How To Enter:

All entries must be registered with a recognised Stud Society, beef or dual purpose, and a copy of your registration must accompany your entry forms.

To enter your livestock you are required to complete and submit **TWO FORMS**, as well as submit a copy of your registration certificate. For entry to be valid you will need:

1. Livestock Entry form and payment
2. When entering please use the breed class code i.e. T500 (tropical class 500)
3. Waiver, Release & Acknowledgement form
4. A copy of your Registration Certificate for each entry

On arrival at the showgrounds, you will be required to submit the following **PRIOR** to unloading cattle:

1. National Cattle Health Declaration (BJD) Download at: National Cattle Health Declaration - Queensland Ag Shows
2. Waybill (please note that you need your own copy for your return journey)

Entry Rules: See also **General Rules & Regulations within the Show schedule or online.**

1. All entries and payments to be received by **Sunday 24th May 2026**. Entry forms and Waivers supplied are available from www.malenyshowsociety.org.au
2. All cattle **MUST** be on the grounds no later than 7:00am on Friday and Saturday.
3. No exhibits will be permitted to the grounds unless thoroughly tractable. Stewards have discretionary powers to withdraw an exhibit felt to be not well controlled.
4. All bulls over 12 months must be led with a nose ring lead/grip. No exceptions.
5. All cattle exhibited at the show must either be polled or dehorned. Cattle with intact horns will not be eligible to enter or compete. Please contact the Beef Chief Steward prior to entering if the cattle you intend to exhibit have horns.
6. Cattle exhibited in Junior Handlers classes must also be entered in either led steer/heifer classes or relevant breed classes.
7. Determination of age will be based on age as at 1st May in the year of the show.
8. All winning exhibits must be led in the Grand Parade. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.
9. Prize-money will only be awarded after Grand Parade on each day.
10. There will be **NO** on-ground dipping facilities available.
11. **WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT:** Any exhibitor

intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the general public and is a requirement of the Electrical Safety Regulations 2005 Part 5, Division 5. The act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Maleny Showgrounds.

12. Feed and water containers will not be supplied.
13. No camping is permitted in the beef pavilion/shed under any circumstances. Camping is only allowed in the designated areas, which is not guaranteed to be undercover.

Any requests for exceptions to the listed rules and regulations must be submitted at the time of entry. Approval or refusal is entirely at the discretion of the Maleny Show Society and the Beef Chief Steward.

The Maleny Show Society conducts these competitions under the QCAS Inc. rules for the conduct of Agricultural Show Competitors. To view these rules, see the QCAS website: www.queenslandshows.com.au | NB. DPI rules and regulations apply.

Camping: Camping fees have been waived for exhibitors. No camping is permitted in the beef pavilion/shed under any circumstances. Camping is only allowed in the designated areas, which is not guaranteed to be undercover.

Cattle Bedding: \$5 bedding fee per-animal applies.

Show Entry Fees: All competitors & exhibitors must pay Gate Admission to enter the show. Admission tickets for entry to the show are available via our website and its recommended you purchase before you arrive, but they will also be available at the gate.

School teams: We wish to encourage all school teams to participate, so will offer 2 Adult Admission tickets and as many student tickets as needed for the show team, providing one family membership is purchased from the Maleny Show Society. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

FOR THE CONDUCT OF COMPETITIONS AT QCAS AFFILIATED QUEENSLAND AGRICULTURAL SHOWS.

Subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Society's Inc. (QCAS) and the Society relevant to this schedule, the following General Regulations shall apply. Where there is a conflict between these regulations and the regulations and rules of the local Agricultural Society, the rules of the Affiliated Agricultural Society prevail.

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS AND ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

- 1.1. All affiliated Queensland agricultural shows are conducted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc (QCAS), the constitution and rules of this Society, and any other special regulations which appear within the schedule.
- 1.2. Affiliated agricultural societies may, as required, supplement these regulations with their own special regulations ensuring they are consistent with QCAS regulations.
- 1.3. The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of QCAS and the society relevant to this schedule, in addition to any special regulations which appear in this schedule. Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to QCAS or the society relevant to this schedule.
- 1.4. No refunds will be made after close of entry.
- 1.5. Prize money must be collected on the days of the show. The society will not take responsibility for any Pavilion entries not collected by the specified dates in the entry pack and schedule.

2. JUDGING

- 2.1. Judging will be performed by a Judge or panel of Judges appointed by the Society.
- 2.2. In the event of the Judge deciding that the exhibits in any Class are not worthy of a prize, no prize will be awarded.
- 2.3. It is considered good ethics that if a Junior Judge or Associate Judge has been judging in his/her own right at any affiliated Agricultural Show, they are not eligible to enter the Young Judges competition at that Show, BUT they can still enter at another Show where they are not acting in a judging roll.
- 2.4. No Exhibitor or members of the Exhibitor's immediate family or employed by the Exhibitor shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision made by the Judge unless they first obtain permission from the Committee person in charge or Steward of the Section.

3. NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS

- 3.1. No person under disqualification recognised by the Society may exhibit or compete.
- 3.2. Entries for the upcoming Agricultural Show relevant to this schedule can be made as described for each section in the schedule. Entries submitted other than on the correct form or online will be returned to the Exhibitor and, unless all requirements are complied

with, and the forms returned to the Agricultural Society office by completion of business on the closing date, as shown in this Schedule, they will not be considered.

- 3.3. Notwithstanding the provisions of General Regulation 3.2 above, late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Section Chief Steward.
- 3.4. Entries are accepted subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Society, in addition to any Special Regulations, which appear in the Schedule.
- 3.5. Exhibitors whose entries have not been accepted shall be advised accordingly and entry fees refunded.
- 3.6. The exhibitor irrevocably consents to the Society publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the Internet.
- 3.7. Whilst all reasonable care is taken, the affiliated Agricultural Society cannot accept any responsibility for any losses and/or damage or injury to or by any livestock exhibits, equipment, vehicles or any other property or person whilst on the Show ground's.
- 3.8. Any persons causing a nuisance by loud comments, or the decision of the Judges or of otherwise unseemly behaviour will after being cautioned, be expelled from the show grounds, and in the case of exhibitors, be liable for disqualification.

4. BIOSECURITY

- 4.1. All QCAS affiliated agricultural societies have developed a comprehensive Agricultural Show Biosecurity Plan and all event organisers, competitors and spectators have a joint responsibility to ensure the successful implementation of a biosecurity plan.

5. PRIVACY STATEMENT

- 5.1. The information provided by exhibitors is used by QCAS and the society relevant to this schedule to organise, process and conduct competitions at the relevant agricultural show, sub chamber and state finals. By entering such competitions you consent to their personal information being used for this purpose including this information being made available to sponsors, breed associations, the media, the public, promotional purposes, archival purposes, published in publications and could be made available to other third parties for the purpose of promoting the Queensland agricultural show movement, or as otherwise required by law.

6. WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

- 6.1. All QCAS affiliated society's show ground's are designated workplaces within the meaning of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 2011 and exhibitors / competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or sub-contractors, comply with all requirements of the Act and QCAS holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work

during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the affiliated Agricultural Society's Show ground's.

- 6.2. Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, family, volunteers, other exhibitors, agricultural society staff, show visitors, children and any person foresee ably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.
- 6.3. Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.
- 6.4. Exhibits will only be held & handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the Exhibitor/Competitor.
- 6.5. Exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is strictly prohibited in pavilions or any other building or area defined by the Queensland Fire and Rescue Service.
- 6.6. Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Show ground's will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers / residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the general public AND is a requirement of the current Electrical Safety Regulations.
- 6.7. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must also be tested and tagged.
- 6.8. All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors / competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of noncompliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors/ competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at QCAS affiliated Shows.

7. DISCLAIMER

- 7.1. The information contained in the Competitions Schedule/Catalogue is gathered for the purpose of providing information to Exhibitors and show patrons. The information is a compilation of information provided by third parties and QCAS and affiliated Agricultural Society's does not warrant its accuracy and advises that any such information may be subject to change or amendment occurring at any time and thereby making the information incorrect. Subject to QCAS legal obligations and responsibilities, if you require confirmation of any information please contact the QCAS Office.

8. GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST)

- 8.1. The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise.
- 8.2. The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable.
- 8.3. Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST.

- 8.4. GST will not apply;
- 8.5. If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or
- 8.6. If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the Exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.
- 8.7. If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia.
- 8.8. GST will apply if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.
- 8.9. Where GST applies, the Society will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus 10% GST. The Society will issue a recipient created tax invoice.

9. PROTESTS

- 9.1. A protest against a Judge's Award must:-
- 9.2. be in writing addressed to the Secretary, and signed by the person lodging the protest;
- 9.3. be lodged by delivery to the Secretary's Office within twenty-four hours of the making of the Award;
- 9.4. give the name and address of the person lodging the protest, and where two or more persons join in the protest, state which one of those persons is authorised to receive correspondence or notices on behalf of all;
- 9.5. set out in reasonable detail particulars of the matter complained of including but not necessarily limited to the number of the Class and the Award protested against;
- 9.6. be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.

10. PENALTIES

- 10.1. If the Disciplinary Committee considers that there has been a breach of the rules, By-laws or regulations of the Society, it may impose such a penalty as it considers to be appropriate, including without limitation:
 - 10.1.1. a reprimand;
 - 10.1.2. a monetary fine (payable at such time/s as the Disciplinary Committee may determine);
 - 10.1.3. withdrawal or withholding of any award or ribbon;
 - 10.1.4. disqualification in respect of any class;
 - 10.1.5. expulsion from the Show ground;
 - 10.1.6. where the person concerned is a member, a suspension or termination of that membership;
 - 10.1.7. a ban;
 - 10.1.8. exclusion;
 - 10.1.9. prohibiting a Person from exhibiting or competing at the current Show or at any future Show ;
 - 10.1.10. a direction that an Exhibit be removed from the Show ground;
 - 10.1.11. any other mandatory requirement; and
 - 10.1.12. any other penalty provided for in other regulations of the Society.
- 10.2. There shall be no appeal from any decision of the Disciplinary Committee.
- 10.3. The Association may publish to:
 - 10.3.1. all Agricultural Societies in Queensland;

- 10.3.2. the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies
- 10.3.3. the relevant Breed Societies;
- 10.3.4. the body with which the exhibit is registered, or is eligible for registration;
- 10.3.5. the result of any proceedings before the Disciplinary
- 10.4. Committee in which a person has been found guilty of a breach of any Rule, By-Law or Regulation.
- 10.5. The Society shall have no liability to any person in respect of any publication referred to above
- 10.6. No person shall have any claim against the Society or against any Committee member, employee, volunteer or agent of the Society in respect of any act, matter or thing done in good faith during or in connection with the proceedings before the Disciplinary Committee.
