Rules:

1. Exhibitors are required to be current members of the Woodstock Agricultural Society. The yearly membership is \$10.00 and is available for purchase at the time of entry. Membership is not limited to Oxford County residents.
2. No membership fees are required for Youth exhibitors (under 18) in any class; however they must register to exhibit.
3. Registrations must be completed before entering your exhibits. Entry Forms and Entry Tags are available at the Fair Office Mon – Thurs from 9:30 am – 4:30 pm affording you the convenience of writing out your tags in advance. You may choose to register your entries online at <https://www.assistexpo.ca/inscriptions+registrations>
4. Judging will commence at 10:30 a.m. sharp on Thursday August 20th.
No late entries accepted
5. All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor except Class 23 Artistic Design where flowers and plant material may be secured from any source.
6. More than one person may exhibit from one garden but only one person may exhibit from that garden in any one section, except in Artistic Design and Junior Classes. One entry per exhibitor per section.
7. Please supply containers including plates or trays for vegetables (Plastic, paper or Styrofoam).
8. No artificial material is allowed. Fresh plant material is to be used in all sections except where otherwise stated.
9. Accessories allowed in all arrangements to be viewed from one side unless otherwise stated.
10. Bulbs, tubers, corms and rhizomes: the flowers of these will be classed as perennials.
11. Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of all exhibits. The Society cannot be held responsible for loss or damage.
12. The Show committee will remove deteriorated wilted, or inferior material.
