## STEPHEN PHILLIPS

### Obituary

PHILLIPS--Stephen, passed away on July 12, 2013 due to complications from pneumonia. Originally from Middleburg, Virginia, he attended St. Paul's School and the University of Virginia. Fluent in French, he acquired a graduate "certificat" from the Sorbonne while living in Paris. Growing up on a horse farm, he learn to ride at age five, continuing his passion for sports throughout his life. An accomplished skier, a life member of the Cresta Run in St. Moritz, and the brakeman of a four-man Olympic bobsled team. He even learned to drive a Formula II at Brands Hatch. He was associated with Dillon Read Investment Bank, where his father along with his Harvard roommate Clarence Dillon were among the founding partners. An opera aficionado, he enjoyed his association with the Metropolitan Opera Club. One highlight in his life was an arranged dinner with the great tenor Jussi Bjorling, a few years before Bjorling died. He was a member of the Racquet and Tennis Club, Shinnecock Hills Golf Club, The Southampton Bathing Corporation, The Meadow Club and The Bath and Tennis in Palm Beach. He was also a longtime member of The Clove Valley Rod and Gun Club where he spent many fall weekends hunting pheasants and ducks. A quiet philanthropist, he helped those who couldn't help themselves. With his wife Barbara, he established The Toy Lending Library at the Lighthouse as well as underwriting children's field trips. He will be remembered for his loyalty, decency, dry sense of humor and most importantly for his devotion to his family. He will be greatly missed by his wife Barbara, his son Andrew and his beloved Beagle Jasper.
