

Subject as aforesaid any words or expressions defined in the Act or any statutory modification thereof in force at the date on which these presents become binding on the Association shall, if not inconsistent with the subject or context, bear the same meanings in these presents.

2. The Association is established for the purposes expressed in a Memorandum of Association.

#### MEMBERS

3. The subscribers to the Memorandum of Association and such other persons as the Board shall admit to membership in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained shall be members of the Association. The term "members" shall comprehend all categories of membership as hereinafter provided.

4. Individual membership of the Association shall be open to individual persons aged 18 years and upwards who support the object of the Association and are admitted to membership by the Board in accordance with such rules relating to membership as shall be made by the Board from time to time.

5. Corporate membership of the Association shall be open to corporations, firms, organisations and associations which support the object of the Association and are admitted to membership by the Board in accordance with such rules relating to membership as shall be made by the Board from time to time. A corporate member shall be entitled to appoint a nominated representative to represent it in all proceedings of the Association and to exercise all voting and other rights of the corporate member he or she represents and a corporate member may by notice in writing to the Secretary of the Association confirm or revoke the appointment of the nominated representative at any time.

6. A member shall cease to be a member:-

- (i) If being an individual member he or she resigns by notice in writing to the Secretary
- (ii) If being a corporate member the corporate member is dissolved or ceases to function
- (iii) If the member is removed by ordinary resolution of the Association passed at a meeting at which notice showing the intention to propose a resolution in that behalf has been duly given and the member has been given an opportunity to address the meeting.

7. Subject as aforesaid a General Meeting may by ordinary resolution make rules from time to time in relation to membership and may at any time vary or annul any rules so made. All rules for the time being in force shall be binding on all members and shall have full effect accordingly.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS

8. The Association shall hold a General Meeting in every calendar year as its Annual General Meeting at such time and place as may be determined by the Board, and shall specify the meeting as such in the notices calling it, provided that every Annual General Meeting except the first shall be held not more than fifteen months after the holding of the last preceding Annual General Meeting, and that so long as the Association holds its first Annual General Meeting within eighteen months after its incorporation it need not hold it in the year of its incorporation or in the following year.
