

LIFE GROUP QUESTIONS

The Bread of Life

John 6:25-60

1. Many people try to satisfy their hunger for 'more' through success, money, relationships, or pleasure. Where do you notice that hunger showing up most strongly in your own life right now?
2. Read John 6:25-35. Why were the people looking for Jesus? How does Jesus redirect their hunger to receive something more lasting? What does Jesus teach them about what they have to do to have their spiritual hunger satisfied?
3. In John 6:35, Jesus says, 'I am the bread of life.' What do you think Jesus is communicating by comparing Himself to bread that people needed every day to live?
4. Jesus promises that whoever comes to Him will never go hungry (John 6:35). What feelings or questions come up for you when you hear that promise—hope, uncertainty, curiosity,

or something else? How has Jesus satisfied your hunger for more?

5. In Exodus 16:4, God provides manna daily for the Israelites in the wilderness. What does this story teach us about how God meets people's needs on a daily basis?

6. Jesus teaches His followers to pray, 'Give us this day our daily bread' (Matthew 6:11). What can you do this week to collect and consume daily bread from Jesus?

7. Revelation 7:16 says, 'Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst.' How does this future hope shape the way we handle unmet desires or dissatisfaction in our lives today?
