It's undoubtedly going to be a scintillating Season as St Moritz have organised a host of spectacular events to showcase the **150th Anniversary of Swiss Winter Tourism**, the brainchild of Kulm hotelier Johannes Badrutt.

The Secretary and I attended the Press launch in London and we anticipate a great deal of media interest in St Moritz and the Cresta Run this winter. The festivities kick off with the St Moritz City Race, a Bogner showcase and the Badrutt's Palace Christmas Tree Lighting on December 5/6th. St Moritz has even launched its own bespoke scent-Inviern.

As our contribution to these celebrations, the SMTC is organising an **International Match** on Friday **6th February 2015** between Great Britain, Switzerland and Rest of the World. The handicap event will be run from Top and Junction, and limited to 24 riders per team. The two courses will include riders on Americas, Traditional, Cutaway and Flat Tops, and by special invitation 3 lady participants. Scored in a similar way to the Ryder Cup, the winner of each match will gain 3 points for his team, second will score 2 points, third will receive one point (fallers and scratches will receive no points.)

The 30 Beginners, 16 SLs and 13 young Members will arrive soon after the Run opens- the Way of Life beckons for these fortunate young men.

As the snow has arrived in our favourite valley, and Opening Day is only four weeks away, the Season is nearly upon us. Natalino and Christian have been busy in the summer making minor repairs and marking out the course of the Run. Rolf Sachs, with help from the Larramans, has replaced a number of the Sunny Bar photos which had faded. Stephen Bartley is looking to update the Clubhouse photo collections and will also be displaying the remarkable 19th Century photographs of Captain Frederick Bligh in the corridor between the Sunny Bar and the Terrace (a set of four prints can be ordered for CHF 500). He has also designed our annual 2014-2015 Members' badge which honours Emil Thoma- Badrutt, the only Swiss to have a corner named in their memory and who did so much for the Cresta and St Moritz winter tourism in the 1920s.
