When and where is camp?

How much does camp cost?

For Middle School: The early bird rate is \$399 per student, and the late rate is \$439 per student.

For High School: The early bird rate is \$499 per student, and the late rate is \$539 per student.

The cost includes:

- Lodging

- Meals

- Transportation

- All activities

What are the arrival/departure details?

For Middle School:

- Check-in opens at 8:00am at our Naperville location on June 13th. Buses depart at 9:00am.

- On June 16th we will leave camp at 10:00am to arrive at the Naperville location around 1:30pm.

For High School:

- Check-in opens at 8:00am at our Naperville location on June 16th. Buses depart at 9:00am.

- On June 20th we will leave camp at 10:00am to arrive at the Naperville location around 1:30pm.

We will be traveling to/from camp on coach buses

What if my student has medical needs, allergies, or medications?

We want every student to have a safe and successful camp experience. During registration, parents will be able to provide: medical information, allergies, medications, dietary restrictions, and emergency contact information.

If your student has specific medical or behavioral needs you would like to discuss personally, please reach out to your StuCo Director.



Can students bring phones?

Our goal is for students to fully engage with camp, relationships, and what God may want to do in their lives during the week.

Students may bring phones, but we strongly encourage limited use throughout camp. We ask students to put phones away for sessions, small groups, and meals.

We hope for students is to:

- Stay present
- Avoid isolating themselves with devices
- Use phones respectfully

Students are welcome to use their phones during free time to connect with family or capture memories.

What is our dress code?

Camp is full of activities, worship, and community! Students should dress comfortably and modestly, to ensure they are fully able to engage in all the fun of camp.

Please pack clothes that cover the basics-- no crop tops, muscle tanks/cut up shirts, short shorts, clothing with inappropriate language or drug references, etc. For water activities we ask girls wear one pieces (or a dark t-shirt covering a two piece) and that boys wear shorts with an inseam of at least 5". If you're unsure, ask your StuCo Director!

We reserve the right to address clothing concerns that do not align with our dress code.

What should my student pack?

- Comfortable clothes
- Athletic clothes/shoes
- Toiletries
- Bedding or sleeping bag for a twin mattress
- Bath towel and beach towel
- Swimsuit (one piece for girls, 5" inseam shorts or longer for boys)
- Bible
- Notebook
- Pen
- Water bottle
- Sunscreen/bug spray
- Any necessary medications in their original container with instructions
- OPTIONAL: money for Canteen, snacks, digital camera, spirit wear, neon for Glow Night.

We recommend labeling important items in case they are misplaced.
