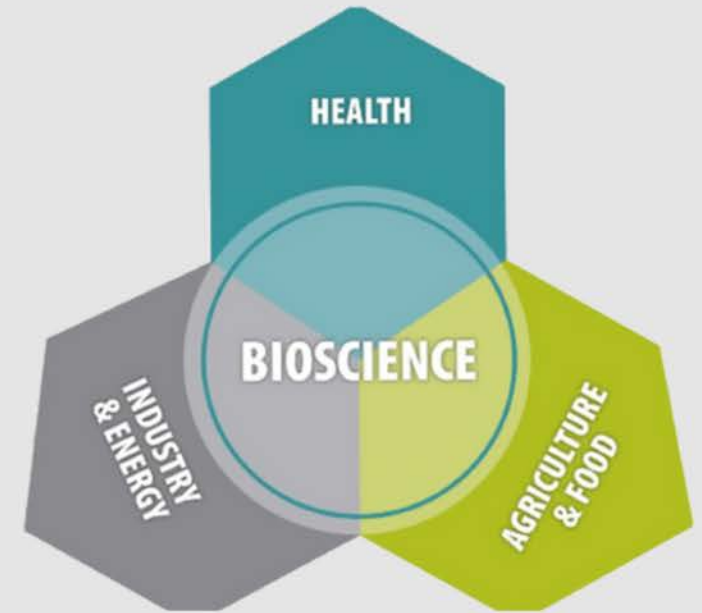


INDUSTRY EVOLUTION

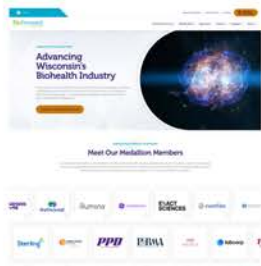

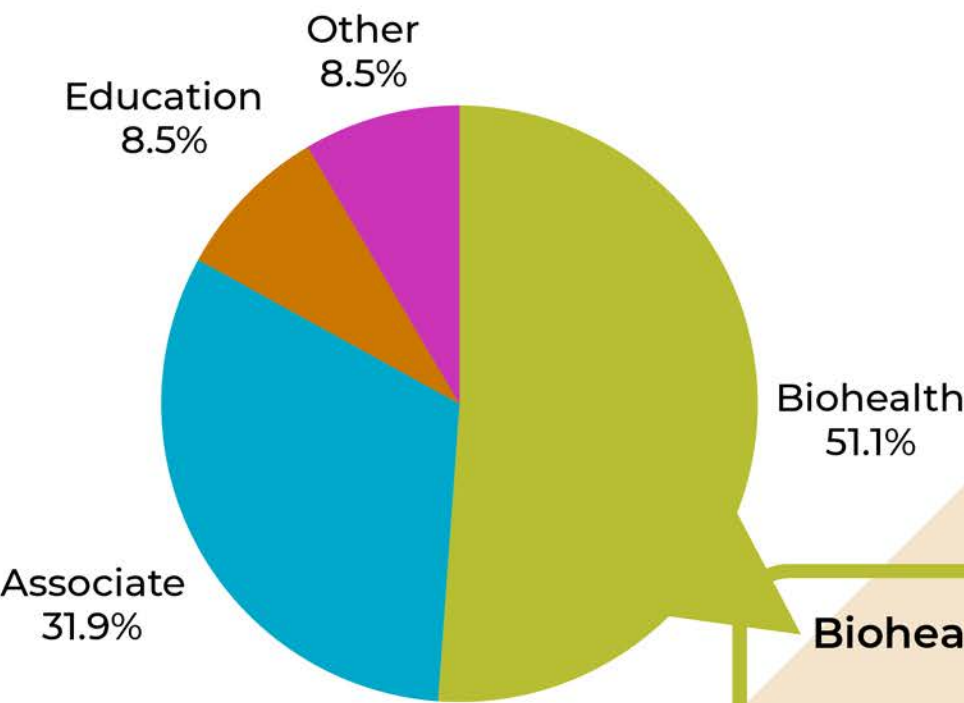

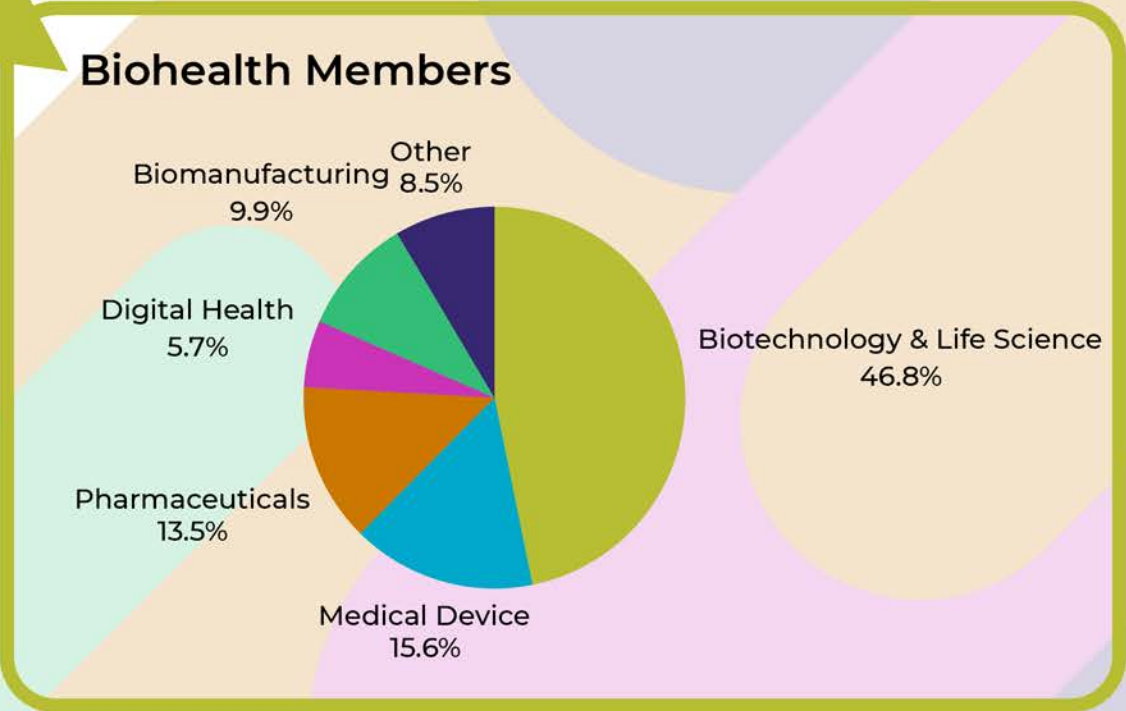

Universities of Wisconsin Budget Request: Investing \$855m for elevating our statewide universities through educational opportunities, talent development, and innovation investments.
