Primary ear, nose, throat, head, or neck concern in patient's own words — laterality and duration...

3 PATIENT-REPORTED SYMPTOMS, REFERRAL CONTEXT & ENT HISTORY
3a SYMPTOM ONSET & COURSE

When symptoms began, progression, recurrence, chronicity...

3b ANATOMICAL LOCATION & LATERALITY

Ear, nose, sinus, throat, larynx, neck, thyroid, salivary gland, or oral cavity — R/L/bilateral...

3c EAR SYMPTOMS

Otalgia, hearing loss, tinnitus, otorrhea, aural fullness, vertigo, ear infections, noise exposure, trauma, prior surgery...

3d NASAL / SINUS SYMPTOMS

Nasal obstruction, rhinorrhea, epistaxis, facial pressure, anosmia, postnasal drip, sinus infections, allergies, prior sinus surgery...

3e THROAT / VOICE / SWALLOWING SYMPTOMS

Sore throat, dysphagia, odynophagia, hoarseness, globus, reflux, chronic cough, aspiration, or airway concerns...

3f HEAD & NECK SYMPTOMS

Neck mass, lymphadenopathy, thyroid symptoms, salivary gland swelling, oral lesions, weight loss, fevers, night sweats...

3g PRIOR EVALUATION & TREATMENT

Prior antibiotics, steroids, nasal sprays, hearing tests, imaging, endoscopy, biopsies, surgeries, or specialist evaluations...

3h PERTINENT NEGATIVES

Denial of sudden hearing loss, severe vertigo with neuro deficits, airway compromise, progressive dysphagia, hemoptysis, unexplained weight loss, persistent neck mass, fever, or severe facial swelling...
