The Word Became Flesh

John 1:14-18

1. In John 1:14 it says, “The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.” What do you think John means by this? Why is it significant that God chose to come near in this way?
2. John writes, “*We have seen His glory*” (John 1:14). How have you personally experienced glimpses of God’s glory, (His goodness, compassion, faithfulness) in your own life?
3. John 1:16–17 contrasts the law given through Moses with “grace and truth” that came through Jesus. What is the difference between law and grace? Why do you think grace was necessary if the law already existed?
4. John 3:16–17 reminds us that Jesus came to *save*, not *condemn*, and John 1:16 says that we receive *grace upon grace*. What is one way you can intentionally receive or rest in God’s grace this week?

5. Romans 1:21–23 talks about people exchanging God’s glory for lesser things. What are some things in everyday life that can quietly take God’s place in your attention or affection? How do you notice when this is happening?

6. Jesus reveals who God is — His character, His compassion, His truth. What simple practice (e.g., reading a Gospel story, thanking God, worship music, prayer, or community) could help you focus more clearly on Jesus this week?
