

LIFE GROUP QUESTIONS

The Lamb of God

John 1: 29 - 51

1. Read John 1:29-34. John's message was basically: "Don't look at me — look at Jesus. He is greater" Are there "lesser things" in your own life that tend to steal your attention or affection from Jesus? What does this passage tell us about the greatness of Jesus?
2. Read John 1:29. John the Baptist says, "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." What do you think John meant by calling Jesus "the Lamb of God," and why would that title have been so significant for the people listening to him?
3. Colossians 1:22 says Jesus has made us "holy... without blemish... and free from accusation." What accusations or old shame do you find yourself still "recycling," even though Jesus has taken them away? What could you do to walk in greater freedom from sin and shame?
4. Revelation 5:12 describes heaven declaring, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain..." What is one practical way you could "behold" Jesus more intentionally this week — through prayer, Scripture, worship, or simple daily habits?

5. John invited people to “come and see” Jesus (John 1:39, 46).

Who in your world might God be prompting you to invite to church, Alpha, or simply to share your story with? What could a gentle, natural invitation look like?

6. Read John 1:43-51. Nathanael was a skeptic who became a believer. What convinced him to believe in Jesus? What convinced you to believe in Jesus? In this season of prayer and fasting, how has God been moving in your heart to believe for greater things?
