I. Club Improvements

- A. We have made several substantial improvements to the house, including major repairs to our heating, electrical, and fire systems.
- B. The servery was refinished, and the dishwasher was repaired.
- C. To accommodate rising membership, we purchased additional seating for our dining rooms.
- D. New lighting was installed in the library and upstairs lounge area, creating a more inviting atmosphere for members and visitors.
- E. We underwent asbestos remediation, as well as a structural assessment.
- F. These improvements and evaluations help keep current Terrace members and staff safe and comfortable and ensure that the club can continue to prosper for many years to come.

II. Community & Campus Engagement

- A. Terrace continues to host DJs and live music acts from the campus community, serving as a gathering place for campus musicians and providing students with entertainment.

- B. We are launching several new community service initiatives, including partnerships with a local food pantry and with the organization Best Buddies.
- C. We launched new affinity groups and appointed affinity chairs to plan events and gatherings for students of many backgrounds.
- D. We partnered with Passionfruit Magazine, a queer magazine on campus, to host a zine-making event for the Princeton community. This collaboration brought new faces into the club and affirmed our commitment to making Terrace a safe and welcoming place for a wide variety of students.
- E. Terrace's engagement with the campus community has resulted in especially high interest in the club this year. Street Week saw record-high attendance at events, and we recently welcomed a full sophomore class, over 75% of whom designated Terrace as their first-choice club.

III. Sustainability

- A. We welcomed a new sustainability chair, with whom we are working to refine the efficacy of our current sustainability initiatives (clothing swaps, reusable tableware, composting) and develop new ones, with a focus on reducing waste from single-use plastics at large members' events like formals.
- B. New organizational systems, including shelving in our social closet and a full inventory list of supplies, are part of our efforts to avoid unnecessary repurchases and wastefulness.
- C. We plan to launch a partnership with Friends of Open Space, an organization focused on local land stewardship in the Princeton area.
