or dream for the new year.

Share Together: Where do you need God to do the impossible?

Dec 29 — The God Who Loves Us Still

Scripture: Romans 5:8

"While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Devotional Thought:

Love did not fade when the decorations came down. God's love is steady, daily, and personal. It meets us in ordinary routines — dishes, homework, commutes — just as He once met the world in a stable.

Pray + Listen:

"Father, how do You want me to experience and express Your love in this season?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family Activity — "Heart Chain":

Cut out paper hearts, connect them into a chain. On each heart, write one person or group you want to love better this year. Drape the chain around the nativity.

Share Together: Whom will you show love to this week?

Dec 30 — The God Who Brings Joy into Tomorrow

Scripture: Psalm 16:11

"You make known to me the path of life; You fill me with joy in Your presence."

Devotional Thought:

Joy is not optimism; it's orientation. It's choosing to face tomorrow with Jesus. As the calendar turns, we can face uncertainty with laughter and peace — because our Shepherd goes before us.

Pray + Listen:

"Jesus, what joy do You want to give me for the days ahead? Show me how to carry Your presence into the new year."

(Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family Activity — "Joy Jar":

Find a jar or box. Label it **'Surprised by Joy 2026.'** Throughout the year, place notes of answered prayers or surprises inside.

Share Together: What makes you excited about a new year with Jesus?

Dec 31 — The God Who Sends Us (New Year's Eve)

Scripture: Matthew 28:19–20

"Go and make disciples... and surely I am with you always."

Devotional Thought:

The shepherds went back glorifying God; the wise men went home by another route. Christmas always ends in **movement**. We carry light into the world that still waits.

Pray + Listen:

"Lord, where are You sending me/us in 2026? Who needs Your light through me?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family Activity — "Star Send-Out":

Take the paper stars from earlier. Choose one each to keep and one to give away (to a friend, teacher, neighbor) as a sign of hope.

Share Together: Who might need the light you carry?

Jan 1 — The God Who Makes All Things New

Scripture: Revelation 21:5

"Behold, I am making all things new."

Devotional Thought:

A new year begins — but it's still God's story. The same Jesus who surprised the world at Christmas is writing new chapters through you. Lift your eyes; He is already ahead of you.

Pray + Listen:

"Creator God, what new thing are You beginning in me this year? What do You want to grow, heal, or start?" (Pause & listen 60–90 seconds and then pray.)

Family Activity — "New Beginnings Scene":

Take down your nativity slowly. Before putting each piece away, thank God for what it represents — His presence, power, love, joy. Then gather the figures into a small box labeled 'God's Surprises 2026.' Pray, "Lord, surprise us again with Your goodness."
