- Here is a recap of our lesson today to help remind you of the different nouns to help with your written task today.

**A NOUN IS A NAMING WORD.**

**"noun" and "naming word" both begin with the letter "n".**



*If you remember this fact, it will make it easier for you to remember what a noun is.*



**A COMMON NOUN IS A "THING" THAT CAN BE TOUCHED.**

For example: house, tree, fish, pencil, book, person, chocolate bar, mouse, etc.

Can you list ten common nouns?  
(Try to make them different from the ones above)



**A PROPER NOUN IS THE NAME OF A PERSON OR A PLACE.**

Proper nouns need a capital letter at the start.

For example: London, Mr Bean, Germany, Scotland, Tower Bridge, Sophie



Can you list five proper nouns?  
(Try to make them different from the ones above)



**AN ABSTRACT NOUN IS THE NAME OF SOMETHING THAT CANNOT BE TOUCHED**

For example: love, happiness, bravery, trust.

Can you list five abstract nouns?  
(Try to make them different from the ones above)
