Hope and Mercy From Behind Bars: The Vital Role of Prison Chaplaincy

Prison chaplains play a vital role in the lives of incarcerated individuals, offering spiritual support, guidance, and a sense of hope in challenging circumstances. Their work is marked by profound joys, such as witnessing personal transformations, fostering a sense of community, and providing comfort during times of despair. However, they also face significant struggles, including navigating the complexities of the prison environment, addressing the diverse needs of inmates, and coping with the emotional toll of their ministry. Join one of our prison chaplains as they delve into the unique experiences of prison chaplaincy, highlighting the impactful and often unseen work they do to bring hope, mercy and accompaniment to those behind bars.

Our Jubilee Speaker, Azad, is from Syria and has worked for international NGOs in Iraq. He has been living in the UK since 2019 and joined the Justice and Peace Refugee Project in the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle since 2021. The project exemplifies compassion, leadership, and unwavering commitment to human dignity. Under Azad's guidance, the project supports between 400 and 500 asylum seekers each month, offering not only essential items like food, clothing, and household goods, but also a sense of community and hope. Join Azad to hear about his journey, the project and how it is having a positive impact for refugees living in our area.
