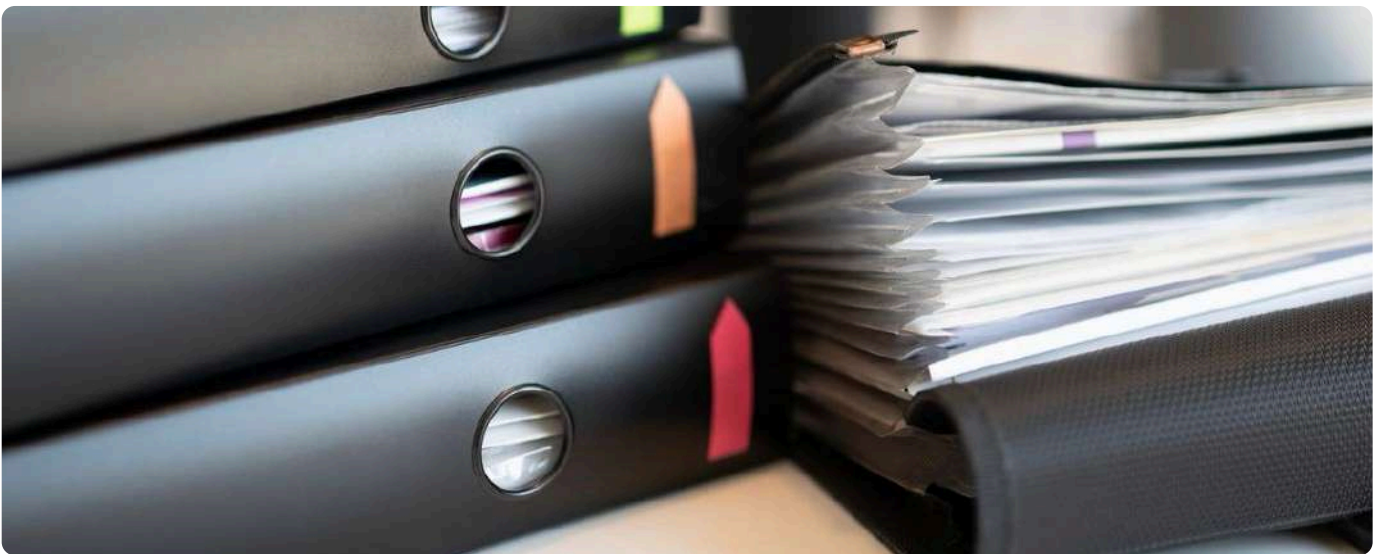

EXPANDING OUR REACH

Everything Policy began the year with significant growth in visibility. In January alone, our content generated over 1 million impressions on Google, meaning our content appeared in search results more than 1 million times. Each impression represents an opportunity for a student, educator, or community member to access a, facts-first, 360 degree perspective policy education.

Our social media presence continues to grow as well. Last month, our Instagram content reached over 5,000 unique accounts and generated almost 9,000 views on policy-focused videos. POLICY EDUCATION PROGRAM UPDATE

Our Policy Education Program continues to expand nationwide. More than 1,000 teachers have now signed up to access our classroom-ready lesson plans and policy briefs.

Recent releases focus on healthcare policy, including:

- The debate over Affordable Care Act subsidies
- Whether the federal government pays for healthcare for undocumented immigrants
- Why prescription drugs are so expensive

Each lesson is designed to support evidence-based discussion and critical thinking in the classroom.

We are also developing new initiatives to support students in states with “civic seal” programs, helping them complete project-based and service-learning graduation requirements. By aligning our resources with state-level civic pathways, we aim to make policy education directly applicable to students’ academic goals.
