



#### Rubbish, rubbish, everywhere...

This term, strong winds have driven lots of rubbish onto our school grounds once again. However, we remain dedicated to removing litter and ensuring it's disposed of properly. We have continued to collect litter during our weekly club, but have also resumed litter picking at playtime to tackle the problem.

We discovered that lots of recyclable waste is actually sent to landfill rather than being properly recycled. To address this in school, we decided to monitor our classroom bins to ensure the recyclables are not thrown in the 'normal' bin, and that the recycling bin isn't contaminated by non-recyclable rubbish.

#### Wildlife


In September, our school was fortunate enough to be visited by Prickles in a Pickle, which is a Devon-based hedgehog-rescue charity. We learnt all about these amazing creatures, but also about the fantastic work the charity do to rehabilitate (look after) poorly hedgehogs and release them back into gardens and hedgerows. Furthermore, our pond has continued to be a focus for us this term. To continue removing the duck weed from the surface, we have



skimmed the surface almost weekly. This has also been important over the autumn to make sure fallen leaves don't sink into the pond and rot. In the spring, we hope our efforts will be rewarded with an abundance of healthy wildlife.

#### Reduce, Reuse, Recycle...

From September, our school reception has contained a clothing rail where still-wearable uniform has been swapped and used again. This has saved an enormous amount of acrylic (a type of plastic that our


