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1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Read all of the instructions before operating the device. Keep these instructions well for later use.

- Only use attachments/accessories specified or provided by the manufacturer (such as the exclusive supply adapter, battery etc.).
- Please refer to the information on the product enclosure for electrical and safety information before installing or operating the apparatus.
- To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose this apparatus to rain or moisture.
- The ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items, such as newspaper, table-cloths, curtains, etc.
- The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.
- **A** This mark indicates a risk of electric shock.
- To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the floor/wall in accordance with the installation instructions.
- Danger of explosion if the battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent types.

1.2 PRECAUTIONS

- When you are connecting cables, be sure that the device is disconnected from the mains supply voltage. Wait a few seconds after switching off the device before you move the device or disconnect any equipment.
- It is a necessity that you only use an approved extension and compatible wiring that is suitable for the electrical power consumption of the installed equipment. Please ensure that the electrical power supply corresponds with the voltage on the electrical identification plate at the back of the device.

1.8 USAGE OF EXTERNAL USB DEVICES

- It is recommended to use USB 2.0 storage devices. If your device is not compatible to USB 2.0 specifications, the playback with your receiver might not work properly.
- If you are going to use external USB HDD (Hard Disk Drive) please consider that the power specifications might exceed the supported output of your receiver (5 V/500 mA). If so, please connect your USB HDD to an according external power adapter.
- STRONG cannot guarantee compatibility with all types of USB storage devices.
- It is advised not to store important information on USB storage devices used with the receiver. Always make backups of data on your USB storage device before using it with this receiver. STRONG will not take responsibility for any loss of information or circumstances caused by loss of information.
- Please ensure that either the USB device is already formatted to NTFS or FAT32 or format the USB device via your receiver. Formatting requires entering the PIN code (default <1234>)
- STRONG cannot guarantee the playback of all files although extensions are listed, as it depends on file size, codec, bit rate and resolution.





2.4 INSTALLING THE BATTERIES


Open the cover on the remote control and insert 2x AAA type batteries into the compartment. Observe correct polarity of the batteries when inserting. A terminal diagram is shown inside the compartment.

- 1. Remove the cover.
- 2. Insert the batteries.
- 3. Place the cover.



2.5 USING THE REMOTE CONTROL AND THE IR EXTENDER.

Connect the external IR extender to the unit at the IR connector and place the sensor end somewhere convenient, where it can be "seen" by the Remote Control, for example on the TV front panels bezel. Use the provided double sided sticker.



To use the remote control, point it towards the external IR extender. The remote control supports a range of up to 5 meters distance to the receiver at an angle of up to approx. 30 degrees.

NOTE:

Managing the receiver will be limited or not possible if there are obstacles between the remote control sensor and the remote control. Direct sunlight or very bright light can reduce or disturb the reception of the remote control signals.

2in1 RCU programming procedure.


Hint for programming buttons: TV ♂, TV **VOL** + **VOL** -, TV **③**

- 1. Have the unit's RCU and the one from the TV lined up opposite of each other, e.g. on a table. The IR sensors should be pointing at each other, at about 3 4 cm distance.
- Press and hold the Blue TV button on the unit's RCU, a Red LED lights up flashing, hold Set until LED lights up steadily. Release TV button.
- 3. Press the button on the unit's RCU which you want to program shortly. (Example On/Off, Blue) The LED will start flashing slowly.
- 4. Now press on the TV its RCU the corresponding On/Off button shortly. The LED will start flashing quickly to confirm command has been taken.
- 5. To program the other programmable buttons, repeat steps 3 and 4.
- 6. To exit the procedure at the end of programming, or at any moment, press **OK** shortly. The Red LED switches off.




3.0 CONNECTION

3.1 CONNECTING TO A TERRESTRIAL ANTENNA



To receive broadcast signal, your terrestrial indoor or outdoor antenna must be connected to the RF IN connector of the receiver. Use a properly shielded antenna cable and suitable connectors. Use the provided SMA to IEC adapter to connect your antenna.


3.2 CONNECTING TO TV WITH HDMI EXTENDER CABLE OR DIRECTLY TO HDMI PORT



The TV set can be connected with the receiver using the provided HDMI extender cable. If enough spacing left between HDMI inputs and sufficient space is available to accommodate the various cables, then the receiver can also be inserted directly in to an HDMI port of the TV. Proceed with care, no physical tension should occur to the TV or receiver once inserted.



3.3 CONNECTING A USB STORAGE DEVICE



NOTE: We recommend the use of a hard disk drive USB 2.0 or higher for recording and play back of TV events.

Use the provided Y-cable (USB-A female at one end, USB-A male and USB-micro to each of the legs).

Connect the USB A plug to the USB port on your TV that is suitable for supplying power to external devices (5V and 0.9A) and connect the USB micro plug to the receiver.

The USB-A female can be used to connect an optional external HDD. The HDD will thus be powered by the TV, not by the receiver.

For proper functioning of Timeshift and recording functions, a fast USB device (such as a hard disk drive) is needed. Interrupted playback or a distorted picture during playback or Timeshift are indications for a low device speed. STRONG cannot guarantee proper functioning of recording and or Timeshift functions with all USB devices.

4.0 STARTING UP FOR THE FIRST TIME

If you use your receiver for the first time, the Welcome menu appears. Use ▲▼ to move the highlight to the setting you wish to change and use ◀▶ to change values. Start by selecting your On-Screen Language (OSD) using ◀▶. Once you have selected your *Region*, press ▼ to move the highlight to *Language*. Select your language using ◀▶. Other options are:

Antenna Power: Set to On if you use an active antenna. When set to On, a 5 Volt power will be present on the RF

IN connector of the receiver. Select Off for passive antennas.

FTA only: Select Yes to store only Free-To-Air channels, select No to store scrambled and free to air

channels. Note: Scrambled channels you cannot watch with this receiver.

Once all settings are made, move the highlight to OK and press **OK** to start scanning.

The receiver will now search for all available channels. Once scanning is finished, the receiver switches to viewing mode.

NOTE: Selecting the wrong country may result in a disorderly channel list, and missing of channels.

NOTE: In case the Welcome menu does not appear after switching on the receiver the first time, reset the receiver

to factory settings by pressing the MENU button and selecting Factory Setting in submenu Tools. (Default

PIN 1234)



5.0 QUICK GUIDE TO USING YOUR RECEIVER

We at STRONG understand that you can't wait to enjoy your new high definition digital terrestrial receiver. The following quick guide will make you familiar with the basic operation of this device. We do, however, advice you to read the full manual to get the best performance from your receiver.

To turn your receiver ON or to Standby, use the ${\color{dkgray} 0}$ button on the remote control.

Choose the desired channel with the ▲▼ buttons. Alternatively, you can digit the channel number with the 0~9 buttons on the remote control. Or press **OK** in viewing mode to display the channel list. The volume can be adjusted with the ◀▶ buttons.

Default Password is 1234.

6.0 OPERATION

Your new receiver is equipped with several features to make watching TV a true pleasure. This paragraph describes these features. Please also read chapter **7.0** to get familiar with the menu of your receiver.

6.1 CHANGING CHANNELS

Your new receiver is equipped with four ways to change channels.

- Via direct access using the 0~9 buttons.
- Via the channel list trough **OK** button.
- Via the ▲▼ keys.

6.1.1 DIRECT ACCESS VIA 0~9 BUTTONS

To gain direct access to a certain channel, simply input its number with the **0~9** keys on the remote control. Channel numbers can be up to four digits long. Entering a number with less than four digits is possible. Just wait a few seconds and your receiver will switch to the selected channel or press **OK** immediately after selecting the channel number.

6.1.2 CHANNEL LIST

Press **OK** in viewing mode to display the Channel List. Use ▲▼ in the Channel List to highlight your channel of choice and press **OK** once to select the highlighted channel.

.........

TIP:

Use **TV/R** button to toggle between the *TV List* and *Radio List*, press **FAV** for a list of available favourite lists, toggle between them, with \blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright .

6.1.3 USING THE ▲ ▼

- ▲ switches to the next channel.
- ▼ switches to the previous channel.

6.2 INFO BANNER

While watching TV you can press the **INFO** button any time to get information about the current channel and event*. Press **INFO** again for programme information and again for some technical details about the current channel. *Event information is displayed when available. Availability depends on broadcast.

6.3 AUDIO

Some channels support a choice of audio formats and/or languages. To select another audio stream, press **AUDIO** in viewing mode. A list with available audio streams will now be displayed. Use $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$ to select the desired stream and confirm with **OK**.

6.4 TELETEXT

Your receiver includes a fully featured Teletext. Some channels provide Teletext (Ceefax). To access Teletext, press the **TEXT** button in viewing mode and use the **0~9** buttons to input the number of the page you wish to see. The coloured buttons of the remote control allow you to jump to selected pages immediately, as indicated on the bottom of the teletext screen. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select one page up or down, use ◀► buttons to select subpages, if indicated at the bottom of the screen. Selecting Auto makes the pages rotate automatically. Press **EXIT** or **TEXT** to get back to viewing mode. Hint: Pressing OK repeatedly, makes the Teletext background translucent.



6.5 SUBTITLES

Some channels support a choice of subtitle languages. Press **SUB** in viewing mode to display a list of available subtitle languages. Select your subtitle of choice with ▲▼ and press **OK** to confirm. Press **EXIT** to leave without making changes.

6.6 TIMESHIFT

Timeshift allows you to pause live broadcasts and resume playback later. Press

I in viewing mode to activate this mode. On screen will appear a message Entering Timeshift and picture will pause. Press

to resume time-shifted playback. A time banner will show, to indicate the time offset from live TV. Press EXIT to remove the banner. Press

for Fast rewind/Fast forwards. Press to return to live TV.

NOTE:

Timeshift needs a connected USB storage device with sufficient free space and sufficient speed in order to work properly.

6.7 EPG (ELECTRONIC PROGRAMME GUIDE)

The Electronic Programme Guide is a very useful function that allows you to view event schedules and information and to mark programmes for recording. To access the EPG, press the EPG button in viewing mode. Use ▲▼ to select the desired channel and ◀▶ to select the desired event. Use EXIT to quit the detailed information screen. Press GREEN Timer to book a desired event automatically. It is possible to change the options manually. Make sure to have an HDD device connected, and select *Record* at the *Timer Service* option. Select SAVE and confirm with OK. Recordings will be stored in the Multimedia>PVR folder on your HDD drive.

Use **OK** to view detailed information about a programme. Use the **RED** Time button to change the hour or day of interest.

NOTE: When a USB device already is connected, the *Timer Service* will automatically be set to *Record*.

NOTE: A set Timers list and Edit options are available when in viewing mode, the **BLUE** is pressed.

NOTE: Availability of EPG data depends on broadcast.

6.8 INSTANT RECORDING

Your new receiver allows you to make an instant recording of the programme you are watching. Simply press • to start the recording.

During the recording a recording sign will be shown on the upper right side of your TV screen. To stop the recording, press **STOP**. Select Yes and press **OK** again to stop the recording.

*Please connect a USB storage device with sufficient free space before you start a recording.

Recordings will be stored in the Multimedia>PVR> folder on your HDD drive.

6.9 SLEEP

Press **SLEEP** repeatedly to select an automatic switch off time, at which the unit will go to standby. Default is **Off.**

7.0 MAIN MENU

The main menu gives you access to settings and multimedia functions. To access the main menu, press **MENU** in viewing mode. The main menu consists of the following sub menus: *Media Player, Edit Channel, Installation, System Setup* and *Tools*. Throughout the main menu, **MENU** or **EXIT** can be used to get back to the previous screen. Use ▲▼ ◆▶ and **OK** to select or to change settings. Use the button suggestions at the bottom of the screen available for certain functions. For some menu items a valid Password it is necessary to access the item. Default Password is 1234.

7.1 MEDIA PLAYER

NOTE:

This unit can be powered directly from a USB port on a TV. Not all TVs supply enough current to provide stable operation. Also, some TVs switch off their USB power in Standby mode, meaning, Recordings and Timers set will not be executed. Some USB HDD may not start-up when Voltage and Current are too low. In these cases, it is recommended to use an external USB power supply (not included) from a well known brand, with specifications 5Volt and at least a current of 1 Ampere supplied.



7.1.1 PVR AND TIMESHIFT *

*This user manual describes the full functionality including the recording function and may not be applicable for Germany and Italia.

PVR, Instant recording*

To directly record a programme, press the ● button to start the recording, a **REC** icon will show in the top-right corner of the screen. Press **STOP** and confirm to quit. During a recording it is possible to press the ▲▼ buttons or the **OK** and ▲▼ buttons to change to another channel on the same transponder only. It is not possible to use the **0~9** buttons. When you press **OK**, you can see a list with the channels in one transponder, which can be watched, while recording. The channel being recorded is identified by a **REC** icon in its program banner. Only one program at a time can be recorded. **Timeshift***

If you want to use the Timeshift function you only need to press II in viewing mode. To playback time shifted content, press ▶. During playback you can use the ◀ ▶ or II buttons. To quit the Timeshift mode, press STOP.

Press MENU and select *Media Player* The menu provides the options for playback of Recordings in *PVR*, *Video Music* and *Image*. The unit supports USB devices with FAT and FAT32 format. Make sure your USB device is formatted correctly.

NOTE:

STRONG cannot guarantee compatibility (operation and/or bus power) with all USB mass storage devices and assumes no responsibility for any loss of data that may occur when connected to this unit. With large amounts of data, it may take longer for the system to read the contents of a USB device. Some USB devices may not be properly recognized. Even when they are in a supported format, some files may not play or display depending on the content.

If there is no USB device plugged in, the options in the menu will be greyed-out. Only when a USB device is detected you can select between Recordings in *PVR*, *Video Music and Image*.

Select one of them, press **OK** to enter the file browser and select the file you want to play.

PVR* Shows a list of your recordings made by this unit.Video Supported video files in various formats and containers.

Music Supported file formats are MP3 and Flac**

Picture Supported file formats are JPG and BMP**

NOTE: When in the *Media Player*, you can toggle between the four options with the 1 *Switch* button.

7.1.2 PLAYBACK OF OWN RECORDINGS

After a recording has been made you will find it in the PVR section of the *Media player* in a list created on your external USB storage device.

Select with ▲▼ the recording you want to playback.

Inside the PVR section the following functions are supported:

OK Starts playback in full screen.

Stop playback, and return to the recordings list.

Pause the current playback. Press repeatedly to go in to step-by-step motion.

Start playback in the preview window, then **OK** to go full screen. Resume play from pause.

MENU or

EXIT Leave the PVR section.

YELLOW Marks a recording for deletion. When all recordings you want to delete are marked, press EXIT.

GREEN A recording can be locked from viewing by the password. Enter the password to set the *lock*. To unlock,

repeat the procedure with the GREEN button. A locked recording is signalled with a Lock icon. This the

password set in the *Parental Lock* menu.

RED Opens the keyboard for entering a new name for a selected recording. In the keyboard, press ▲▼ ◀▶ for

navigation, to enter a character press **OK**. After finishing your changes, select *OK* and press the **OK** button to

save the new name. If you want to discard your changes select Cancel and then press OK.

Video

Your receiver allows you to watch videos in the chosen folder. Choose a folder with video files for playing them. Not all video files can be played.

During playback you can use the playback control buttons, such as \blacksquare , $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright + OK$ (while progress banner on screen), \blacksquare , \blacktriangleleft , \blacktriangleright , \blacktriangleleft and \blacktriangleright . To close the banner, press INFO again or EXIT. Use the YELLOW button and select a chapter with $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$ you

want to jump to, then press **OK** to confirm. With the \blacktriangleleft buttons you can rewind or forward playback in x2, x4, x8, x16 and x24 speed. With the \blacktriangleleft buttons you can jump to the previous/next video file.

This subtitle function with the SUB button only works for movies which have embedded subtitles

During playback, press (repeatedly) **SUB** to select a sub track.

Press **EXIT** to remove the pop-up.

For external subtitle files in .srt format, select those with the **GREEN** button.

Other options presented in the media player window may be used as indicated.

Music

Select a music file (or file in a folder) and press **OK** to start playback.

During playback, following functions are available:

✓► Change the Audio volume
 OK Start playback of the selected file
 II To pause/resume playback
 ► To start or resume playback

To stop playback

To rewind or forward playback. Press and hold the button. Release the button when you have reached the

wanted position

Start playback of the previous/next file. Press repeatedly to step

EXIT Press EXIT once if you want to leave the current folder. To get back to the *Multi media* menu, press EXIT

repeatedly

MENU To go back to the main menu

Other options presented in the media player window may be used as indicated.

Image

Your receiver allows you to watch a slide show with all available photos in the chosen folder. Choose a folder with photo files for the slide show. It possible to start music playback in the *Music* section first and then select images for a slide show, while the music keeps on playing.

In the *Image* mode following functions are available:

To pause/resume slide show.

◆▶ During the slideshow, the orientation of the image can be rotated. **◆**To turn the photo counter clockwise. **▶**

To turn the photo clockwise.

► To continue slideshow after II or rotation of image.

EXIT To stop the slide show and return to the folder view.

EXIT To get back to the *Multimedia* menu. Press **EXIT** again if you want to leave the *Multimedia* menu.

MENU To go back to the *Multimedia* menu, to select another media type.

Use the coloured buttons to build a playlist with preferred images to show and to edit image list.

Other options presented in the media player window may be used as indicated.

7.2 EDIT CHANNEL

The procedures are equal for the TV Channel List and Radio Channel List.

NOTE: For successful editing of channel list, switch Off LCN function. See **ch.7.3**

Moving channels

Use ▲▼ to select a channel and press YELLOW to select it to be moved. Enter the position number you like to move the channel to and press OK again. The channel is now fixed on its new position. When all changes have been made, press EXIT. A saving banner will pop up.

Skipping channels

Channels marked with *Skip* will be skipped when zapping channels with the ▲▼ buttons. The channels will still be available from the channel list.

Use ▲▼ to select a channel and press **GREEN** to mark or unmark it for skipping. Channels set for skipping will be marked with the **SKIP** symbol. When all changes have been made, press **EXIT**. A Saving banner will pop up.

Locking channels

Locked channels can only be watched after entering the password. (DEFAULT password: 1234)



Press ▲▼ to select a channel and press **RED** to lock or unlock it. You are asked to enter the password. Locked channels will be marked with the **LOCK** symbol. Locking/unlocking multiple channels in one session is possible. When all changes have been made, press **EXIT**. A Saving banner will pop up.

The **BLUE** *Edit* button adds more options to the menu in a second window.

Options are: Sort, Edit and Delete.

Sort

Press the **RED** button, a pop-up window will show with several options. These are quick-sort options, choose as required. They overrule other sorting methods done on the first edit page.

Edit

Use ▲▼ to select a channel you wish to rename. A pop-up keyboard will show on screen. Use ◀▶ ▲▼ to select characters/ functions and enter them with **OK**. When you have finished editing, select **OK** to enter the changes. When all changes have been made, press **EXIT**.

Delete

Use ▲▼ to highlight a channel and press **BLUE** to mark it for deletion. When you have marked the channel you wish to delete, a confirmation banner will be displayed. Select *OK* to delete the marked channel or *EXIT* to cancel. Press **EXIT** after finishing.

NOTE: Deleted channels can only be retrieved if you do a frequency scan in the *Channel Search* menu again.

Adding channels to favourite lists

Channels from the channel list can be added to up to 8 different favourite groups. Press FAV in *Programme Edit* to access the function. Use ▲▼ to select a channel you wish to add to a favourite group. When the highlight is on the channel of your choice, press OK. A Favourite Type can be selected from the pop-up list. Use ▲▼ to select the favourite list you wish to add the channel to and press OK, press EXIT to finalize the process. Favourite channels will be marked with a heart symbol. When all changes have been made, press EXIT. A Saving banner will pop up. To de-select a channel from a Favourite list, repeat the above procedure, and press OK on the channel in the pop-up list to de-select.

Delete All channels

To delete all stored channels and favourite lists, select the *Delete All* function.

NOTE: To obtain channels again, you must search for channels again from the *Installation* menu.

7.3 INSTALLATION MENU

7.3.1 CHANNEL SEARCH

DVBT Channel Scan Select a particular channel to do a search on just one (known) frequency. Press **OK** to start the

scan. The signal quality bar might be useful to check if the frequency is indeed in use.

Scan Mode Options are: By Channel and By Frequency. Select the first if you know a certain channel number,

the latter if you only know the transmitter frequency.

Channel No. When at **Scan Mode** By Channel is chosen, select here the channel number. Select Search and

press **OK** to start searching on the selected channel.

NOTE: Use the Signal and Quality bars to check if there is any reception on the selected channel, or to optimize

your antenna alignment.

When at **Scan Mode** *By Frequency* is chosen, select at *Frequency* the frequency of the channel you wish to search for. *Bandwidth* is default set at 8 MHz (European standard), but can be changed if needed. Select *Search* and press **OK** to start searching on the selected channel.

NOTE: Use the Signal and Quality bars to check if there is any reception on the selected channel, or to optimize

your antenna alignment.



7.3.2 DVBT AUTO SCAN

This menu allows you to search for channels from all available frequencies for your selected region automatically. Be aware that all previous installed channels and favourite list(s) will be deleted. The new-found channels will be installed in the channel list and afterwards you can create a new favourite list if you like. Select Search and press **OK** to start the scan.

Fra Only

Free-to-Air channels are stored only when Yes is selected. Select No if you want to store

scrambled channels as well.

Select Search and press **OK** to start searching on the selected channel.

NOTE: Scrambled channels can not be watched with this receiver.

7.3.3 LCN (LOGICAL CHANNEL NUMBERING)

If LCN (Logical Channel Numbering) is activated and an LCN signal is provided by the broadcaster, channels will be stored in a broadcaster defined order. Set LCN to On to activate broadcaster defined channel numbering or Off to store channels in found order. This function only applies when a new channel search is performed.

NOTE: For successful editing of channel list switch Off LCN function.

7.3.4 ANTENNA POWER

Set to *On* if you use an active antenna. When set to *On*, 5 V will be present at the Antenna input connector of the receiver. Select *Off* for passive antennas.

NOTE: When in doubt, check the User Manual of your Antenna.

Country Select the correct country where this receiver is used. If failing to do so, may result in that channels appear

randomly in the channel list, instead of a more logical order.

7.4 SYSTEM SETUP

Press MENU and select System Setup. The menu provides options to adjust the system settings.

Press ▲▼ to select an option and press ▶ or **OK** to adjust the setting. Press **EXIT** several times to exit the menu. Some menu items can only be entered by entering the password. Default is **1234**.

7.4.1 LANGUAGE

In this menu you can adjust the Language, First Audio, Second Audio and Teletext preferences.

Select an option and press ◀▶ to adjust the setting. Press **EXIT** to exit the menu.

Language Select the preferred language for the On Screen Display.

First Audio Select the first preferred audio language for watching TV channels. If the language is not

available, the Second Audio language will be used.

Second Audio Select the second preferred audio language for watching TV channels. If the preferred Second

Audio language is also not available, another available language will be used.

Teletext Select the preferred Teletext letter character set.

7.4.2 TV SYSTEM

Press **MENU**, then select *TV System*. The menu provides options to adjust the video settings. Press ▲▼ to select an option and ◀▶ to adjust the setting. Press **EXIT** to exit the menu.

Video Resolution

If the video does not appear correctly, change the setting. These settings match the most common settings for HDMI. By Source. Automatically negotiate with TV for optimal setting.

7.4.3 ASPECT MODE

You can set the display format to available settings *Auto*, *16:9FS* (Fullscreen), *16:9LB* (Letterbox) *4:3PS*, (Pan&Scan) and *4:3LB* (Letterbox).

16:9FS For 16:9 TV screens. All programmes will fill the full screen. Content formatted in 4:3 will be

stretched.

4:3LB (Letterbox) For 4:3 TV screens. The unit will display all content in its original aspect ratio. Programmes

formatted in 16:9 will be presented with black bars on the top and bottom.

4:3PS (Pan&Scan) For 4:3 TV screens.16:9 content will have the extreme left and right portions cut off and

presented full screen.

16:9PB Combination of Pan&Scan and Letterbox

Digital Audio Out Select digital audio output mode.

LPCM (Pulse Code Modulation) Audio from any format will be converted to PCM Stereo format.

HDR Some High Definition (HD) may be transmitted in HDR format, displayed on a non HDR TV

colours might be distorted. Select Auto or SDR, depending on your TV.

7.4.4 DISPLAY SETTING

Brightness, Contrast, Saturation (Colour), Hue (Colour tone) and Sharpness can be adjusted. It would be the same as changing same settings on the TV. Better left on its default settings (50).

7.4.5 LOCAL TIME SETTING

Press MENU and select Local Time Setting The menu provides options to adjust the time and date settings.

Press ▲ ▼ to select an option and ◀ ▶ to adjust the setting. Press EXIT to exit the menu.

Region Select the region or country in which you live. This will set the time offset from GMT (UTC)

automatically.

GMT Usage Select By Region (the Region selection is active), User Define (You may select your GMT Offset

yourself) or Off (Time and Date setting are free to adapt.) However, the default By Region setting and the correct Region setting are usually sufficient. In case the Daylight Saving Time should not

be delivered by the broadcaster, you can adapt it here.

GMT Offset Select the correct Time Zone in which you live.

Summer Time You may adapt On or Off for Daylight Saving Time, should it not be delivered by the

broadcaster.

Date Enter the date when UTC Usage is set to Off.

Time Enter the time when UTC Usage is set to Off.

7.4.6 TIMER SETTING

In this menu you can setup the schedule for automatic switching to the defined channels at a particular date/time. Timers can be set directly from the EPG window or manually from this screen. Not set timers will be default *Off*. This menu can also be reached by a shortcut with the remote control, the **BLUE** button.

To enter a new timer manually, select an Off marked timer in the list and press OK.

Timer Mode A free timer is default Off. Select Once for a onetime event, select Daily for each day, same time

event, or Weekly for a weekly, same time recurring event.

Timer Service Select Channel to wake up the receiver to view the channel or Record for recording the channel.

When a USB device is already detected, default will be Record.

Wakeup Channel Select the channel for this event. Use **♦** or **OK** for a pull down list to select.

Wakeup Date Select the date for the event.
On Time Enter the time to start the event.

Duration Enter the length of the event. Default is 2 hours.

After all settings have been made, select *Save* to store the settings. Select *Cancel* to discard the settings.

To edit an already existing timer entry, select the entry in the list and press **OK**, then select and edit the item which you wish to change.

To delete an already existing timer entry, select the entry in the list and press **OK**, then select and set *Timer Mode* to *Off* and select *Save* to store. Exit the screens with **EXIT.**



7.4.7 PARENTAL LOCK

Set the age limit for a viewer, if the viewer is underage. This only functions if a broadcaster sends an age-signalling for the current programme. You can only enter the Parental Lock menu by entering your password. The default password 1234.

Menu Lock Select either On or Off. When On many menu items can only be accessed after entering the

password.

Rating Lock Select the age, for which above that age there is no restriction for watching.

New Password To change the default password from 1234 to another password like you wish, select this

option. Enter the new password.

Confirm Password Re-enter your new password to confirm. Make a note off the new password.

7.4.8 OSD SETTING

OSD means On Screen Display, all the graphics you will see on screen.

OSD Timeout Set the time (in seconds) the program banner will be shown on screen, when switching

channels.

OSD Transparency Set the amount of transparency the OSD (banners and menu) will have, superimposed on the

running program. 40% is the most transparent option.

7.4.9 FAVOURITE

Here you can rename the default names of the Favourite lists. For example: Movies or Music. Or even the names of users of the unit with their own dedicated channels. Select the list name you want to edit and press **OK**. Use the pop-up keyboard to change the name and select **BLUE** (OK) to confirm.

7.4.10 AUDIO DESCRIPTION SETTING

AD. For the visually impaired, a narrator can describe the actions happening on screen with a dedicated additional audio track, mixed with the original audio track. This service is provided by some broadcasters and is therefore subject to availability.

AD Service Select On if you wish to use the service by default on all channels which may carry an AD track.

AD Volume Offset Set the balance of volume the AD audio track will have, mixed with the original audio track.

7.4.11 PVR STORAGE INFORMATION

This item can only be accessed when a suitable USB device is connected.

Find technical details about your USB device, like *Total Size, Free Size, Record Size, TMS (Time Shift Size)* and *File System.* Use **YELLOW** (Format) button to format your device in FAT (FAT32).

YELLOW Format* A (new) USB device must have been formatted before the first use. The correct format for the receiver is FAT(32)

WARNING: The format function will delete all data and information from your USB device or selected partition. STRONG will not take any responsibility for damaged or lost data on the USB device.

An attention banner will now be displayed. Select **OK** to start formatting (or **EXIT** to cancel it). The format procedure will take some time, depending on the size of the used storage device. At the end of the process, the "Wait" pop-up will disappear. Press **EXIT** to exit the menu.

7.4.12 PVR SETTING

This item can only be accessed when a suitable USB device is connected.

Select the options for Timeshift and recording.

Timeshift Timeshift can be disabled here also if needed.

Timeshift to Record If Timeshift was activated, but you decide not to continue watching at this moment, then press

• to instant record the rest of the program. If this option is set to *On*, the already time shifted part of the program will be added upfront of the recording, to view later in one go.

7.4.13 AUDIO STANDBY

This feature is implemented for power saving. The receiver will turn to Standby automatically if no command from the remote is received for the selected time period. Default is 3 hours. It can also be turned *Off*.

NOTE: If there are timers running, the auto standby function will be disabled for the booked time.



7.5 TOOLS MENU

7.5.1 INFORMATION PAGE

Some technical information about the receiver is found here, like HW model and SW version. In case of service request, it is useful to have this info at hand.

7.5.2 FACTORY SETTING

Reset your receiver to the default factory settings.

Enter your password or the default password 1234, select Yes and press OK to confirm.

The receiver will reboot and start with the Welcome page.

WARNING: A factory reset will permanently delete all your personal settings, timers and stored channels. Please consider this before you perform a factory reset.

7.5.3 UPGRADE BY USB

Download the required update file for your receiver model from the support page on our website www.strong-eu.com or contact your local dealer.

Unzip the file on your computer, if necessary, and copy it to root folder of your USB storage device. The USB device must have been formatted in FAT32.

Connect the USB storage device to the USB port of the receiver. Press **MENU** and select *Tools*, then *Upgrade By USB* to update the software select at *Upgrade Mode* the option *Allcode*. At *Upgrade File* select the correct upgrade file, the file has the extension abs.

Then select *Start*, and press **OK** to initiate the upgrade process. An attention banner will now be displayed. Press **OK** to confirm *Yes* the update (or No to cancel it). The update process will take some time. After the update process has been completed the receiver will restart and then how the first channel in the TV list. You can now safely remove the USB device, and then remove update software from the device (at the PC), to prevent accidental updating again.

WARNING: NEVER power off the receiver or remove the USB device during the software update process. Doing so might cause irreparable damage to your receiver and will void your warranty.

NOTE: In certain instances it can be advised on the website to upgrade the unit with the *Maincode* option in stead of *Allcode*.

The HDCPkey and Bootback are for Strong internal use only.

7.5.4 STORE CHANNEL LIST TO USB

This item allows you to save the channel Data Base of your receiver to a USB-device. This very convenient feature enables you to save your personal settings like Channel-, Favourite- lists on an USB storage device and load them back to the receiver later.

Write to USB Dump Channel list

In the *Upgrade by USB* menu, select *Upgrade Mode*, then *Dump channel list* and *Start* and press **OK** to make a backup of the data base, including channels and user set data. An .udf file with the current time, date (day month, year), will be created on the USB device. When the database has been successfully stored, press EXIT to leave the menu.

Load from USB Update channel List

In the *Upgrade by USB* menu, select *Upgrade Mode,* then *Update channel list*. Select the correct file at *Upgrade File* you want to restore to.

Use ◀▶ for displaying the available database files (if any stored before). The .udf files are shown with their built time, date (year, month, day) Select the file you want to load and then select Start to load the file. When the database has been successfully loaded the receiver will reboot and switch automatically to the first stored channel.

Remove USB safely

Use this option to safely remove your USB device from the unit. It will prevent loss of data and prevent hardware damage to such a device. This procedure is comparable working with a personal computer.
