## THE MAIN THEME

Breakthrough is not just about finishing a wall—it is about experiencing revival. When faithful movement continues through breakdowns, breaking points, sabotage, and resistance, God brings forward momentum. True breakthrough shows up in miraculous completion, victory over opposition, restored unity, renewed devotion to God's Word, and expanding joy. What begins in ruins can end in revival when God's people keep moving forward and never give up

## VERSE OF THE WEEK

### **Nehemiah 8:10**

“Do not grieve, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.”

## WHAT NOT TO MISS

### **1. Breakthrough Brings Forward Momentum**

Breakthrough is when faithful obedience produces visible progress (Nehemiah 6:15).

### **2. Victory Over Opposition Is Evidence of God's Help**

Enemies lost confidence because they realized the work had been done “with the help of our God” (Nehemiah 6:16).

### **3. Unity Marks Revival**

The people gathered “as one” before the Water Gate (Nehemiah 7:73–8:1). Division gave way to unity.

### **4. Word and Wall Must Work Together**

Rebuilding walls without renewing commitment to God's Word leads to imbalance. Revival came when the Law was read, understood, and obeyed (Nehemiah 8).

### **5. Joy Is the Strength of Breakthrough**

The joy of the Lord fueled celebration, generosity, and renewed mission (Nehemiah 8:10, 12:43).

# LIFE APPLICATION

Ask yourself this week:

**Am I focused only on rebuilding my walls—or am I renewing my relationship with the Word?**

Breakthrough is sustained not by momentum alone but by devotion. Read the Word. Listen to the Word. Understand the Word. Obey the Word. When the Word goes to work, it builds the walls of your life from the inside out.

## DAILY DEVOTIONAL

### MONDAY — From Ruins to Completion

**Read:** Nehemiah 6:15

**Reflect:** God can finish what has been broken for years.

**Pray:** “Lord, help me stay faithful until the work is complete.”

### TUESDAY — God Gets the Glory

**Read:** Nehemiah 6:16

**Reflect:** Breakthrough points back to God’s power.

**Pray:** “Let my victories reflect Your help.”

### WEDNESDAY — Gathered as One

**Read:** Nehemiah 8:1

**Reflect:** Unity is a sign of spiritual health.

**Pray:** “Unite my heart with Your people.”

### THURSDAY — Commit to the Word

**Read:** Nehemiah 8:2–8

**Reflect:** Renewal begins with hearing and understanding Scripture.

**Pray:** “Deepen my hunger for Your Word.”

### FRIDAY — The Joy of the Lord

**Read:** Nehemiah 8:10, 12

**Reflect:** Joy strengthens us for continued mission.

**Pray:** “Fill me with Your joy so I can keep moving forward.”

## FACILITATOR TIPS

- Ask: *“What are the markers of breakthrough in your life?”*
  - Encourage reflection on unity and devotion to Scripture.
  - Emphasize joy as spiritual strength—not emotional hype.
  - Invite testimonies of forward momentum.
