Once a final design was chosen, it was manufactured by Babcock International. We were lucky enough to see it beginning to take shape just last week.

At the event, one of our pupils proudly read their poem, written during that original workshop, to everyone at the unveiling ceremony. Children in Need Mufti Day – next Friday






